



2009 Puerto Rico Open presented by Banco Popular (The 12th of 37 events in the PGA TOUR Regular Season)

Third-Round Notes – Saturday, March 14, 2009

Weather: Partly cloudy with an afternoon high in the low 80s. Winds NE 10-20 mph, gusting to 20-30 mph.

Jason Day, a 21-year-old Australian, and American Michael Bradley, 42, are tied at 12-under 204 after the third-round of the Puerto Rico Open presented by Banco Popular. Day and Bradley have a four stroke lead over eight players.

Michael Bradley and Jason Day were paired together in the fifth-round at the PGA TOUR Qualifying Tournament in December. Both golfers finished T53 at the end of the six-round event.

Making the 39th start of his PGA TOUR career, Jason Day has never held a lead following the second or third round. Day's best career finish is sixth at the 2008 AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am.

Jason Day is the youngest player to ever win a Nationwide Tour event, which he accomplished at the age of 19 years, 7 months and 26 days when he won the 2007 Legend Financial Group Classic. If Day goes on to win his first PGA TOUR event this week he would not rank in the top 10 of the youngest players to win a TOUR event, but he would rank amongst some of golf's top current players like Tiger Woods, Sergio Garcia and Anthony Kim.

Michael Bradley has led after the third-round one other time in his career, which he turned into a win at the 1998 Doral-Ryder Open.

The last time Michael Bradley shot three consecutive rounds in the 60s was at the 1997 CVS Charity Classic, where he closed with a final-round 75 to finish T31. The last time Bradley shot four consecutive rounds in the 60s was at the 1996 St. Jude Classic where he finished T7.

Michael Bradley's last top-10 finish came at the 2000 Michelob Championship at Kingsmill, a span of 64 tournaments. Prior to 2000, Bradley had 18 top 10 finishes in seven seasons including wins at the 1996 Buick Challenge and the 1998 Doral-Ryder Open. Of Bradley's 47 top 25 finishes, 41 came before the 2000 season.
