World Golf Championships-Accenture Match Play Championship Scenarios

One chance remains for players to move into the top 64 in the Official World Golf Ranking (OWGR) and solidify their position in the field for the 2013 World Golf Championships-Accenture Match Play Championship. The AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am on the PGA TOUR and Joburg Open, co-sanctioned by the European Tour and Sunshine Tour, are the final tournaments for players to earn OWGR points and punch their tickets to the Accenture Match Play Championship, which returns to The Golf Club at Dove Mountain in Marana, Ariz., February 18-24. The 2013 Accenture Match Play Championship will feature the top 64 players in the OWGR as of Monday, February 11. The 2013 bracket and tee times will be unveiled on Sunday, February 17, once the OWGR is updated following the conclusion of the Northern Trust Open on the PGA TOUR.

Brandt Snedeker (T1)

Riding the momentum of second-place finishes the last two weeks, Brandt Snedeker carded a bogey-free 4-under 68 at Spyglass Hill on Friday to move to 8-under 134 and into a first-place tie with Ted Potter Jr.

Snedeker, the current FedExCup points leader, is the eighth player since 1990 to finish runner-up in back-to-back weeks on the PGA TOUR. Mark Calcavecchia finished second in three consecutive weeks in 1990.

This marks the seventh time Snedeker has held at least a share of the 36-hole lead on TOUR, most recently at the 2012 British Open (finished T3). He has yet to carry the 36-hole lead on to victory.

In five AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am starts, a T21 in 2010 is the best of Snedeker's three made cuts.

Last week, Snedeker (24-under 260) posted the lowest four-round total in the history of the Waste Management Phoenix Open that didn't win the event.

In his 17 rounds thus far in 2013, Snedeker has 14 rounds in the 60s. With his 68 on Friday, he is now 31/35 for subpar rounds in official TOUR events, dating to the start of the Wyndham Championship in August of last year.

Ted Potter Jr. (T1)

Despite offsetting an opening-hole eagle (No. 10) with two consecutive bogeys on Nos. 14 & 15, Ted Potter Jr. carded a second-round 3-under 67 at Monterey Peninsula Country Club to move to 8-under 134 through two rounds of the AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am.

Potter, a 29-year-old native of Ocala, Fla., missed the cut at the 2012 AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am with rounds of 77-72-74.

Potter's lone top-10 finish on the PGA TOUR (this week marks his 29th start) was his victory at the 2012 Greenbrier Classic. He owns two top-30 finishes in three starts this season, finishing T24 at the Waste Management Phoenix Open and T26 at the Hyundai Tournament of Champions.

With the exception of leading at the conclusion of the 2012 Greenbrier Classic, this marks the first time Potter has led after a round on the PGA TOUR.

Phil Mickelson (T39)

Making his 18th start at the AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am, four-time winner Phil Mickelson (1998, 2005, 2007, 2013) followed an opening round 1-under-par 69 at Monterey Peninsula CC with a 1-under 71 on Friday at Spyglass Hill. He enters the weekend T39.

Mickelson is seeking to become the seventh back-to-back champion of the AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am: Sam Snead (1937, 1938); Cary Middlecoff (1955, 1956); Jack Nicklaus (1972, 1973); Tom Watson (1977, 1978); Mark O'Meara (1989, 1990), Dustin Johnson (2009, 2010).

Mickelson has won events back-to-back weeks on two occasions: 2005 Waste Management Phoenix Open-AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am 2006 BellSouth Classic-Masters Tournament

Mickelson is the leader among active players with PGA TOUR victories at multiple-course events with 13, followed by Tiger Woods (12). Here's a breakdown of Mickelson's multiple-course wins: 4—AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am; 3—Chrysler Classic of Tucson; 3—Farmers Insurance Open; 2—Humana Challenge; 1—HP Byron Nelson Championship.

Mickelson, who owns 13 career PGA TOUR wins in California (second behind Tiger Woods' 14 among active players), is the only wire-to-wire winner in tournament history (2005).

With his win in 2012, Mickelson moved into second all-time with four victories at the event, trailing only "Prince of Pebble Beach" Mark O'Meara (5). Jack Nicklaus and Johnny Miller are three-time winners.

The wire-to-wire victory at last week's Waste Management Phoenix Open gives him at least one win for a TOUR-leading 10 consecutive seasons. Dustin Johnson is second on the list, with wins in his last six years.

Additional Player Notes

Four players with ties to California are currently ranked inside the top 10, including Long Beach natives John Merrick (T3) and Patrick Cantlay (T7), Orange native Hunter Mahan (T3) and Alameda resident James Hahn (T7).

Making his first start at the AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am since 2009, Fredrik Jacobson birdied five of six holes (Nos. 13, 15-18) en route to a 6-under 66 at Pebble Beach Golf Links. Jacobson's previous-best round in three earlier starts here was 67, set on three occasions and most recently during the second round in 2008 (led to his best finish at the event – T14). He enters the weekend T3.

Hunter Mahan (T3) leads the field with 33 of 36 greens in regulation through two rounds (91.7 percent).

Two-time AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am winner Dustin Johnson (2009, 2010) owns seven career wins – the most by players currently in their 20s. He rebounded from an opening-round 3-over-par 73 (matching his highest opening round at the AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am/2008 at Poppy Hills) with a second-round 3-under 69 at Spyglass Hill to move to T70.

Charlie Wi, the 2012 runner-up of the AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am and 1990 California State Amateur champion at Pebble Beach, sits T39 after matching rounds of 70.

Mike Weir's 65 today at Monterey Peninsula Country Club was his lowest round since a second-round 64 at the 2010 Honda Classic.

Miscellaneous Notes

Holding the lead after 36 holes has been a good omen so far this year, with four of five carrying that lead on to the winner's circle, including Dustin Johnson at the 54-hole Hyundai Tournament of Champions, Russell Henley at the Sony Open in Hawaii, Tiger Woods at the Farmers Insurance Open and Phil Mickelson at the Waste Management Phoenix Open.

Only six players since 1970 have earned their first win at this event: John Cook (1981), Steve Jones (1988), Brett Ogle (1993), Matt Gogel (2002), Arron Oberholser (2006) and D.A. Points (2011).
