At the 2013 Honda Classic, Luke Guthrie held a one-stroke lead over eventual champion Michael Thompson after the second round.

36-hole Cut

The cut came at even-par 140 with 79 players advancing to the weekend out of 144 professionals.

With more than 78 players making the 36-hole cut, a 54-hole cut will be in effect following the third round to reduce the field to the low 70 players and ties.

Rory McIlroy

One day after Rory McIlroy's 7-under 63 marked his lowest round on TOUR since a 63 at the 2010 Open Championship (R1), he came back a day later with a 66, good for a one-stroke lead over Brendon de Jonge at the midway point of The Honda Classic.

McIlroy's 36-hole total of 129 through the opening two rounds is a new career-low, topping his 130 at the 2012 Deutsche Bank Championship. Here's a look at his best opening 36-hole scores on the PGA TOUR:

McIlroy's 36-hole total of 129 is one shy of Dan Pohl's Honda Classic record set in 1989.

R2 at a glance: 7 of 14 fairways, 11 of 18 greens, 24 putts, 1 of 1 sand saves.

McIlroy has a career-low 49 putts through the first two rounds. His previous-best totals through the first two rounds were 50 putts (2012 Deutsche Bank Championship) and 52 putts (2013 WGC-Bridgestone Invitational, 2013 The Barclays, 2012 FedEx St. Jude Classic, 2010 FedEx St. Jude Classic).

During the 2013 PGA TOUR season, McIlroy had just seven made putts over 25 feet. By comparison, he has made four putts in excess of 25 feet so far this week at The Honda Classic (26'10"/R1/#2, 45'6"/R1/#11, 29'4"/R2/#5, 27'4"/R2/#7).

McIlroy has previously held at least a share of the 36-hole lead four times, most recently carrying that lead on to victory at the 2012 Deutsche Bank Championship. He also carried the 36-hole lead to victory at the 2011 U.S. Open, where he won by eight.

McIlroy is looking for his first win on TOUR since the 2012 BMW Championship.

McIlroy at The Honda Classic: 2009 (T13), 2010 (T40), 2011 (T70), 2012 (Won), 2013 (WD), 2014 (TBD).

McIlroy (2012) is the youngest winner in Honda Classic tournament history at 22 years, 10 months.

In 2012 when McIlroy won The Honda Classic he was just the fourth player to win the event and post four rounds in the 60s (66-67-66-69). The others were Tom Kite (1981), Matt Kuchar (2002) and Camilo Villegas (2010).

International players have dominated The Honda Classic in recent years, with wins by Padraig Harrington (2005), Luke Donald (2006), Ernie Els (2008), Y.E. Yang (2009), Camilo Villegas (2010), Rory Sabbatini (2011) and Rory McIlroy (2012).

36-hole Leader Statistics

The last second-round leader/co-leader to carry their lead to the winner's circle at The Honda Classic was Camilo Villegas in 2010.

The second-round leader/co-leaders have carried their lead on to victory seven of 13 times during the 2013-14 season, most recently Jimmy Walker at the AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am.

Brendon de Jonge

With rounds of 66-64, Brendon de Jonge sits just one stroke behind tournament-leader Rory McIlroy. He is making his seventh start at The Honda Classic, with a T9 in 2010 his best finish. Friday's 64 is de Jonge's best score in 22 rounds at the event, topping a third-round 67 in 2010.

R2 at a glance: 12 of 14 fairways, 14 of 18 greens, 24 putts, 2 of 2 sand saves.

de Jonge, a member of the 2013 President's Cup International team, has six made cuts in nine starts on TOUR this season, with a T16 at The McGladrey Classic his best finish.

Russell Henley

With a 2-under 68 Friday, Russell Henley sits 8-under 132 and three strokes behind McIlroy.

R2 at a glance: 9 of 14 fairways, 8 of 18 greens, 25 putts, 1 of 2 sand saves.

Henley finished T13 in his first start at The Honda Classic in 2013 with rounds of 68-71-70-70.

Henley is now 6-under in six career rounds on the Bear Trap (Nos. 15-17), the lowest of any player since 2007 on those holes.

Henley is looking for his first top 10 on TOUR since a T6 at the 2013 Memorial Tournament.

Lee Westwood

Lee Westwood's 5-under 65 is his second best score in 22 rounds at The Honda Classic (63/R4/2012).

R2 at a glance: 9 of 14 fairways, 12 of 18 greens, 25 putts, 3 of 4 sand saves.

Westwood (currently T4) is making his sixth start at The Honda Classic, with three top-10 finishes in his last four starts at the event (T9-2013, 4-2012, T9-2010).

Westwood is making his sixth start of the 2013-14 season, with a T20 at the Northern Trust Open his best outing.

Tiger Woods

Tiger Woods was in and out of the cut line throughout the day Friday, but a birdie on the par-4 13th hole and five ensuing pars led to a weekend appearance for the 79-time PGA TOUR winner. Woods has just nine missed cuts in 297 starts as a professional on the PGA TOUR, with his last coming at the 2012 Greenbrier Classic.

Had Woods missed the cut, it would have marked just the second time that he and Phil Mickelson missed the cut in the same week as professionals on the PGA TOUR (2012 Greenbrier Classic). They also missed the cut at the 1993 HP Byron Nelson Championship, with Woods competing as an amateur.

Woods previous three starts at The Honda Classic: MC (1993/amateur), T2 (2012), T37 (2013).

The week of The Honda Classic offers the final opportunity to qualify for the following week's World Golf Championships event, the Cadillac Championship down the road at Trump National Doral. Players not previously eligible can qualify by being inside the top 50 in the Official World Golf Ranking (players inside the top 50 in the OWGR as of 2/24/14 cannot drop out) or the top 10 or the FedExCup standings following The Honda Classic.

Phil Mickelson missed the cut for the second time in four starts at The Honda Classic (MC-1995, T27-2001, T11-2002, MC-2014). It is his first missed cut on TOUR since the 2013 Greenbrier Classic. Mickelson was seeking his fourth victory in the state of Florida (1997 Bay Hill Invitational; 2007 PLAYERS Championship; 2009 WGC-Cadillac Championship).

Adam Scott, at 3-under 137, earns his 29th consecutive made cut on the PGA TOUR, moving out of a tie with Jason Day for the best current streak on TOUR.

Twelve players have made The Honda Classic their first career TOUR title. Since 2000, five players have achieved the feat; Matt Kuchar (2002), Padraig Harrington (2005), Mark Wilson (2007), Y.E. Yang (2009) and Michael Thompson (2013).

Since 1980, only four players have won The Honda Classic in their first attempt; Tim Herron (1996), Matt Kuchar (2002), Todd Hamilton (2004) and Padraig Harrington (2005). Mark Wilson (2005) and Michael Thompson (2013) are the only United States natives to win since 2005.

Five of the last six winners of The Honda Classic have finished the season of their win inside the top 30 in FedExCup standings (Michael Thompson finished No. 66 in 2013).

The par-4 6th hole played the toughest for the second-consecutive day, yielding a 4.317 average. The par-5 18th hole was the easiest at 4.514.
