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### **3M extends title sponsorship of PGA TOUR's 3M Open through 2030**

*Seventh edition of FedExCup event returns to TPC Twin Cities July 21-27, 2025*

For the third consecutive season, the 3M Open will be the penultimate event in the PGA TOUR's FedExCup Regular Season as players seek to secure their place inside the top 70 and a spot in the FedExCup Playoffs. The stakes are high as the top 70 players will also be exempt for all Full-Field Events and THE PLAYERS in 2026.

The 3M Open is a mechanism to give back to 3M's community and demonstrate the many unexpected ways 3M improves lives while showcasing the world's greatest golfers. The 3M Open Fund is a non-profit 501(c)3 foundation created when the tournament was founded by 3M and the PGA TOUR in 2019.
