2009 Mercedes-Benz Championship

HIGHLIGHTS

Earns his 5th career PGA TOUR victory at the age of 31 years, 7 months in his 192nd career start on TOUR.

Earns 500 FedExCup points to move to No. 1 on the points list.

Wire-to-Wire victory comes just over a month from his win at the 2008 Australian PGA Championship.

MERCEDES-BENZ CHAMPIONSHIP NOTES

Records his first victory at the Mercedes-Benz Championship in his third career start (2007-T13, 2008-T19, 2009-1).

Becomes the eighth consecutive foreign-born player to win the tournament, joining Daniel Chopra (2008), Vijay Singh (2007), Stuart Appleby (2004-06), Ernie Els (2003) and Sergio Garcia (2002).

Victory is the fourth by an Australian in the last six years of the event (Stuart Appleby, 2004-06).

Becomes the first wire-to-wire winner of the Mercedes-Benz Championship since it moved to Kapalua in 1999.

Records the third-largest margin of victory at the Mercedes-Benz Championship since 1999, behind David Duval's nine-stroke win in 1999 and Ernie Els' eight-stroke victory in 2003.

Becomes just the fifth player to record all four rounds in the 60s since the Mercedes-Benz Championship moved to the Plantation Course in 1999. The list includes David Duval (1999), Jim Furyk (2001), Ernie Els (2003), Tiger Woods (2005) and Ogilvy (2009). Incidentally, in two prior trips to the Mercedes-Benz Championship, Ogilvy had never posted a sub-70 round.

2009 NOTES

Collects 500 points to take a 255-point lead over Anthony Kim and Davis Love III in the FedExCup standings.

With paycheck of \$1,120,000, surpasses \$1 million in earnings for the seventh consecutive season.

CAREER NOTES

Collects his 40th career top-10 finish.

Is now three for four when holding the 54-hole lead on the PGA TOUR. The others led to a victory at the 2005 Chrysler Classic of Tucson, a T6 finish at the 2005 Honda Classic and a win at the 2008 World Golf Championships-CA Championship.

Moves from No. 37 to No. 31 on the career money list with \$17,426,625.
