Weather

Mostly sunny and cool. High of 53. Winds WNW 10-15 mph.

CUT: 70 out of 156 professionals at 1-under 213 made the 54-hole cut, with all 70 competing in the final round. The cut rule is top 70 and ties get paid and receive FedExCup points but only the top 60 and ties play on Sunday. The cut number was the same for both top 60 and top 70.

For the amateur cut, the top 25 teams (no ties) qualify for Sunday's final round – the tiebreaker being as follows:

- 1) 54-hole score of the professional
- 2) The 18-hole net team score from the round played at Pebble Beach GL
- 3) The net team score from No. 18 backwards from the round played at Pebble Beach GL

Brandt Snedeker

So far this season, Snedeker has been in the top-4 of the standings at the end of 11 of his 18 rounds on TOUR.

Snedeker, the current FedExCup points leader and defending FedExCup champion, is the eighth player since 1990 to finish runner-up in back-to-back weeks on the PGA TOUR. Mark Calcavecchia finished second in three consecutive weeks in 1990. None of the previous players went on to win in the third week.

Snedeker has had three previous third-round leads/co-leads on TOUR:

In five AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am starts, a T21 in 2010 is the best of Snedeker's three made cuts.

In his 18 rounds thus far in 2013, Snedeker has 15 rounds in the 60s and 17 under-par rounds. Snedeker has had a round in the 60s in 15 of his last 16 rounds on TOUR. A 75 in the second round of the Farmers Insurance Open is his lone miss.

He is now 32/36 for subpar rounds in official TOUR events, dating to the start of the Wyndham Championship in August of last year. The week before the Wyndham Championship, Snedeker missed the cut at the PGA Championship – one of two missed cuts last season.

James Hahn

Hahn closed today's round with three straight birdies at Spyglass Hill GC (Nos. 7-9) to capture a share of the lead.

Hahn held a share of the lead after the first and second rounds at the Humana Challenge. Those are his only on TOUR prior to today.

Hahn is making his sixth career start on the PGA TOUR. He has now made all five of his cuts this season with a pair of top-25 finishes and a best finish of T4 at the Humana Challenge. His only start on TOUR prior to this year was a missed cut at the 2012 U.S. Open.

Hahn finished fifth last year on the Web.com Tour. Hahn's only win on the Web.com Tour came at the 2012 Rex Hospital Open in Raleigh, NC.

Only six players since 1970 have earned their first win at this event: John Cook (1981), Steve Jones (1988), Brett Ogle (1993), Matt Gogel (2002), Arron Oberholser (2006) and D.A. Points (2011).

In his first 16 rounds to open the season, Hahn had a 63 and two final-round 62s (Humana Challenge and Waste Management Phoenix Open).

Patrick Reed

Reed, the former All-American at Augusta State University, made seven of 12 cuts on TOUR in 2012. Last year as a non-member, Reed Monday Qualified for six events and received six sponsor exemptions. He Monday Qualified for the Zurich Classic of New Orleans (T24), Wells Fargo Championship (T32), HP Byron Nelson Championship (MC), Travelers Championship (T47), True South Classic (T21) and Justin Timberlake Shriners Hospitals for Children Classic (T22). He's also played in the Valero Texas Open (T35), FedEx St.Jude Classic (MC), John Deere Classic (MC), Reno-Tahoe Open (MC), Frys.com Open (T11) and Children's Miracle Network Classic (T22) on Sponsor's Exemptions.

Reed finished T22 at the 2012 PGA TOUR Qualifying Tournament to earn his TOUR card for 2013. Reed is making his fourth start of the season. He missed his first two cuts at the Sony Open in Hawaii and the Humana Challenge. He finished T39 at the Farmers Insurance Open.

Richard H. Lee

Richard H. Lee finished T4 at the 2012 PGA TOUR Qualifying Tournament to retain his TOUR membership for 2013. Lee is making his fifth start of the season, with a T10 at the Humana Challenge his best finish. In his rookie season in 2012, Lee finished No. 144 in the FedExCup standings and No. 138 on the final money list.

Chris Kirk

Kirk has been under-par in all 15 of his rounds this season in four starts. He finished T5 at the Sony Open in Hawaii, missed the cut at the Humana Challenge and finished T24 at the Waste Management Phoenix Open.

The third-round lead/co-leader has gone on to win three of four 72-hole events on TOUR this season.
