El Camaleón Golf Club bends through three distinct landscapes - dense tropical jungles, mangrove forests, and stunning, oceanfront stretches of sand and is bisected by massive limestone canals. Greg Norman incorporated a cenote, an ancient underground cavern and river system into the center of the opening fairway.

Holes No. 7 and 15 play right to the edge of the Carribbean Sea. In the distance is one of the world's largest coral reefs and the island of Cozumel.
