Chris Gotterup (1st/-18)

- Following a third-round 6-under 65, holds the 54-hole lead by four strokes, tying the largest 54-hole lead on TOUR this season (Jake Knapp/Mexico Open at Vidanta, Akshay Bhatia/Valero Texas Open)
- Seeks first PGA TOUR win in his 27th start; career-best T4 finish at the 2022 John Deere Classic
- Holds the 54-hole lead/co-lead for first time; previous-best position after 54 holes: T7 (2022 Puerto Rico Open/finished T7)
- Would become the seventh first-time winner on TOUR this season and second in as many weeks (Taylor Pendrith/THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson)
- 195 marks career-best opening 54-hole score on TOUR (previous: 201/twice/most recent: 2024 CJ CUP Byron Nelson/T24)
- Leads the field in birdies (22)
- Making 13th start this season (best: T11/Zurich Classic of New Orleans with partner Austin Eckroat)
- With a win, would earn a spot in next week's PGA Championship; has made one major appearance (T43/2022 U.S. Open)
- First-year TOUR member finished No. 23 on the 2023 Korn Ferry Tour Points List to earn his TOUR card

Miscellaneous Notes

- Two-time PGA TOUR winner **Erik van Rooyen** (T2/-14) is the only player inside the top six with a PGA TOUR victory; has won on TOUR more recently than any player in the field (2023 World Wide Technology Championship)
- PGA TOUR rookie and three-time winner on the DP World Tour, Spain's **Jorge Campillo** (T2/-14) seeks first TOUR victory in his 24th career start; earned his PGA TOUR card via the DP World Tour Top 10 in 2023
- First-year TOUR member and 36-hole co-leader **Robert MacIntyre** (T2/-14) seeks to become the first Scottish winner on TOUR since Martin Laird (2020 Shriners Children's Open); has two top-10 finishes in 12 starts this season (T6/Mexico Open at Vidanta, T8/Zurich Classic of New Orleans, with Thomas Detry)
- The Myrtle Beach Classic winner will receive 300 FedExCup points, a two-year exemption on the PGA TOUR and an invitation to next week's PGA Championship (if not previously eligible). The winner will also be exempt for The Sentry and THE PLAYERS Championship in 2025.
- 13 players in this week's field are already qualified for the PGA Championship; through 36 holes, four players inside the top six would qualify for the PGA Championship with a win this week (**Chris Gotterup**/1st, **Jorge Campillo**/T2, **Davis Thompson**/5th, **Alex Smalley**/6th)
