Overview

The PGA TOUR is the world's premier membership organization for touring professional golfers, co-sanctioning tournaments on the PGA TOUR, PGA TOUR Champions, Korn Ferry Tour and PGA TOUR Americas. The modern-day PGA TOUR was formed in 1968 when a subset of touring professionals broke away from the PGA of America.

Eligibility and membership

Each PGA TOUR player has earned a position on the priority ranking that is used to select full-field open tournaments. For the 2026 season, there are 86 active international members from 26 countries and territories outside the United States.

Impact

Through the world of golf, the PGA TOUR, backed by its network of volunteers, drives positive impact at unprecedented levels to support and improve local communities. The PGA TOUR and its tournaments have donated more than \$4 billion to date to support local organizations.

PGA TOUR schedule

The 2026 PGA TOUR schedule spans a calendar year, with the race for the FedExCup contested from January through August, culminating with the FedExCup Playoffs and the crowning of the FedExCup Champion. The FedExCup Fall is contested after the Playoffs. There are 34 events during the FedExCup Regular Season and three FedExCup Playoffs events.

FedExCup and the FedExCup Playoffs

The 2026 PGA TOUR Season marks the 20th edition of the FedExCup (established in 2007). The FedExCup is a season-long points competition which culminates with the FedExCup Playoffs, a series of three events to determine the FedExCup Champion. The top 70 players in the FedExCup standings are eligible for the FedExCup Playoffs with the three events featuring a progressive cut with fields of 70 (FedEx St. Jude Championship), 50 (BMW Championship) and 30 (TOUR Championship). The FedExCup Bonus Distribution total is \$100 million, with the FedExCup Champion earning \$10 million. The top 50 players in the FedExCup standings are fully exempt for the following season, including THE PLAYERS Championship and all eight Signature Events. Nos. 51-70 in the FedExCup standings are fully exempt, including THE PLAYERS Championship. Top 100 eligibility for the remainder of players is finalized during the FedExCup Fall.

FedExCup Fall

Beginning in September, the FedExCup Fall finalizes the top 100 and additional playing opportunities for the following FedExCup season. All players ranked No. 51 and beyond carry their FedExCup points over from the Regular Season and first Playoffs events and continue to accumulate FedExCup points through the FedExCup Fall to finalize eligibility for the following season. Nos. 51-60 in the FedExCup standings through the FedExCup Fall qualify for two Signature Events the following season via the Aon Next 10.

ABOUT THE CEO: BRIAN ROLAPP

Brian Rolapp was named Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the PGA TOUR in June of 2025. Rolapp joins the PGA TOUR after spending 22 years at the National Football League (NFL), most recently serving as the NFL's Chief Media and Business Officer. He is widely regarded as one of the most influential executives in sports.

As the NFL's Chief Media and Business Officer, Rolapp was responsible for the league's commercial businesses, including broadcasting and media rights, NFL Media, sponsorship, advertising sales and consumer products. In addition, Rolapp led 32 Equity, the entity that makes investments on behalf of the League and its 32 owners. In this role, Rolapp has spearheaded some of the largest and most comprehensive arrangements with major corporations in NFL history.

Rolapp oversaw the March 2021 long-term agreements with media partners Amazon, CBS, ESPN/ABC, FOX and NBC for the distribution of NFL games over television and digital platforms. Additionally, Rolapp helped devise and implement the next phase of the premium product NFL Sunday Ticket with YouTube after almost 25 years on a satellite service. Rolapp also oversaw other media and licensing negotiations, including contracts with Apple, DraftKings, Electronic Arts, Fanatics, Netflix, Nike, Snapchat, Sony, X and more.

The NFL's owned and operated businesses, NFL Media and NFL Films, also flourished under Rolapp's leadership. Rolapp drove NFL Network and NFL RedZone distribution deals with the country's largest television providers and more recently launched NFL+, the NFL's new direct-to-consumer digital product. Rolapp helped NFL Films expand its programming relationships with Netflix, HBO/Max, Amazon and others. He also oversaw the formation of a new joint venture, Skydance Sports, announced in 2022 between Skydance Media, the NFL and NFL Films to create a premier global multi-sports production studio.

Before joining the NFL in 2003, Rolapp served as Director, Business Development for NBC Universal in New York, in which he was instrumental in NBC's cable and new media strategies, including NBC's acquisition of Vivendi Universal Entertainment's cable assets USA Network, Sci-Fi and Trio. Rolapp was a member of the media investment banking team at CIBC World Markets prior to joining NBC Universal.

Rolapp is a graduate of Brigham Young University and the Harvard Business School. He is a member of Sports Business Journal's Forty Under 40 Hall of Fame. Rolapp and his wife Cindy have been married for almost 30 years and have four children.

ABOUT THE COMMISSIONER: JAY MONAHAN

The PGA TOUR Policy Board appointed Jay Monahan as commissioner on November 7, 2016. He officially became the fourth PGA TOUR Commissioner on January 1, 2017, succeeding Tim Finchem, who held the position for more than 22 years.

In his time as commissioner, Monahan has led the TOUR through the most transformative and innovative time in the organization's history. In 2024, the TOUR launched Fan Forward, a fan-centric research and strategy initiative that is further accelerating innovation on behalf of golf fans to enhance their experience while strengthening the TOUR platform.

During his tenure, player compensation has reached record-setting levels, and the PGA TOUR fan base has grown in both size and diversity.

Monahan ushered the PGA TOUR through the COVID-19 pandemic, as the TOUR was among the first professional sports leagues to safely return to competition in June 2020. That same year, Monahan and the TOUR reached a landmark, nine-year media rights agreement with both broadcast and streaming partners through 2030 and formalized a strategic alliance with the European (DP World) Tour Group.

In 2022, Monahan further strengthened the alliance with the DP World Tour with a 13-year agreement through 2035 to co-sanction events, drive prize funds and commercial revenue, develop playing opportunities for members of both Tours, increase the PGA TOURs existing stake in European Tour Productions and create formal pathways for top players around the world.

Under Monahan's leadership, the TOUR incorporated and launched PGA TOUR Enterprises in 2024, a subsidiary of PGA TOUR, Inc., to allow for growth capital not previously available because of the parent company's 501(c)(6) structure. On January 30, 2024, the TOUR welcomed an initial investor in Strategic Sports Group (SSG), a consortium that includes individuals with more than 200 years of combined sports team stewardship across major global sports leagues, including the NFL, NBA, MLB, NHL and EPL. Fenway Sports Group has led the SSG investment of up to \$3 billion including an initial \$1.5 billion up front with support from the leadership of Cohen Private Ventures, including Steven A. Cohen and Andrew B. Cohen, and Arthur M. Blank, owner and chairman of AMB Sports and Entertainment. In conjunction with the incorporation of PGA TOUR Enterprises, the TOUR implemented a Player Equity Program – the first of its kind in professional sports – awarding PGA TOUR members an ownership stake in PGA TOUR Enterprises.

Monahan's tenure has included several significant schedule and competitive changes to grow and strengthen the TOUR for its fans, players and partners. In 2019, these included a reduction of Playoffs events from four to three and the TOUR's flagship event, THE PLAYERS Championship, returning to a March date. In 2024, changes included the return to a calendar-year schedule and the introduction of Full-Field and limited-field Signature Events. For 2026, there are a number of additional competitive changes related to eligibility and field sizes to ensure equitable playing opportunities for members who have earned a PGA TOUR card and to enhance the fan experience.

In January 2025, the TOUR opened PGA TOUR Studios, a state-of-the-art production studio first conceptualized in 2017. Located on the PGA TOUR Campus in Ponte Vedra Beach, Fla., PGA TOUR Studios redefines how the TOUR creates and delivers content to golf fans across the globe. The 165,000-square-foot facility is a pivotal next step of golf content production in an everchanging media landscape and one that will fuel exponential growth in the TOUR.

Monahan joined the PGA TOUR in 2008 as Executive Director of THE PLAYERS Championship. He then served as Senior Vice President for Business Development, where he was responsible for securing new sponsors and managing existing PGA TOUR title sponsorship relationships. Monahan was named PGA TOUR Executive Vice President and Chief Marketing Officer in March 2013, overseeing business development, corporate marketing and partnerships, title sponsor relations, retail licensing and media sales.

Monahan was appointed PGA TOUR Deputy Commissioner in April 2014, with Chief Operating Officer added to his title in April 2016.

As PGA TOUR Commissioner, Monahan serves on the Board of the PGA European (DP World) Tour, as well as on the Board of Directors and Executive Committee of the International Golf Federation. He is also Chair of both the World Golf Foundation and PGA TOUR First Tee Foundation Board of Governors. Monahan is the co-founder and board member of Golf Fights Cancer, a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization dedicated to raising funds for cancer-related charities and research organizations.

Before joining the PGA TOUR, Monahan was executive vice president of Fenway Sports Group, leading the sales and business development team for the property ownership and representation divisions since 2005. Additionally, he directed FSG's sponsorship sales operations for the Boston

Red Sox, Major League Baseball Advanced Media, NASCAR's Roush Fenway Racing and Boston College Athletics. Prior to joining FSG, Monahan spent three years as executive director at IMG Worldwide, where he played an integral role in the development of the PGA TOUR's Boston-area tournament and served as its first tournament director. Monahan began his sports sponsorship career as director of global sponsorships and branding programs at EMC Corporation. Previously, he worked at Arnold Advertising and Bob Woolf Associates.

Monahan graduated from Trinity College in 1993, where he was a four-year member of the golf team and a Division II Academic All-American his senior year. He earned a master's degree in sport management from the University of Massachusetts at Amherst in 1995.

2026 FEDEXCUP BONUS MONEY

In 2025, the PGA TOUR announced enhancements to the TOUR Championship format, including the elimination of Starting Strokes. To account for the increased volatility of the final event, reward season-long performance and recognize the significance of the FedExCup, a pool of nearly \$100 million in FedExCup Bonus Money will be paid out to the top 125 players in the FedExCup standings following the BMW Championship – the last event of the season that awards FedExCup points. The \$40 million purse at the TOUR Championship is considered Official Money and is separate from FedExCup Bonus Money, with the FedExCup Champion receiving \$10 million.
