Tiger Eyes a Different Tale this Year

or the first time since he turned professional in 1996, Tiger Woods missed THE PLAYERS Championship when he didn't play in the 2008 tournament because he was recovering from a knee injury. So when we last left Woods at TPC Sawgrass, the world's No. 1-ranked player was leaving

THE PLAYERS Championship after shooting a final-round 67. The problem was, he had shot rounds of 75-73-73 in the first three rounds of the 2007 tournament to tie for 37th.

Woods expects a better performance this week as he makes his return to the site of two victories—the 2001 PLAYERS Championship and the 1994 U.S. Amateur.

"I haven't hit the ball well here. I've come into this event and for some reason haven't hit it well," Woods said Tuesday. "The year I did (in 2007), I couldn't make a putt. I haven't really put all the pieces together, and you have to have that in order to win this tournament."

Naturally, Woods does hold himself to a high standard, and that might explain why he seemed to forget the 2001 tournament, where he was par or better all four days and edged Vijay Singh to win his lone PLAYERS title. Woods, however, does understand where his game has to be in order to win THE PLAYERS.

"It's very similar to a major championship," he said of the tournament, which has called TPC Sawgrass home since 1982. "You have to have all the pieces. You can't hit the ball well and not putt well or vice-versa. You have to have everything going together at the same time."

Hydration/First Aid

After one of the warmest events in PLAYERS history last year, officials have

announced two initiatives aimed to give fans easy and affordable access to water. The price of bottled water, available at all concession stands, will be \$2.50. In addition, there will be numerous drinking fountains (also known as Hydration Stations) available for the public to use free of charge throughout the course.

Approximately 60 volunteers donate more than 150 hours of first aid and medical services every year at THE PLAYERS. Volunteers typically treat around 75-100 patients during the tournament week, with about 12 percent of those patients being transported to the Baptist Medical Center Beaches Emergency Center for further treatment.

"Dehydration is the most common reason for medical intervention at THE PLAYERS Championship but it can easily be prevented. The Operation Hydration initiative will help spectators avoid dehydration by making water readily availableso whenever you see an Operation Hydration station, drink up!"

Former President Bush to Be Honored Today

eorge H.W. Bush, the 41st President of the United States, will be the ninth recipient of the PGA TOUR's Lifetime Achievement Award during ceremonies today at THE PLAYERS Championship.

Bush will be honored at 5 p.m. during a "Military Tribute" on the 18th hole of THE PLAYERS Stadium Course at TPC Sawgrass. The tribute is part of THE PLAYERS Military Appreciation Day, which offers free admission to all active-duty and retired members of U.S. Armed Forces. The tribute is also open to the public (Wednesday tournament ticket holders). Bush will officially receive the award from PGA TOUR Commissioner Tim Finchem during a private reception this evening.

THE PLAYERS Championship is proud to welcome active-duty, retired and reserve military men and women and their families throughout the week as part of PGA TOUR Charities' Birdies for the Brave military outreach program. Military guests will enjoy complimentary access to the Patriots'



Outpost, a military hospitality chalet located on the 18th fairway.

Created in 1996, the Lifetime Achievement Award honors individuals who have made an outstanding contribution to the TOUR over an extended period through their actions on and off the course. Bush joins a

distinguished list of past Lifetime Achievement Award recipients, although he is the first recipient from outside the golf industry.

Gene Sarazen, Byron Nelson, Arnold Palmer, Sam Snead, Jack Burke Jr., Pete Dye, Deane Beman and Jack Nicklaus are the past winners.

"It means a great deal to receive this distinguished award from an organization like the PGA TOUR which, to me, epitomizes the Points of Light spirit for the way it supports so many worthwhile causes in such a wonderful way," Bush said. "Working with Tim Finchem and getting to know so many of the TOUR's members has been one of the great joys of my post-White House life, and my gratitude goes to all who were fully aware of my skills on the course and yet chose to support this welcome decision anyway."

Bush, 84, grew up in a family that was always heavily involved with golf. His grandfather, George Herbert Walker, was United States Golf Association (USGA) president in 1920 and donated the trophy for what would become the Walker Cup. Bush's father, Prescott Bush, was a scratch golfer who served as USGA president in 1935 and was instrumental in establishing the USGA Museum and Archives.

In 1996, Bush served as honorary chairman of The Presidents Cup at Robert Trent Jones Golf Club in Prince William County, VA. He has since attended every Presidents Cup, taking time to stand on the first tee and greet every player. Since 1997, Bush has served as honorary chairman of The First Tee program. He's also an honorary member of the PGA of America and honorary chair of the USGA Museum and Archives President's Council, and in 1997, he received the PGA of America's Distinguished Service Award.

In 2007, he hit the ceremonial first shot on July 4 to launch the AT&T National, a golf tournament hosted by Tiger Woods. In 2008, he received the Bob Jones Award, given annually by the USGA in recognition of distinguished sportsmanship in golf.

Stadium Village

Building "Little" 17

And you thought the "real" 17th hole was intimidating? Try its little brother, the UBS 17th Challenge, which takes up an entire side of the Stadium Village this week at THE PLAYERS Championship. The hole is only 33 yards, roughly one-fourth the distance of the original, including the green's undulations, the small front bunker, a scoreboard, grandstands, similar flowers and lots of water. But the most difficult and realistic part may be the fans gathered around waiting for their chance to hit one shot or those just watching as they enjoy lunch or a beverage. Everyday golfers will try and copy the PGA TOUR professionals, with much less of a skill set.

The concept debuted in 2006 at THE PLAYERS Championship when the McGriff Group, a Jacksonvillebased sports marketing agency, dreamed up the idea of a smaller version of 17. There was born the UBS 17th Challenge. Construction on the little 17th takes approximately one month. First, the netting is put in place. Then Pizzazz Scenic Contractors, Inc., of Jacksonville builds the one-third scale green from Styrofoam and wood, using the precise drawings of the original as a guide, and pieces it together like a puzzle. Southwest Greens, the manufacturer of synthetic putting surfaces, adds the putting surface on top. Last Friday, approximately 90,000 gallons of water were pumped into the pool surrounding the green.

This week, fans register electronically before hitting and a video of their shot is immediately sent to their e-mail addresses so they can savor the moment.

A hint: According to organizers, the easiest hole location for an ace is front left.









Garcia Looks for Answers at PLAYERS

ergio Garcia hopes familiar territory will get his game back on the right track this week at THE PLAYERS Championship.

The 29-year-old defending champion has struggled in 2009, with his best finish a tie for 13th at The Honda Classic. In his last two starts, he finished tied for 38th at the Masters Tournament and missed the cut in last week's Quail Hollow Championship in Charlotte, NC.

"I am obviously not feeling 100 percent with my game at the moment, and it shows," said Garcia. "I'm trying to change that and I think this is a good place." Garcia started using a belly putter in April, even though he grips the longer and heavier club without the butt end of the club stuck into his stomach as most players do. He is still working with former PGA TOUR player Stan Utley on his putting.

"I'm trying to see if I can get some confidence and feel good with something," Garcia said.

Coming to TPC Sawgrass and THE PLAYERS adds to that feelgood story.

"When you get to a course where you're comfortable, you see the shot straight away, and you say OK this is perfect," Garcia said. "It's a nice draw or just a nice putt or something, and it takes the doubts out of your head. You can just focus yourself on hitting the right shot at the right time."

After 15 years as a professional golfer, Strano decided to utilize his golf skills in order to help the Deaf and Hard-of-Hearing community. In 2003, he began studying sign language in a quest to bridge an existing gap between golf and the hearing impaired. By 2004, Strano held his first clinic in Florida and has toured the country with his clinics.

Strano's camps demonstrate that the children's disabilities do not limit their capabilities.

"In every one of them, I see greatness," Strano said, "whether it's playing golf, being a lawyer, an accountant or a computer expert. There's no limit to what they can do."

After the clinic, the children enjoyed the rest of the day meeting players on the Stadium Course.

These Kids Can Play PaintFest

Local families of children with life-threatening health conditions enjoyed a day at THE PLAYERS Championship on Tuesday. Wives of PGA TOUR professionals hosted the families at the UBS 17th Hole Challenge in the Stadium Village, painted murals as part of PaintFest and had their faces painted by Kitty the Clown. Jacksonville Jaguars mascot Jaxson de Ville made an appearance, and many TOUR golf professionals stopped by to interact.

The children and their families are served by Community PedsCare, which is part of the Community Hospice of Northeastern Florida. Community PedsCare is a pediatric palliative and hospice program for children with life-limiting and lifethreatening conditions. The program was established in 2000 by Community Hospice of Northeast Florida, in collaboration with Wolfson Children's Hospital, Nemours Children's Clinic and the University of Florida.

"It's great to get the kids out and give them diversions from what they deal with early in life," said 2005 PLAYERS Champion Fred Funk. "It's almost a circus, carnivallike atmosphere so I'm sure it's as fun for them as it is for us."



Sixty-eight area charities will benefit from the Birdies for Charity program this year. Monetary pledges are collected for each birdie made during the tournament, with the participant guessing the correct number of birdies made at the 2009 PLAYERS winning a trip to San Francisco and The Presidents Cup in October. There were 1,241 birdies made at the 2008 PLAYERS and more than \$180,000 was raised.

The 2008 PLAYERS and the PGA TOUR made joint contributions totaling \$3 million to Northeast Florida charities. Since 1977, when THE PLAYERS Championship moved to Ponte Vedra Beach, FL, more than \$31 million has been contributed to charitable organizations in Northeast Florida.
