First-Round Notes – October 24, 2013

Weather summary: Overcast with a high of 86 and winds WNW 4-8 mph. Due to heavy overnight rain, the first round utilized preferred lies in closely-mown areas.

In addition to 500 FedExCup points and a two-year PGA TOUR exemption, the winner of the first-ever FedExCup event contested in Malaysia (if not previously eligible) receives invitations to the Hyundai Tournament of Champions, a winners-only event in January, along with two major championships (Masters Tournament and PGA Championship) and THE PLAYERS. The player would also earn exemptions into six additional invitationals.

Ryan Moore (9-under-par 63)

With today's first round being the first-ever official PGA TOUR event held at Kuala Lumpur G&CCs West Course, Ryan Moore set the course record with a 9-under par 63 that included a bogey-5 on his first hole of the day. The low professional score on the West Course was a 62 by Raphael Jacquelin in the third round at the 2006 Malaysian Open, with the course having undergone a renovation since then

Moore's first-round lead is the fifth first-round lead/co-lead of his career on the PGA TOUR:

Moore birdied all four par-3s in the first round.

Moore is making his third CIMB Classic start – he finished T5 in 2010 and withdrew during the final round in 2011.

Moore is a two-time winner on the PGA TOUR: 2009 Wyndham Championship and 2012 Shriners Hospitals for Children Open. Last year, Moore posted three top-10 finishes and finished 53rd in the FedExCup standings.

Last week in his title defense at the Shriners Hospitals for Children Open, Moore finished T9 in his first start of 2013-14.

Moore is a native of the State of Washington and currently makes his home in Las Vegas. While playing collegiately at UNLV, Moore had one of the most impressive careers in the modern era of amateur golf, with victories at the the U.S. Amateur, the Western Amateur, the U.S. Amateur Public Links (twice) and the NCAA individual championship. Moore then turned professional in 2005 and earned his 2006 PGA TOUR card straight out of UNLV without having to go the PGA TOUR Qualifying School, joining players that had accomplished the feat before him: Gary Hallberg, Scott Verplank, Phil Mickelson, Justin Leonard and Tiger Woods. Bud Cauley did so in 2011 out of the University of Alabama.

Keegan Bradley (7-under-par 65)

Three-time PGA TOUR winner and 2011 PGA TOUR Rookie of the Year Keegan Bradley is making his first start of the 2013-14 PGA TOUR Season. Despite not winning last year, Bradley finished 18th in the FedExCup standings on the strength of a career-best seven top-10 finishes.

Bradley is making his first career start at the CIMB Classic.

Sergio Garcia (6-under-par 66)

Eight-time PGA TOUR winner Sergio Garcia, making his first-ever CIMB Classic appearance, hit 17 of 18 Greens in Regulation (94.4 percent) to lead the field. He stands third after a first-round 66.

Garcia played in the Wednesday Pro-Am this week with H.M. Queen Raja Permaisuri Agong Tuanku Hajah Haminah Hamidun.

Rory Sabbatini (5-under-par 67)

Rory Sabbatini, a native of South Africa who now lives in Dallas, missed the cut in his first two starts of the 2013-14 season with a scoring average of 76.0.

Sabbatini is a six-time PGA TOUR winner, his most recent being the 2011 Honda Classic. Last year, Sabbatini finished No. 46 in the FedExCup standings on the strength of five top 10s.

Sabbatini finished T28 in his lone CIMB Classic start in 2011.

Phil Mickelson, the top-ranked player in the field in the Official World Golf Ranking, finished with a 1-under-par 71 that included double-bogeys on No. 2 and No. 9 (his back nine). He hit just 5 of 14 fairways (35.7 percent) but managed to hit 15 of 18 Greens in Regulation (83.3 percent) .

The top PGA TOUR non-member through the first round is Kiradech Aphibarnrat, who posted a 5-under-par 67 and sits T4.
