Tiger Woods defeated Richard Sterne 1 up, to clinch victory for the United States Team. In 2011, Woods won The Presidents Cup with his fifth birdie of the day on the 15th hole by defeating Aaron Baddeley. In 2009, Tiger Woods clinched The Presidents Cup on the 13th hole of his match against Y.E. Yang, winning 6&5. Woods is the only player to clinch the cup on three occasions. The only other player to clinch the cup in multiple President Cups was Fred Couples who also clinched twice in 1994 and 1996.

Woods' victory came at a time when it looked as if the International Team might be able to claw its way back to a tie, cutting the lead to 17-13. The four matches on the course were either All Square or within 1 hole.

Round two matches resumed at 7:35 a.m. Round three matches were suspended for one hour and seventeen minutes (12:56 -2:13 p.m.), delaying the start of the round four. The round four began at 3:52 p.m., with groups teeing off until 5:01 p.m. Round four was suspended due to darkness at 7:02 p.m., with five of the six matches still on the course. The course received .50 inches of rain on Saturday. Sunday: Mostly cloudy with light showers and a high of 75 degrees. Winds S 10-15 mph. Round four resumed at 7:35 a.m. Due to the threat of inclement weather, round five began at 9:30 a.m., the last group in round five teed off at 11:31 a.m. The course received .35 inches of rain on Sunday. The total rainfall for the week was 1.97 inches.
