Cherry Hills Country Club opened in 1922 and was designed by well-known designer William Flynn. Flynn was best known for his redesign of Shinnecock Hills on Long Island, site of the 2004 U.S. Open.

By hosting the 2005 U.S. Women's Open, Cherry Hills joined Winged Foot Golf Club in Mamaroneck, N.Y., and Hazeltine National Golf Club in Chaska, Minn., as the only courses to have hosted the U.S. Open, U.S. Senior Open, U.S. Amateur and U.S. Women's Open. members in more than 72 countries.
