

English wins in his first start at the OHL Classic at Mayakoba.

English's 2013 starts-made cuts-top-10s-wins: 4-4-2-1.

English's PGA TOUR career starts-made cuts-top-10s-wins: 57-47-9-2.

English's scoring breakdown for the week: Par-3s (-9), Par-4s (-8), Par-5s (-4)

English has recorded 15 of 16 rounds at par-or-better to start this season. His other top 10 this season is T7 at the CIMB Classic.

English claimed victory on the Web.com Tour, as an amateur, at the 2011 Nationwide Children's Hospital Invitational.

English was a four-time All-American at the University of Georgia, where he won four collegiate events. In 2007, he was third-youngest winner, at age 18, of the Georgia State Amateur (Bobby Jones in 1916 and Charles Yates in 1931). He was a member of the 2011 U.S. Walker Cup team.

Miscellaneous Notes

Brian Stuard (2nd) has two runner-up finishes in two starts at the OHL Classic at Mayakoba: 2010/T2 and 2013/2nd.

Jason Bohn (T3) earns his second top 10 of the season in four starts. He finished T2 at the Shriners Hospitals for Children Open. He had two top 10s all of last season.

Justin Leonard (T6) notched his first top 10 of the season. He only had one top 10 all of last season (T4/Valspar Championship). He has now recorded at least one top 10 the last 21 years on TOUR.

Chris Stroud (T3) gets his second T3 finish of the season in four starts (T3/CIMB Classic). He missed the cut in his other two starts (Frys.com Open and McGladrey Classic).

Justin Hicks (T6) records his best career finish and second career top 10 on TOUR in his 57th start. His previous-best finish was T7 at the 2013 FedEx St. Jude Classic. He finished No. 116 in the FedExCup standings last season.

Robert Karlsson, who held sole possession of the lead after round one and round three and a share of the lead after round two, finished T6 to earn a spot (via top 10) into the Sony Open in Hawaii in January.

Charles Howell III (T6) recorded his third top 10 of the season in five starts (T5/Shriners Hospitals for Children Open and T7/CIMB Classic). He had five top 10s all of last season and just two top 10s in 2012.

Four Mexican players began the week in the field: Oscar Fraustro (T49), Roberto Diaz (MC), Jose de Jesus Rodriguez (MC), Esteban Toledo (MC). Rodriguez won two weeks ago on PGA TOUR Latinoamerica.

Esteban Toledo (2007, 2008, 2009, 2012), Jose de Jesus Rodriguez (2009, 2012) and Oscar Fraustro (2013) are the only Mexicans to make the cut in the OHL Classic at Mayakoba in the seven year history of the event.

Over the first six events of the season, Chesson Hadley recorded the only top 10 by a rookie (T5/Shriners Hospitals for Children Open).

Weather/Delay Notes

On Thursday, the first round was suspended from 8:40 to 11 a.m. Central due to a dangerous weather situation with the entire morning wave on the course. Play was suspended again at 1:22 p.m. due to a dangerous weather situation. Play was called for the day at 3:30 p.m. with 15 players completing the first round.

On Friday, the first round resumed at 6:46 a.m. and was completed at 12:57. The second round began at 11:50 a.m. on Friday. The second round was suspended due to a dangerous weather situation from 2:59 to 3:25 p.m. for a total delay is 26 minutes. The second round was suspended due to darkness at 5:02 p.m. with 29 players finishing the second round.

On Saturday, the second round resumed at 6:45 a.m. Central and was completed at 12:45 p.m. The third round began at 1:15 p.m. in threesomes off two tees. The third round was suspended due to darkness at 5:07 p.m. with all 78 players on the course.

On Sunday, the third round resumed at 7 a.m. and concluded at 9:53 a.m. Players were not repaired between round three and round four. Final round tee times ran from 8:45 a.m. to 10:45 a.m.

All four rounds utilized preferred lies in closely-mown areas.

The 2013 season saw 22 of 40 events delayed for various reasons ranging from fog, lightning, thunderstorms, snow, hail, sleet, frost, darkness and high wind. Three of the first six events of the 2013-14 season experienced delays due to weather (CIMB Classic, McGladrey Classic and OHL Classic at Mayakoba).

Prior to this year, the only other delay at the OHL Classic at Mayakoba was for 10 minutes during round three in 2011 due to a dangerous weather situation.
