FORMAT:

The format will be 72 holes of stroke play, over four days (Thursday to Sunday) with no cut. In addition to the individual stroke-play competition, a team competition will occur. The highest two ranked players on the OWGR from a given country will automatically compete concurrently in the team competition (via aggregate score), with any additional players from that country who are ranked lower only eligible for the individual competition. Note: There will also be countries that have only one player - these players will also play only in the individual competition.

The event will receive Official World Golf Ranking Points, based on strength of field.

ELIGIBILITY:

Estimated field size – 60 players - The 2013 World Cup will be based on a similar system of eligibility and format to that which will be utilized when golf makes its Olympic debut in 2016. The following provides an overview of the changes as well as general information on the event:

- The event is primarily an individual stroke-play competition, although it will also retain its traditional team component in a concurrent competition playing for the World Cup.
- Players within the top-15 on the Official World Golf Rankings gain access to the event, except that there will be no more than four players for any country.
- Beyond the top-15, up to 2 players per country (for those countries not already having 2 or more players as a result of the top-15 category) gain access to the event until the field of 60 players is filled.
- The host country of the event will be assured of at least two players in the competition.
- The proposed format would differ slightly from that which will be used in the Olympic Games in a couple of ways. First, there are no current plans for the Olympics to include a team compe-

tion. Second, the countries of England, Scotland and Wales will participate as separate teams in the World Cup competition (as opposed to in the Olympics where Great Britain fields a team). As has been tradition since the inception of the World Cup, players from Ireland and Northern Ireland will continue to compete together as one team representing Ireland.

- There will no longer be any regional qualifying for the World Cup as was the case with the previous format. Eligibility will be based solely on the Official World Golf Rankings.
- Final eligibility will be determined using the Official World Golf Ranking issued Monday, September 23rd. The commitment deadline for the event will be Friday, October 4th.

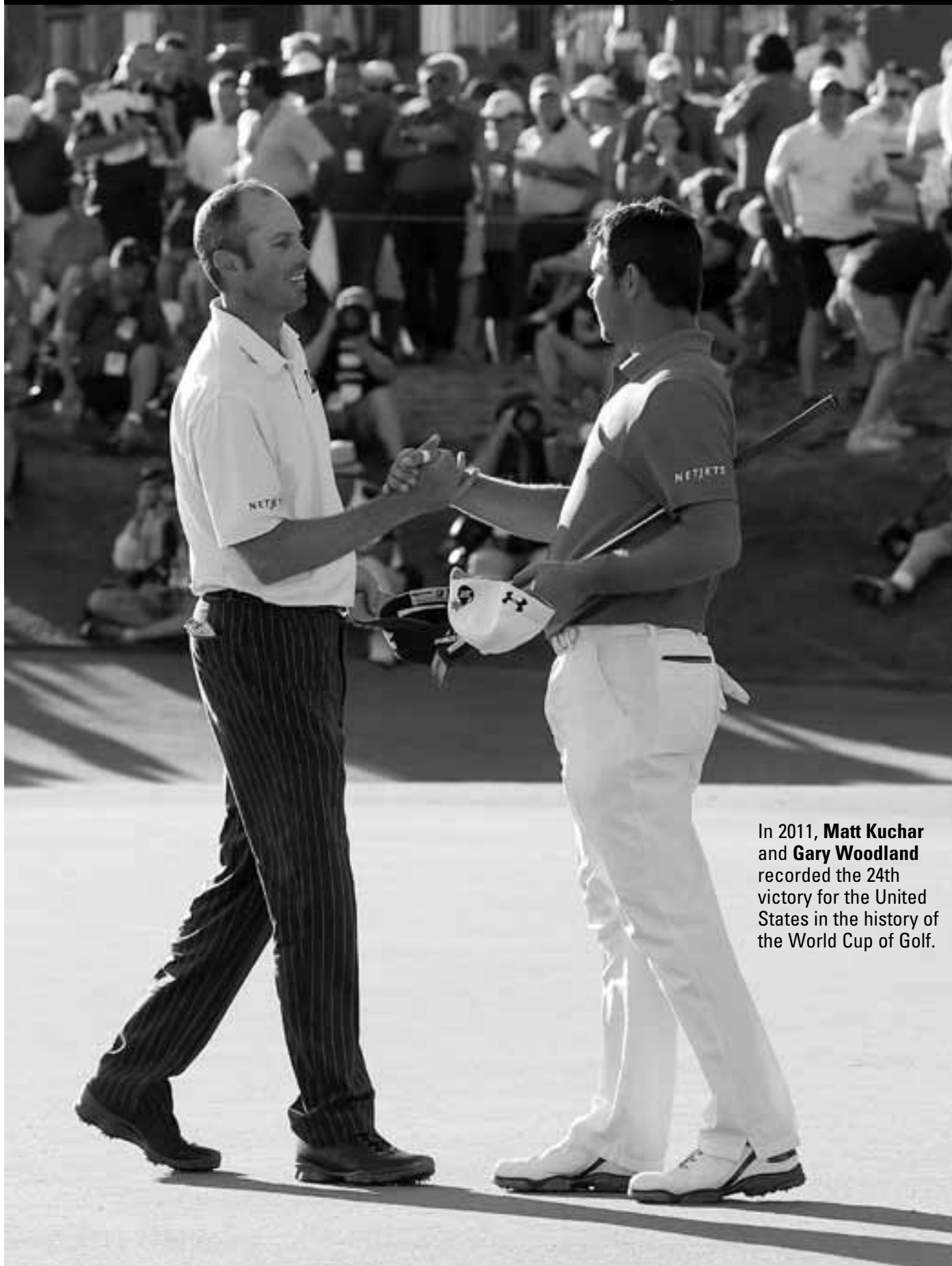

LEADERS: First-Round—Australia's Richard Green and Brendan Jones shot an opening-round 61 in Four-ball to take a two-stroke lead over Scotlands' Stephen Gallacher and Martin Laird and the Irish team of Graeme McDowell and Rory McIlroy. **Second-round**—McDowell and McIlroy caught up to Australia's Jones and Green to tie for the second round lead at 13-under in Foursomes format. McDowell and McIlroy teamed to shoot 68. **Third-Round**—McDowell and McIlroy took the outright lead after round 3 shooting 64 in Four-ball for a two-stroke lead over Germany's Alex Cejka and Martin Kaymer, Matt Kuchar and Gary Woodland of the United States and South Africans Louis Oosthuizen and Charl Schwartzel.

Italian siblings Edoardo and Francesco Molinari sate four back at the halfway point. **Third Round**—By shooting 61 and 62, respectively, the Molinaris and Karlsson and Stenson closed the gap to one stroke following 54 holes.

The Royal Melbourne Golf Club Hole-by-Hole

Hole 1 — Par 4 | 324m | 354yds

This is a real birdie chance to begin the round, with a good drive able to set up a comfortable approach pitch. But beware - the green slopes down over the back and it's easy to finish well past the pin. Bunkers on the left are dangerous, but it's an open approach.

Hole 2 — Par 5 | 490m | 536yds

A tough hole that provides a birdie chance for the long-hitters. The drive goes over a hill, with fairway bunkers looming for the short shot. A wood or long iron approach must be straight, as bunkers on either side of the green are trouble.

Hole 3 — Par 3 | 161m | 176yds

Accuracy and the right choice of club makes this a superb par three hole. A middle iron is needed to cross a valley to the green, heavily fortified with bunkers. The fast green has a steep slope from back to front and is a tricky test.

Hole 4 — Par 4 | 401m | 439yds

Rated as the most difficult green on the course, the early shots are crucial. A sharp dog leg makes it vital that the tee shot carries a minimum of 200-metres across dense rough and fairway traps, in order to leave the ball in the right position. The elevated green slopes towards the front and produces many three putts.

Hole 5 — Par 3 | 135m | 148yds

A deceptively easy-looking hole where club selection is vital. The tee shot must be well-placed, with the narrow green and difficult undulations making long putts tough. It goes uphill from the tee, with plenty of bunkers, especially for those who over-shoot the green.

Hole 6 — Par 4 | 285m | 312yds

A tempting hole for the big hitters, especially if they attack the pin by cutting the corner. But that's where the danger is, as the sand bunker is huge and a miss can be penalised. It's short, but suits the disciplined players who go the right way around. But watch the long drivers tackle that corner!

Hole 7 — Par 4 | 416m | 455yds

A deceptive hole that tempts the big hitters who challenge the fairway traps and rough on the left as they go direct. A second shot to a sloping green is a long haul and must be accurate, with bunkers guarding the entrance. A drive and a four iron can still produce many bogies.

Hole 8 — Par 4 | 435m | 476yds

A lengthy fairway which requires a couple of long shots, especially off the tee where some early bunkers await the strong hitters. This par four becomes difficult into the northerly wind. The approach shot goes over some rough and one bunker right in front can be troublesome.

Hole 9 — Par 4 | 401m | 439yds

Again two long shots are required, with the drive passing some bunkers on the left-hand side of the fairway. It's a tight driving hole and the second shot needs a wood or long iron to an elevated green. Dangerous traps on the right make for a straight approach.

Hole 10 — Par 4 | 396m | 433yds

This is a pleasant-looking hole, but full of danger. A dog-leg to the right means the drive must carry upwards and over 200-metres to present an approach shot from a downhill lie. The green is well-protected by bunkers, but a good eight iron lobbed nicely will pay dividends.

Hole 11 — Par 4 | 304m | 332yds

A deceptive hole, short with a big fairway trap, but a real birdie chance. Players need to drive left or centre, with a fairway trap guarding the right side and a steep hill running into deep rough for tee shots hooked too far left. The small fast-sloping green is stepped and guarded by deep bunkers at the entrance.

Hole 12 — Par 4 | 402m | 440yds

A long-driving hole with a difficult approach. Accuracy is required off the tee to navigate the dog leg and then a rare uphill shot to the hole often leaves players short. The green is guarded by bunkers along the right fairway and on the left of the green.

Hole 13 — Par 4 | 350m | 383yds

Here you have to decide whether to be brave and drive it down to a narrow neck of the fairway or play an iron for safety, fading it off the tee. The professionals almost always go with iron or fairway metal. Two tiered green - the back tier can be hard to hold with second shot.

Hole 14 — Par 3 | 170m | 186yds

The 14th Hole is a difficult Par 3 with the professionals playing from a new back tee. The hole is well bunkered with a ridge running through the middle of the green.

Hole 15 — Par 5 | 520m | 569yds

One for the attacking golfers, with the barrier of fairway bunkers forcing the decision to go long twice or lay up short and approach with a sand iron. It's an open driving hole, but accuracy is needed, with all the emphasis on the choice of the second shot, with those traps neatly placed to catch the wrong decision-makers

Hole 16 — Par 4 | 449m | 491yds

Normally played as a Par 5 for the Members it has been converted to a long Par 4 for the professionals. There is plenty of room for the drive as long as the right hand side rough is avoided. Second shots must guard against hitting too far left with heavy rough and a deep bunker waiting.

Hole 17 — Par 4 | 392m | 429yds

A good driving hole, this presents a wide area leading up to a big green with little danger. But it's a deceptive hole, with a hooked tee shot leading to danger in unplayable trees on the left. A trap on the right of the green, plus a grassy mound and deep rough on the left, makes it a little deceptive

Hole 18 — Par 4 | 410m | 448yds

A great way to finish, with a long hole, but offering the accurate hitters a birdie chance to sign off with. The long drivers still need a big second shot, but the green is large and inviting once you pass over the surrounding bunkers and narrow entry.
