

Champion KJ CHOI: Right at Home in Hawaii

"Hawaii is such a special place because it's so much like my homeland in South Korea, reflected six-time PGA TOUR champion K. J. Choi as the balmy trade winds blew through the palms lining fairways and greens at Waialae. "In Wando there is water all around, just like Hawaii. There are a lot of similarities. The whole atmosphere here makes me feel really comfortable and at peace here. With all the fan support, it feels like I'm right at home. The people of Hawaii are so nice to me."

There is a lot to be said for "feeling right at home" when it comes to PGA TOUR competition—especially the first full-field opener of the season. A regular at the Sony Open, the stocky solid presence of Choi has added luster to the event leader board on numerous occasions, but never more than in 2008. Choi commanded the leading position in the very first round, scoring an impressive 64, and he never let it go! A second round score of 65 put the field that made the cut on notice. As winds intensified over the weekend, his third round 67 was formidable. South Korea's legendary golf pro was poised to take it all--then came Sunday. The winds blew with a force that rocked even the stalwart Choi. The gusty trade winds blew Choi's ball off the fairway some 14 times. It was detour after detour for the Tour veteran as he scrambled and scrambled again just trying to shoot par, pushing for the finish. Hot on his heels, the dogged Rory Sabbatini sensed the opportunity to catch the leader. It took more than the comfort zone of "feeling right at home" for Choi to mount a champion's campaign against the wind and his competitors.

Choi mustered his well-trained physical, mental and spiritual fortitude to prevail in the round of golf he called, "the most difficult" of his career. His sweet birdie on hole 18 brought the finish he had fought so very hard to achieve. His dream of becoming Sony Open Champion became a reality. Perched behind the 18th green, his parents beamed with delight, rewarded beyond their expectations for their long trip from Wando Island to support their amazing son. Choi's final round one-over par-71 combined with his impressive earlier round scores for a total of 14-under par 266. Sabbatini finished three strokes behind him at 11-under par 269, while former Sony Open champion, Jerry Kelly, was third with one stroke higher at 10-under par 270.

"You have to accept the conditions as they are... I can't remember such a difficult round," Choi said. "I told myself, 'Try not to lose focus.' I really think the Lord helped me, making me feel comfortable." His win on the windy oceanfront Waialae course was his seventh PGA TOUR triumph. It was Choi's fourth consecutive season win, 2005-2008; a feat matched only by PGA TOUR marquee players Tiger Woods, Phil Mickelson and Vijay Singh. His wire-to-wire Sony Open win (64-65-67-71) was the first on the PGA TOUR since Steve Flesch accomplished it at the 2007 Reno Tahoe Open. K. J. Choi also became the third outright wire-to-wire winner in Sony Open history, joining Paul Azinger (2000) and Howard Twitty (1993).

So how did K. J. Choi celebrate his win? He joined Hawaii's Korean community to commemorate the 105th anniversary of the arrival of the first Koreans to Hawaii. Two historic occasions on the very same day—a day K. J. Choi and his many fans won't soon forget!



Waialae Country Club

HOLE #1 (PICTURED RIGHT) Par-4 • 488 Yards Ma-mao - Distant

This hole was originally designed in 1927 by Seth Raynor with the famous Road Hole of St. Andrews, Scotland in mind. The forward tee constructed nine years ago makes this former par-5 hole play as a par-4 and 1/2! Depending on the wind, the second shot to a very shallow green guarded in front by a huge, deep bunker can be played with anything from a 3-wood to a 9-iron. Welcome to Waialae!

HOLE #2

Par-4 • 426 Yards 'O'ole'a - Unyielding

An elevated tee sixty yards back and across the stream really adds teeth to this hole. It brings the lake, which runs down the left side into play for the longer hitters. A very demanding tee shot must be placed between the lake and two fairway bunkers guarding the right side. A good drive will leave a middle iron to a fairly generous green.

HOLE #3 (PICTURED RIGHT)
Par-4 • 423 Yards

'l'i Brown - Mr. Golf

shot to the green.

Named after Mr. Golf in Hawaii,
Waialae founding member, Francis
'I'i Brown, once drove this green.
The tee box moved a few yards

on your drive. A long
accurate drive off the tee is

HOLE #4 (PICTURED ABOVE)

A very difficult par-3 played into the wind. The elongated 55-yard green has a deep swale running across the middle. Par is welcome here.

HOLE #5 (PICTURED)

Par-4 • 466 Yards

'Auwai - Two Ditches


The rebuilt championship tee 30 yards back in its original location unused since the late 1970s calls for a tee shot with a 225-yard carry over the first ditch. This is certainly no problem with the wind at your back, but watch out if the wind switches. A drive that makes it over the ditch leaves a short iron second shot. Putting is very tricky on the heavily contoured green. Birdies are rare on this hole.

HOLE #6


Par-4 • 459 Yards

Laiau - Go Astray

A prevailing left-to-right wind blows straight towards O.B. on the right. Drives have been known to go astray here. Trees protect the right corner of the dog-leg so a well-placed drive must be kept left off the tee box avoiding the fairway bunker. The green is bunkered on both sides so a very accurate short iron is needed for the second shot.



The second of the par-3s on the tournament's front nine, this green is as wide as the par-3 hole #4 is long. Originally, this green was completely surrounded by sand, giving the hole its name. Bunkers still wrap around the entire front side of this green. A deep ridge on the front green runs laterally front to back.



The tee shot is the hairy shot on this hole. Played through a chute of trees, the drive must carry a stream that is 230 yards out, avoiding two fairway bunkers on the right. Once that is accomplished, a short iron is left to the hole. A definite birdie opportunity.



Normally played as hole #18 by Waialae members, this par-5 requires accuracy on both the drive and the second shots.

O.B. runs down the entire hole on both sides. A strong left-to-right wind makes this hole even tougher. It is reachable in 2 strokes, however, and has given up its share of birdies.


HOLE #10

Par-4 • 353 Yards

Kipaku - Drive Away

This is the shortest par-4 on the course. Best place for the drive is on the right side of the fairway. Several deep bunkers and three towering palm trees standing sentry on the left protect the green. Good birdie hole.



HOLE #13 (PICTURED ABOVE)
Par-4 • 478 Yards 'A-kau - Right

Formerly played as a par-5 at the Hawaiian Open, the re-designed forward tee allows playing this hole as a long 478-yard par-4 hole. The reshaped fairway bunker on the right allows more room in the landing area for the drive. Par is a very good score on this hole.

HOLE #11 (PICTURED ABOVE)
Par-3 • 196 Yards
Kailani - Sea and Sky


The real challenge on the tee shot is to avoid the potential scenic distraction of the vast sweeping view of the Pacific Ocean behind the green. The prevailing wind blows left to right so the large bunker on the right gets lots of action. This is an excellent one-shot hole.

HOLE #12

Par-4 • 446 Yards

I'mua - Straight Ahead

A long hole requiring both length and accuracy off the tee, the drive must be placed between the fairway bunker on the left and the series of mounds and trees on the right. A middle to short iron sets up an easy birdie putt on a relatively flat putting surface.



HOLE #14 (PICTURED)
Par-4 • 433 Yards Hema - Left

A dog-leg left par-4 this hole plays back towards the mountains. A well-placed drive to the right side of the fairway leaves a short iron shot to the green that is sloped steeply from back to front. Best to stay below the pin for the ideal birdie putt.

HOLE #15 (PICTURED)

Par-4 • 396 Yards

Pilikia - Trouble

This hole can certainly be troublesome. O.B. runs up the entire left side, and both the drive and second shots are played into the wind. Tee shots out to the right are blocked on the second shot by a huge, old kiawe tree which dominates the right side of the fairway about 100 yards from the hole.


HOLE #16

Par-4 • 417 Yards

Welo - Float in the Wind

Tee it high and let it fly! A finish with the wind at your back. The best place for the drive is on the right side of the fairway just inside the fairway bunkers. The second shot is a short iron played to a green framed by the Pacific Ocean and several large palm trees. This hole is considered the most scenic at Waialae.







HOLE #17 (PICTURED LEFT)
Par-3 • 189 Yards 'Alae - Mud Hen

The signature hole at Waialae bears the name of the Sony Open fire-bird according to Hawaiian lore. Hole #17 is a very difficult par-3 requiring a long or middle iron. The green features the original Seth Raynor design which is a classic Redan-style green with a large bunker on the left and a series of four deep, hidden bunkers guarding the right. Par-3 is a

good score here, especially in the final round.



A great finishing hole! Isao Aoki proved this in 1983 with a spectacular eagle for his victory. Aoki knocked it in from 128 yards out, but this hole is reachable in 2 strokes. A bunker set in the dog-leg makes the drive off the tee a "thinking shot." A second shot can be played straight downwind to the green.

<u>Dean Wilson:</u> Born and raised in Kaneohe, this Hawaii boy qualified for the TOUR in 2003, and achieved his first PGA TOUR victory at The International in August 2006. In 2007 he came home and took top honors at the Hawaii State Open. Dean did quite well in 2008, finishing in the top 3 at the AT&T National and the U.S. Bank Championship in Milwaukee. He has also won six titles on the Japan PGA TOUR (2000-2002), including the Japan PGA Championship and the Japan PGA Match Play Championship. This is his third Pro-Junior Skills Challenge.

<u>Parker McLachlin:</u> Wow! What a breakthrough year for this Hawaii-born PGA TOUR professional. Parker won his first PGA TOUR victory at the 2008 Legends Reno-Tahoe Open, and also finished top 10 in two events--the 2008 Sony Open in Hawaii and the AT&T Classic. Coming from a family of versatile athletes, this Punahou High School alum was a three-time state golf champion and state volleyball champion. He now serves as Charity Ambassador of The Friends Club and participates in his first Pro-Junior Skills event.

<u>Paul Azinger:</u> Turning pro at the age of 21, Paul is a 12-time PGA TOUR champion and the genius captain of the recently successful US Ryder Cup Team. A cancer survivor and TV golf commentator, he has been a steady player on the PGA TOUR. He was the 2001 Sony Open Champion, his first win after successfully battling cancer. This is Paul's first appearance at the King Auto Group Pro-Junior Skills Challenge.

<u>Jerry Kelly:</u> This 2002 Sony Open in Hawaii champ had a great 2008 season earning five top-ten finishes, three of them, top three, including the 2008 Sony Open in Hawaii. A veteran on Tour and at the Pro-Junior Skills Challenge, this is Jerry's sixth year playing with Hawaii junior golfers. His partners have included Michelle Wie (2003), Kellen Watabu (2004), Sean Maekawa (2005), Chan Kim (2007) and Maui County's Baldwin High School sophomore Cassy Isagawa (2008) who proved to be his power partner. They took top honors at the 2008 Challenge!

<u>Davis Love III</u>: The 2008 Children's Miracle Classic in Orlando, Florida became Davis's 20th PGA TOUR victory. His exceptional career accomplishments have earned him a lifetime exemption on the PGA TOUR, an honor shared by only 33 other professionals in TOUR history to date. One of the most highly regarded players on TOUR, Davis currently stands 73rd in All-Around Ranking. <u>Kelli Oride</u>: A sophomore at Kauai High School, Kelly is the 2008 KIF High School Champion, and AJGA Core Realty Holdings Champion, in addition to maintaining a 4.0 grade point average. Her favorite part of playing golf is traveling to compete at prestigious golf courses, while having a good time with her friends regardless of how her round of golf is going. Her best score in her career (so far) is a 66 at Wailua (par 73). Kelli is the daughter of parents Michael and Gail Oride.

<u>Justin Keiley:</u> An honor roll student at Maui County's Baldwin High School, Justin was 2008 MIL Champion and also tied for second place at the 2008 State Championship. He also qualified for the Junior Amateur Match Play. Even during a frustrating round, this junior standout keeps a good attitude. His philosophy is to, "Remember the good shots and not the bad ones. Par is a good score, and there is such thing as a good bogey." Justin is the son of Warren and Lyn Keiley.

Alika Bell: A junior at Kamehameha High School, Alika is an all-around athlete, playing varsity golf, football, basketball and track. His favorite aspect of golf is being able to meet new friends while traveling the world and playing a variety of golf courses.
