9:00AM Weather Update: Sun, Sept 14, 2014




Synopsis: Stalled frontal boundary will remain just south of Atlanta across Central Georgia today. ENE winds will keep low clouds over the region for most of the morning. Can't rule out isolated showers or areas of mist and drizzle, but most areas will remain dry. A few peaks of sunshine can be expected this afternoon helping temperatures warm into the upper 70's to low 80's. Looks like the best chance of showers and t-storms will be to our south along the stalled front. However, Atlanta is close enough to the front to keep a chance of showers and t-storms in the forecast. The stalled frontal boundary remains across the state on Monday and will be again the focus for scattered showers and t-storms, especially during the afternoon and evening hours.
