Chris Kirk - Tied with two others at 5-under-par

The 29-player TOUR Championship by Coca-Cola is the culmination of the 2013-14 PGA TOUR Season and the final event of the FedExCup Playoffs. The road to the TOUR Championship began with the top 125 players qualifying for The Barclays (won by Hunter Mahan), followed by the top 100 players at the Deutsche Bank Championship (won by Chris Kirk) and the top 70 players at the BMW Championship (won by Billy Horschel). A points reset took place following the BMW Championship giving all 29 players in the field at the TOUR Championship a mathematical chance to win the FedExCup.

The top-five players in the FedExCup standings entering the TOUR Championship control their own destiny and will win the FedExCup title should they go on to victory at East Lake.

This is the first time in the history of the FedExCup format that the final pairing during the final round consists of two players who are both inside the top 5 in the standings.

Billy Horschel - No. 2 in the FedExCup, 66-66-69=201 (-9)

After opening the TOUR Championship by Coca-Cola with consecutive rounds of 4-under-par 66, Billy Horschel carded a 1-under-par 69 and is tied for the 54-hold lead with Rory McIlroy. This is the third time that Horschel has held or shared a 54-lead in his PGA TOUR career. Last week, Horschel held a three-stroke lead heading into the final round and went on to win by two strokes.

To win the FedExCup - No. 2 Billy Horschel (Currently T1; projected No. 1)

- If he wins the TOUR Championship, he wins the FedExCup
- If Jim Furyk wins the TOUR Championship, Horschel can win the FedExCup by finishing solo second
- If Rickie Fowler wins the TOUR Championship, Horschel can win the FedExCup by finishing in a 3-way tie for 2nd

- If Jason Day wins the TOUR Championship, Horschel can with the FedExCup by finishing T3
- If Justin Rose with the TOUR Championship, Horschel can win the FedExCup by finishing T6
- If Chris Kirk or Rory McIlroy wins the TOUR Championship, Horschel can't win the FedExCup

Before the start of the 2014 TOUR Championship by Coca-Cola, Joe Durant held the best scoring average (68.50) in tournament history for players with eight or more career rounds at the event. Through his first seven rounds at the TOUR Championship by Coca-Cola, Billy Horschel's scoring average is 67.85.

R1 at a glance: 6 of 14 fairways, 16 of 18 greens, 30 putts.

R2 at a glance: 8 of 14 fairways, 10 of 18 greens, 3 of 3 sand saves, 24 putts. R3 at a glance: 5 of 14 fairways, 15 of 18 greens, 0 of 1 sand saves, 33 putts.

At 27 years, 9 months, 7 days old, a win this week would make Horschel the fifth-youngest winner in the TOUR Championship's 28-year history and the youngest FedExCup champion in history.

Horschel edged Bubba Watson by two strokes to win last week's BMW Championship, his second PGA TOUR victory (2013 Zurich Classic of New Orleans). He is seeking to join Tiger Woods (2007 and 2009) as the only players to win the BMW Championship and the FedExCup in the same season.

Horschel's win last week was his third top-10 finish in seven FedExCup Playoffs starts. Here are the others: 2014 Deutsche Bank Championship (T2), 2013 TOUR Championship by Coca-Cola (T7).

Rory McIlroy - No. 4 in the FedExCup, 69-65-67=201 (-9)

Northern Ireland's Rory McIlroy shot a final-round 3-under-par 67 to move into a tie for 1st with Billy Horschel after 54 holes. Sunday will mark the 8th time that Rory has led or shared the lead going into the final round of a PGA TOUR event. He has gone on to win five of the last seven in which he led through 54 holes.

This is the first time that McIlroy has shared the lead going into the final round of a PGA TOUR event. In the other seven instances, he has held the outright lead.

To win the FedExCup - No. 4 Rory McIlroy (Currently T1; projected No. T1)

- If he wins the TOUR Championship, he wins the FedExCup
- If Rickie Fowler wins the TOUR Championship and Chris Kirk finishes 4th or worse, Mcllory would tie Fowler for the FedExCup with a solo 2nd in the TOUR Championship, resulting in a playoff for the FedExCup
- If Justin Rose wins the TOUR Championship, McIlroy can win the FedExCup by finishing 3rd
- If Jason Day wins the TOUR Championship, McIlroy can win the FedExCup by finishing solo second
- If Chris Kirk, Billy Horschel or Jim Furyk wins the TOUR Championship, McIlroy can't win the FedExCup

McIlroy was No. 35 in the FedExCup standings after the U.S. Open, and has since rocketed up the list with his three consecutive wins: to No. 11 after The Open Championship; to No. 3 after the Bridgestone Invitational; and to No. 1 after the PGA Championship. He has been steady in the FedExCup Playoffs with a T22 at The Barclays, a T5 at the Deutsche Bank Championship and a T8 at the BMW Championship, his 11th top-10 finish of the season.

At the age of 25 years, 4 months, 10 days, McIlroy would be the youngest FedExCup champion in history and the youngest TOUR Championship by Coca-Cola winner in the FedExCup era (second overall to Tiger Woods at 23 years, 10 months, 1 day, 1999 at Champions GC).

McIlroy would join Tiger Woods as the only players to win a major championship and the FedExCup title in the same season. Woods did so in 2007 when he won the PGA Championship and the FedExCup.

McIlroy's best finish in the FedExCup came in 2012 when he won two Playoff events and was just edged by Brandt Snedeker for the FedExCup title.

Jim Furyk - No. 7 in the FedExCup, 67-69-67=201 (-7)

Jim Furyk shot a third-round 67 to move to solo 3rd following 54 holes and two shots behind Rory McIlroy and Billy Horschel.

Furyk is the highest-ranked player in the FedExCup standings without a victory this season. Furyk finished in the top 10 in half of his starts in the 2013-2014 seasn (10 of 20), including three runner-up finishes, without missing a single cut.

Furyk's last victory was the 2010 TOUR Championship by Coca-Cola, when he also claimed the FedExCup. He is one of three past tournament champions (Adam Scott, Bill Haas) and two past FedExCup champions in the field (Haas). In six previous starts at the TOUR Championship during the FedExCup era, he owns four top-10 finishes and has never finished lower than T14. Furyk is trying to join Tiger Woods (2007, 2009) as the only two-time winner of the FedExCup and only Woods and Phil Mickelson as a two-time winner of the TOUR Championship.

To win the FedExCup - No. 7 Jim Furyk (Currently third; projected No. 5)

- Must win the TOUR Championship AND
- Chris Kirk (No. 1) must finish in a three-way tie for 2nd or worse (currently T7)
- Billy Horschel (No. 2) must finish T2 or worse (currently T1)

Making his 16th start at the TOUR Championship by Coca-Cola (trailing only Phil Mickelson's 17), Jim Furyk posted a 67 (-3), his 96th par-or-better round in the history of the FedExCup Playoffs, with Phil Mickelson next on the list with 82. A win this week would make Furyk the oldest in the 28-year history of the TOUR Championship by Coca-Cola (44 years, 4 months, 2 days old; current record is Mark McCumber in 1994 at 43 years, 1 month, 23 days old). He would be the second-oldest player to win the FedExCup (Vijay Singh, 45 years, 7 months and 16 days old, 2008).

Furyk owns the most top-10 finishes in the FedExCup Playoffs. Of the top five players with the most top 10s in the Playoffs, he is the only one who advanced to this year's TOUR Championship by Coca-Cola.

Jason Day - No. 10 in the FedExCup, 67-67-70=204 (-6)

Jason Day shot an even-par 70 and is three shots off the lead through 54 holes. At No. 10 in the FedExCup standings, Day needs a win this week and some help from several others in the field in order to win the FedExCup.

To win the FedExCup - No. 10 Jason Day (Currently T4; projected No. 10)

- Must win the TOUR Championship, AND
- Chris Kirk must finish fifth or worse (currently T7)
- Billy Horschel must finish in a 3-way tie for third or worse (currently in first place)
- Rory McIlroy must finish T2 or worse (currently T1)

Day's best finish in the TOUR Championship came in 2011 when he finished T6 and posted a career-best 12th-place finish in the FedExCup overall.

Making his 151st PGA TOUR start, Day is seeking his third victory (2010 AT&T Byron Nelson Championship, 2014 World Golf Championships-Accenture Match Play Championship). He would be the second Australian to win the TOUR Championship (Adam Scott, 2006) and seventh international player. A win this week would make him the sixth-youngest winner in the TOUR Championship's 28-year history and, should he go on to also win the FedExCup, he would be the youngest FedExCup champion in history.

Last week, Day withdrew during the second round of the BMW Championship with a back injury. This week, his caddie Colin Swatton walked in after six holes on Thursday due to his own back issues. Day's mental coach Jason Goldsmith took over for Day's 67 (-3) in round one and has been on his bag the remainder of the tournament.

Rickie Fowler - No. 9 in the FedExCup, 69-68-67=204 (-6)

Rickie Fowler is three shots off the lead after a round-3 67. Fowler has a career-best 9 top-10 finishes this year including two runner-up finishes and two third-place finishes. He joined Jack Nicklaus and Tiger Woods as the only players in modern golf history to finish within the top five in all four majors championships: he finished as a runner-up at both the U.S. Open and The Open Championship; T3 at the PGA Championship; and T5 at the Masters Tournament. In all, he's enjoyed nine top-10 finishes in 25 starts this year, including five in a row from June through August. He has two top-10 finishes in the FedExCup Playoffs thus far (T9 at The Barclays and T4 at the BMW Championship), helping him to a career-high rank heading to East Lake.

- Must win the TOUR Championship, AND
- Chris Kirk (No. 1) must finish in a 3-way tie for third or worse (currently T7)

Chris Kirk - No. 1 in the FedExCup, 66-68-71=205 (-5)

Chris Kirk shot a 1-over-par 71 and moved back in the standings to T7, four shots off the lead.

To win the FedExCup - No. 1 Chris Kirk (Currently T7; projected No. 3)

- If he wins the TOUR Championship, he wins the FedExCup
- If Rory McIlroy or Billy Horschel win the TOUR Championship they win the FedExCup
- If Jim Furyk wins the TOUR Championship, Kirk can win the FedExCup with a two-way tie for 2nd
- If Rickie Fowler wins the TOUR Championship, Kirk can win the FedExCup with a two-way tie for 3rd
- If Justin Rose wins the TOUR Championship, Kirk can win the FedExCup with a 21st
- If Jason Day wins the TOUR Championship, Kirk can win the FedExCup with a three-way tie for fourth
- If Billy Horschel or Rory McIlroy wins the TOUR Championship, Kirk can't win the FedExCup

Kirk has 25 made cuts in 27 starts this season, with wins at The McGladrey Classic and Deutsche Bank Championship.

Miscellaneous Notes

This is the youngest field at the TOUR Championship by Coca-Cola in FedExCup history, with an average age of 31; 15 players in the field are in their 20s. The youngest winner of the FedExCup is Bill Haas in 2011 at the age of 29 years, 4 months and 1 day. The youngest winner of the TOUR Championship by Coca-Cola is Tiger Woods in 1999 at 23 years, 10 months and 1 day.
