Weather: Partly sunny. High of 81. Wind SW 8-14 mph with gusts to 22 mph.

Cut: 69 professionals and one amateur at 2-under 140 from a field of 131 professionals and one amateur.

Chris Gotterup (1st/-12)

- 7-under 64 marks his career-low 18-hole score on TOUR (previous low: 65/four times/most recent, R3/2024 CJ CUP Byron Nelson/T24)
- Holds the lead for the first time after any round on the PGA TOUR
- Seeks first win in 27th PGA TOUR start; has top-10 finishes at the 2022 John Deere Classic (T4) and 2022 Puerto Rico Open (T7)
- With a win, would become the seventh first-time winner to win on TOUR this season and second in as many weeks (Taylor Pendrith/THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson)
- Leads the field in birdies (15)
- Making 13th start this season (best: T11/Zurich Classic of New Orleans with partner Austin Eckroat)
- First-year TOUR member finished No. 23 on the 2023 Korn Ferry Tour Points List to earn his TOUR card

Robert MacIntyre (2nd/-11)

- 131 marks career-best opening 36-hole score on TOUR (previous: 136/twice/most recent: 2023 Genesis Scottish Open/2nd)
- First-year TOUR member earned his TOUR card via the DP World Tour Top 10 in 2023
- Last Scottish winner on TOUR: Martin Laird (2020 Shriners Children's Open)
- Two top-10 finishes in 12 starts this season (T6/Mexico Open at Vidanta, T8/Zurich Classic of New Orleans, with Thomas Detry)
- Played three TOUR events during the 2022-23 season and finished runner-up at the Genesis Scottish Open
- Two-time winner on the DP World Tour and 2019 DP World Tour Rookie of the Year
- Member of the victorious 2023 European Ryder Cup Team in his debut

Miscellaneous Notes

- PGA TOUR rookie **Jorge Campillo** (3rd/-10) enters the week with three top-25 finishes in nine starts this season; earned his PGA TOUR card via the DP Word Tour Top-10 in 2023
- Erik van Rooyen and Chez Reavie are the only players T8 or better (14 players) with PGA TOUR victories
- Making his 14th TOUR start and 11th start this season, PGA TOUR rookie **Trace Crowe** (T8/-8) follows an even-par 71 in the first round with a 63, his career-low 18-hole score on TOUR and low round of the tournament
- At 16 years, 11 months, 19 days, **Blades Brown** (T48/-3) becomes the second 16-year-old in as many weeks to make the cut on the PGA TOUR (Kris Kim/16 years, 7 months, 3 days/THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson)

- The Myrtle Beach Classic winner will receive 300 FedExCup points, a two-year exemption on the PGA TOUR and an invitation to next week's PGA Championship (if not previously eligible). The winner will also be exempt for The Sentry and THE PLAYERS Championship in 2025.
- 13 players in this week's field are already qualified for the PGA Championship; through 36 holes, five players T4 or better would qualify for the PGA Championship with a win this week (Chris Gotterup/1st, Jorge Campillo/3rd, Alex Smalley/T4, Davis Thompson/T4, Alistair Docherty/T4)
