Additional Notes

- Course plays through 4 diverse terrains (holes 1-6 inland, 7-9 dunes, 10-13 woodlands, 14-18 river terrain).
- Area has had a great winter, and mild, dry spring, which has helped course firm up.
- Vollrath grew up just a few miles north of the golf course.
- Golf course site used to be home to abandoned warehouses and then became a dump. More than 3 million sq. ft. of building was removed along with 140,000 tons of solid waste, trash and contaminated soil.
- Course will undergo a bunker renovation next year. (more on next pages)
