- Earns 5th career PGA TOUR win at the age of 32 years, 2 months and 2 days in his 171st career start. Second player in his 30s to win on TOUR in 2013 (Tiger Woods/Farmers Insurance Open).
- 2012 FedExCup champion retains the No. 1 spot in the current FedExCup standings.
- Moves from No. 6 to No. 4 in the Official World Golf Ranking, passing Justin Rose (5) and Louis Oosthuizen (6).
- Extends exempt PGA TOUR status by one year through the 2018 season.
- TOUR wins:
 - 2007 Wyndham Championship
 - 2011 RBC Heritage
 - 2012 Farmers Insurance Open
 - 2012 TOUR Championship by Coca-Cola
 - 2013 AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am
- Records second win in last six starts on TOUR.
- Best finish in five previous starts at AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am was T21 (2010).
- Sets 72-hole low total record with 267, breaking the record of 268 set by Mark O'Meara (1997) and later matched by Phil Mickelson (2007).
- First winner of AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am to post all four rounds in the 60s since Vijay Singh (2004).
- 2013 starts-made cuts-top-10s-wins: 5-5-4-1.
- Becomes first player to follow up two consecutive runner-up finishes with a win (dating back to 1990).
- In 19 rounds thus far in 2013, has 16 rounds in the 60s and 18 under-par rounds.
- Has had a round in the 60s in 16 of his last 17 rounds on TOUR. A 75 in the second round of the Farmers Insurance Open is his lone over-par round.

- Is 33/37 for subpar rounds on TOUR dating back to the first round of the Wyndham Championship in August of last year. The week before the Wyndham Championship, he missed the cut at the PGA Championship.

Miscellaneous Player Notes

Since 2011, players with most PGA TOUR wins: Rory McIlroy (5), Brandt Snedeker (4) and Tiger Woods (4).

The top 10 finishers from this week that are currently alternates in the Northern Trust Open field advance to the top of the alternate list: James Hahn (T3) and Patrick Reed (T7). The last player in the field as of Sunday is Wes Short Jr. playing out of the Major Medical Extension category.

Making his first TOUR start of 2013 after undergoing back surgery last August 21, Retief Goosen finished T9 this week and earned a total of \$175,500 to earn Major Medical Extension status for the remainder of 2013. Goosen needed \$76,336 to extend his Major Medical. Goosen's top-10 finish was his first since a T3 at the 2012 FedEx St. Jude Classic.

James Hahn (T3) and Patrick Reed (T7) were the two rookies to finish in the top 10 this week. Reed's top-10 finish was the first of his career in his 19th start. Current rookies inside the top 30 in the FedExCup standings: Russell Henley (5), James Hahn (11), David Lingmerth (15).

Chris Kirk's runner-up finish was his best since his victory at the 2011 True South Classic, and his second career runner-up (2011 Shell Houston Open). Kirk led the field with 24 birdies this week.

Patrick Cantlay's T9 finish was his second career top-10 finish. He finished T9 as an amateur at the 2011 RBC Canadian Open.

Chris Kirk (MP-Round 3, Russell Knox (MP-Round 1) and Bryce Molder (PB-Round 4) shared low-round honors of the week with 64.

Heath Slocum, Kevin Stadler and Jimmy Walker all posted two eagles on the week.
