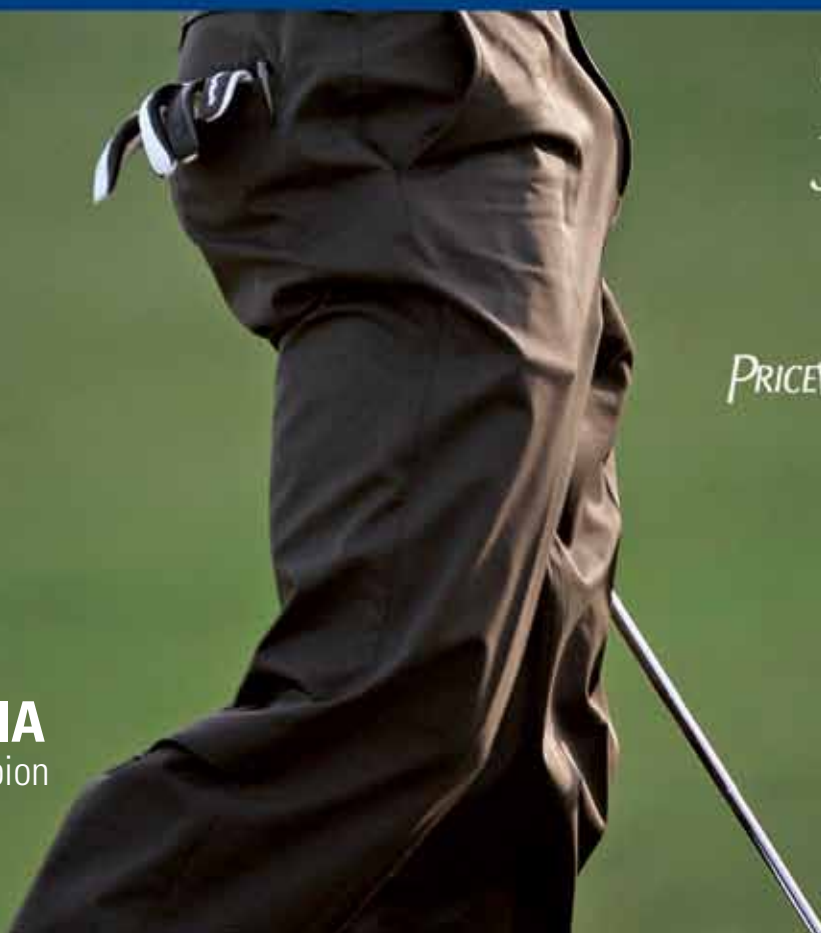

First-Timers Ready for PLAYERS

Entering the final round of the 2008 Nationwide Tour Championship at TPC Craig Ranch, Matt Bettencourt was very aware what was at stake. If he finished first on the Nationwide Tour money list and Brendon de Jonge, then ranked first, finished worse than eighth, Bettencourt would win the money title and qualify for THE PLAYERS Championship.

Seven months later, Bettencourt is playing at TPC Sawgrass, and to use his words "it is massive."

"I wanted to grind and win at Craig Ranch because THE PLAYERS is everything. This is huge, the strongest

field in the world," says Bettencourt, a Greenville, SC, resident who had never played a PGA TOUR event prior to this year. "When I won last year, it hit me, and I knew right away that I was going to THE PLAYERS."

Bettencourt is one of 18 first-timers competing this week. The others are St. Augustine resident Jeff Klauk, Brad Adamonis, Ross Fisher, Thongchai Jaidee, Martin Kaymer, Soren Kjeldsen, Martin Laird, Michael Letzig, Rory McIlroy, Parker McLachlin, Alvaro Quiros, Chez Reavie, Jeev Milkha Singh, Kevin Streelman, Marc Turnesa, Oliver Wilson and Y.E. Yang.

As one from that group, Bettencourt isn't making any promises, but he does like the way he's playing heading into the tournament. "I'm very streaky, and I like to ride it," Bettencourt said. "It started coming together a little bit last week (a tie for 22nd at the Quail Hollow Championship). If I can put some good rounds together and get my confidence going early, I'm looking forward to this week."

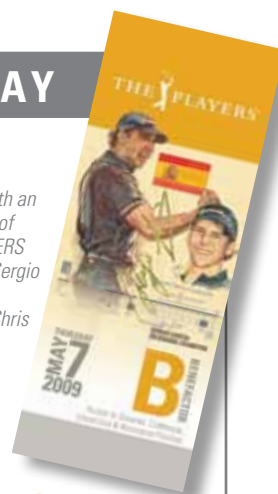
Top 10s in First Starts at THE PLAYERS

For \$20, fans on site can upgrade their daily tickets to The Island Club, located adjacent to No. 10 tee. Upgrades are available at the front entrance where a variety of food and beverages are available in a sports bar atmosphere.

Family Plan/ Youth Policy

This year, THE PLAYERS introduces new ticket opportunities for families and children. The new Youth Policy allows all children age 16 and under to be admitted free all week with a ticketed adult. The Family Plan includes two Adult Grounds Admission tickets, two Youth Ground Admission tickets and one on-site parking pass for \$149.

Hydration/First Aid



After one of the warmest events in PLAYERS history last year, officials have

announced two initiatives aimed to give fans easy and affordable access to water. The price of bottled water, available at all concession stands, will be \$2.50. In addition, there will be numerous drinking fountains (also known as Hydration Stations)

available for the public to use free of charge throughout the course.

Approximately 60 volunteers donate more than 150 hours of first aid and medical services every year at THE PLAYERS. Volunteers typically treat around 75-100 patients during the tournament week, with about 12 percent of those patients being transported to the Baptist Medical Center Beaches Emergency Center for further treatment.

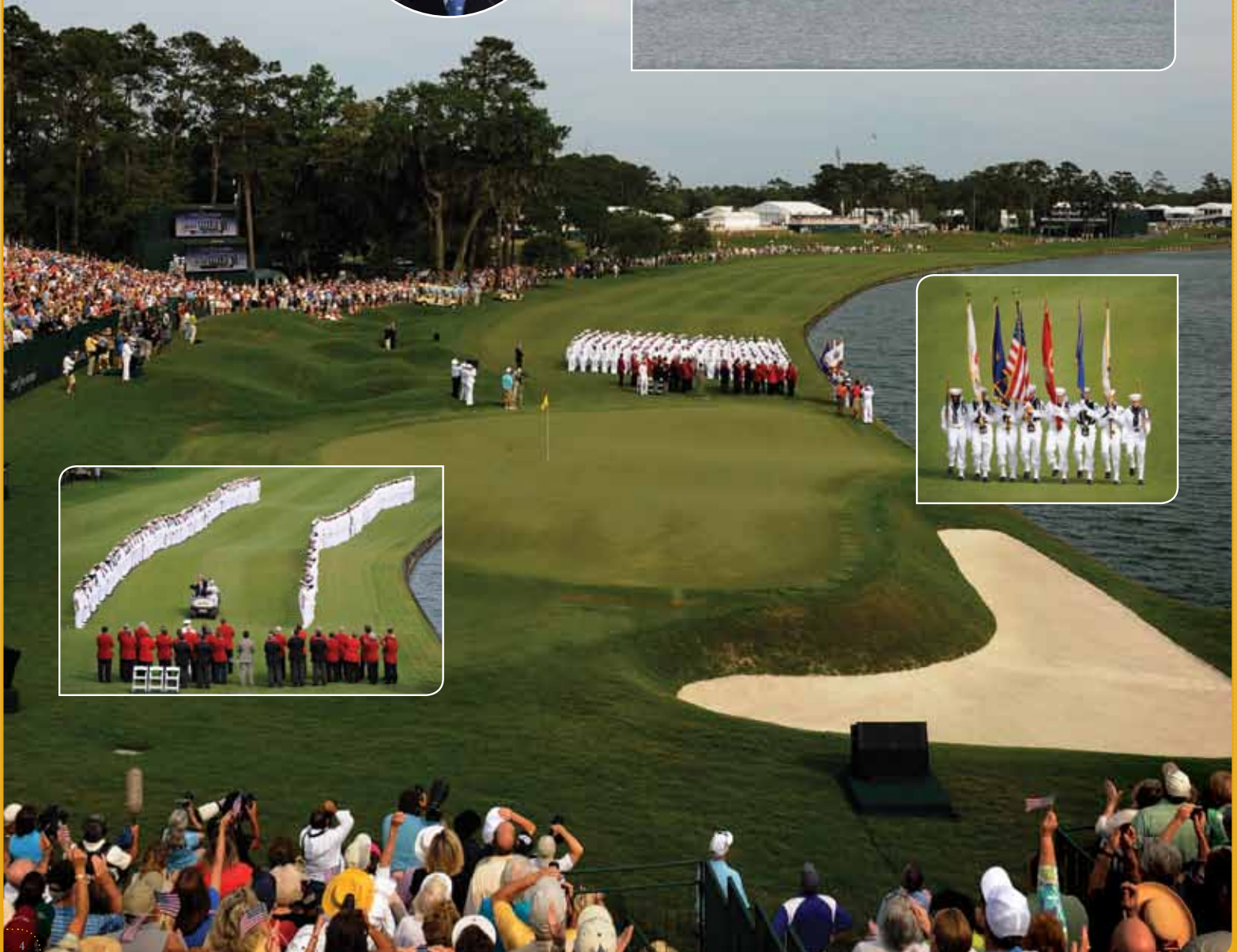

Former President George H.W. Bush Honored

George H.W. Bush, the 41st president of the United States, was honored Wednesday with a "Military Tribute" at the 18th hole and was the ninth recipient of the PGA TOUR's Lifetime Achievement Award. The tribute, which included participation by the Navy and a flyover, was part of THE PLAYERS

Military Appreciation Day, which offered free admission to all active-duty and retired members of U.S. Armed Forces. The Lifetime Achievement Award, created in 1996, honors individuals who have made an outstanding contribution to the TOUR over an extended period of time through their actions on and off the course. Bush, 84, joins

a distinguished list of past Lifetime Achievement Award recipients, although he is the first recipient from outside the golf industry. Gene Sarazen, Byron Nelson, Arnold Palmer, Sam Snead, Jack Burke Jr., Pete Dye, Deane Beman and Jack Nicklaus are the past winners.

WELCOME BACK: D.A. Weibring Remembers His First PLAYERS



D.A. Weibring has two distinctions this week. At 55 (he turns 56 on May 25), he is the oldest player in the field. And along with Fred Couples, Weibring is one of two players here who also played in the first PLAYERS Championship held at TPC Sawgrass in 1982.

With Weibring making his first PLAYERS appearance since 1997, he was reminiscing Wednesday with Peter Jacobsen about the good old days on TOUR and how much the course has changed since the first time they laid eyes on the property.

"They've softened the greens a little bit, but there's still plenty of Pete Dye out there," said Weibring, who qualified by winning the Champions

Tour's Constellation Energy Senior Players Championship last year.

Weibring knows a thing or two about TPC projects as he designed TPC Deere Run (home of the John Deere

Classic) and was part of the renovation at TPC Four Seasons (site of the HP Byron Nelson Championship).

"I think Pete is one of the true geniuses in the business," Weibring said. "He did an unbelievable job with a bad piece of property. He lifted it and changed it. But I think the finish of this golf course is what will always be remembered. It's all about 16, 17 and 18. In the old days, you used to tee off on No. 1 and you would be thinking about 17."

Nothing has changed, D.A.

Weibring, a five-time PGA TOUR winner who has won an additional five Champions Tour titles, had a close call at the 1985 PLAYERS, finishing second to Calvin Peete. It was his only top-10 finish in 18 previous PLAYERS starts.

"I haven't played that well to start this year, but I would not tee it up if I didn't think I was competitive," Weibring said. "I want to represent the Champions Tour and enjoy the experience."

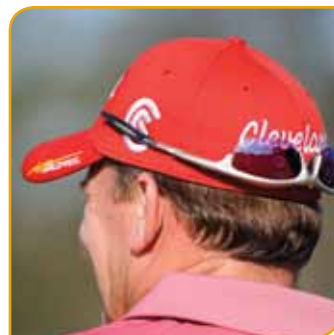
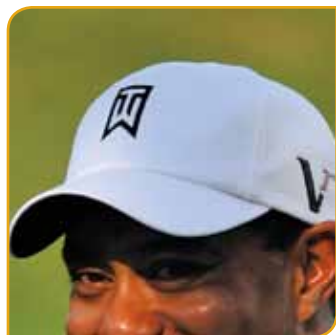

"Dirtbag" Hat Hits The Wall in Goydos' Hometown

When Paul Goydos returned to TPC Sawgrass this week, he was sporting a TaylorMade hat and not the Long Beach State "Dirtbags" baseball cap he made famous in a runner-up finish to Sergio Garcia last year. The Long Beach State hat is on display in the Legends Restaurant and Sports Bar in Long Beach, CA, Goydos' hometown.

Soon after the playoff loss, Goydos' alma mater, Long Beach State, held its "Jewels of the Night" fundraiser and Goydos' brown-and-gold cap with the "LB" logo and a couple other items went for \$4,000 to high bidder Gene Rotondo, the owner of the Long Beach institution. The money went directly to Long Beach State's scholarship

funding, and the hat now adorns the wall along with memorabilia such as a Muhammad Ali-signed boxing bell from Madison Square Garden, Shaquille O'Neal's basketball shoes, a Michael Jordan NBA All-Star jersey, a Pele soccer ball and auto-graphed pictures of World Golf Hall of Famers Ben Hogan and Byron Nelson.

World Golf Hall of Fame member Bob Hope shared his love of golf with millions in many different ways.

The Hall of Fame is now paying tribute to his life in a special exhibition, "Bob Hope: Shanks for the Memory." Featuring the largest collection of Hope memorabilia on display in one exhibition, "Shanks" is on display through 2009.

Hall of Fame member Arnold Palmer narrates an "Opening Monologue" video presentation in the Bob Hope Theater, which features some of Hope's best-known golf stand-ups and skits. That video is followed by more than two hours of video on 12 screens throughout the full exhibition.

Stadium Village

THE PLAYERS Stadium Village is a place where fans can once again attempt to hit the 17th green on the UBS 17th Challenge, try some of THE PLAYERS' famous final putts on a replica of the 18th green or have their photos taken with a photo of 2008 champion Sergio Garcia as he eyes a putt – all at no charge. This year, all fans enter the area through "THE PLAYERS Shop" that includes

a strong retail presence. An array of dining will also be available inside the area – which will include shaded seating for the first time – including new features such as Morton's steak sandwiches. A bag check and shipping center is also available. Also new this year is a business center where fans can stay connected by checking their e-mail.



BEHIND THE SCENES: Mobile Fitness and Therapy Trailers

Earlier this year, the PGA TOUR and DePuy Mitek entered a three-year marketing deal for health and fitness. The most visible part of this relationship is the mobile fitness and therapy trailers on both the PGA TOUR and Champions Tour, available for player use throughout the year.

This week, the two mobile fitness and therapy trailers are located adjacent to the media center, giving players easy access from the clubhouse. The trailers are staffed by professional physical therapists, chiropractors and



athletic trainers who assist players in rehabilitative and preventive care, as well as personal conditioning programs. The trailers have been renovated with state-of-the-art fitness and therapy equipment and feature new interior designs.

DePuy Mitek is also committed to educating consumers about the importance of maintaining joint health and the prevention and treatment of knee pain due to sports-related injuries or the early symptoms of osteoarthritis.

Going Downtown

As part of this week's PLAYERS Championship, THE PLAYERS Downtown Experience returns to Downtown Jacksonville through Sunday. This year's six-day festivities center around The Jacksonville Landing on the St. Johns River in Downtown Jacksonville. 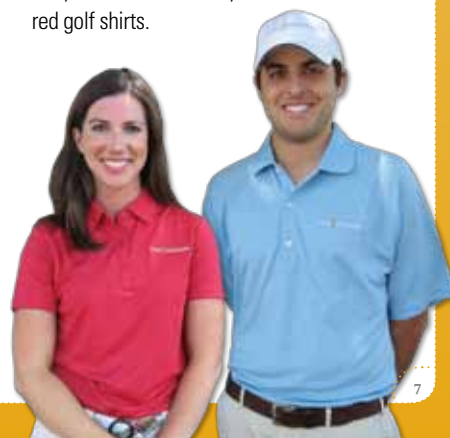

Ambassadors, answering questions and directing spectators around the course. They can be identified by their cardinal red golf shirts.



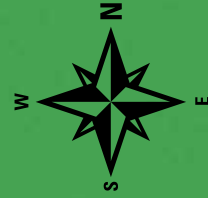

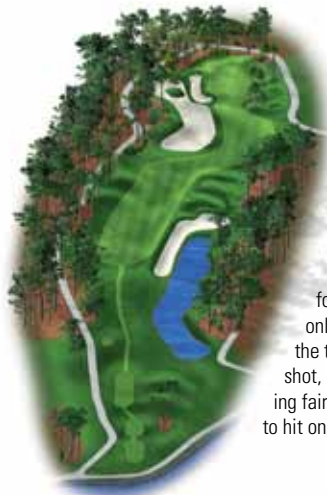

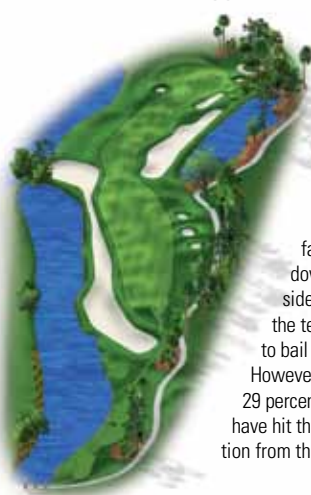

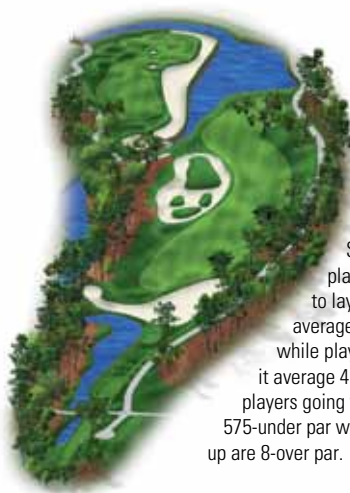

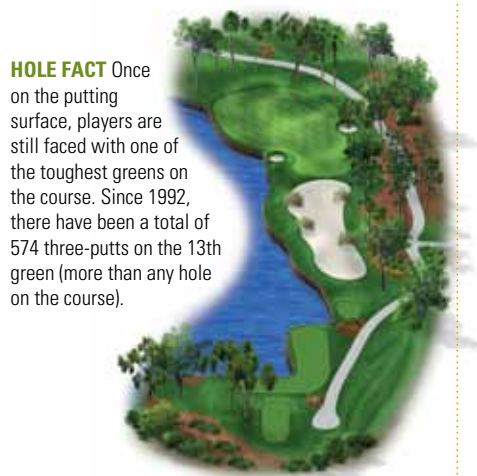

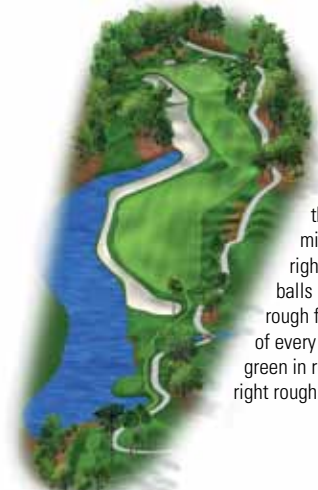

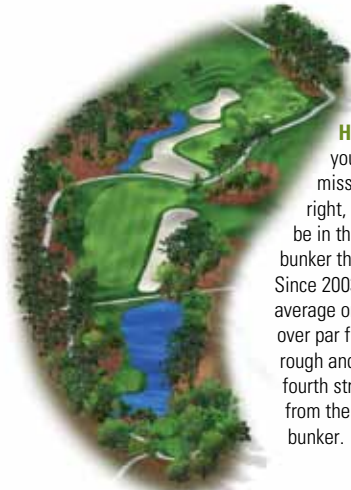

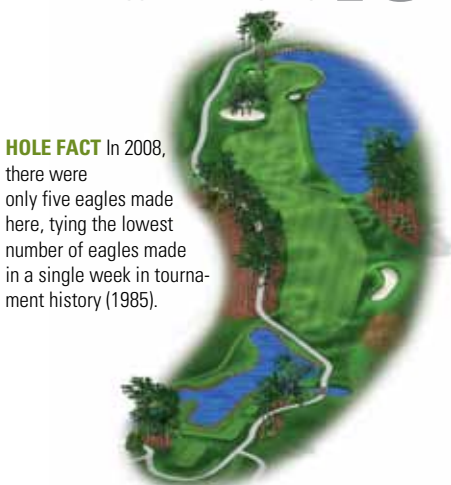

Alexandra "Allie" Tucker is a 19-year-old, University of North Florida freshman who is pursuing a career in nursing. But this promising future was almost over before it started.

Immersed in drug and alcohol abuse by her sophomore year of high school, Tucker sought refuge at THE PLAYERS Championship Village, a residential treatment facility for adolescents struggling with substance abuse. Tucker's perseverance enabled her to return to high school and graduate with a remarkable 3.86 G.P.A. She also established an Alcoholics Anonymous program at her school to help others battling the addictions she once faced.

A guidance counselor encouraged Tucker to apply for a PLAYERS Championship scholarship. Tucker was awarded \$10,000 to help with books and tuition. "This has been a great help in my college career and made it possible for me to go to a university," said Tucker. "I plan to

do great things in the medical field and I know that I can because of the support given to me by THE PLAYERS."

On Wednesday, Tucker was invited as a guest to the PGA TOUR's Lifetime Achievement Award celebration honoring former President George H.W. Bush. Prior to the ceremony, Tucker was among a few who had a private meeting with the former President. Tucker later received a surprise letter from former First Lady Nancy Reagan. A champion of recreational drug prevention, Ms. Reagan wrote to commend Tucker for her strength and determination.

There were 1,241 birdies made at the 2008 PLAYERS and more than \$180,000 was raised.
