Brandt Snedeker

2013 and now 2015 AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am winner Brandt Snedeker earns his seventh career PGA TOUR victory at the age of 34 years, 2 months, 7 days in his 221st career start on the PGA TOUR. In addition to his Pebble Beach victories, Snedeker has also won the 2007 Wyndham Championship, 2011 RBC Heritage, 1212 Farmers Insurance Open, 2012 TOUR Championship by Coca-Cola and 2013 RBC Canadian Open.

Snedeker's 22-under 265 supplants the previous 72-hole record of 19-under 267 that he set in 2013.

Snedeker's three-stroke win is the largest margin of victory at the AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am since Dustin Johnson won by four strokes in 2009 (rain-shortened to 54 holes).

Snedeker's lone bogey of the week came at the par-4 third hole at Pebble Beach in round three.

With the win, Snedeker extends exempt status through the 2017-18 PGA TOUR Season.

Snedeker earns 500 FedExCup points and is projected to move from No. 43 to No. 5 in the race for the FedExCup with 766 points. In 2014, it took 438 points to qualify for the PGA TOUR Playoffs for the FedExCup, 611 to qualify for Deutsche Bank Championship, 968 for BMW Championship and 1,769 for TOUR Championship. Snedeker won the FedExCup title in 2012.

With the win, Snedeker collects 500 points towards making the 2015 Presidents Cup's American Team.

Snedeker came into the week ranked outside the top-50 in the Official World Golf Ranking (No. 63). As a result of that, having not won in 2014 and a career-high, 86th-place finish in the 2014 FedExCup standings, he was not eligible to compete in this year's Masters Tournament or World Golf Championships events. With this victory, Snedeker will keep alive his streak of consecutive Masters appearances (dating to 2008). The win also moved him inside the top 50 in the Official World Golf Ranking.

With his win, Snedeker becomes the Web.com Tour's 400th graduate to find victory on the PGA TOUR.

Snedeker wins in his eighth start at the AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am. Aside from his 2013 and 2015 wins, his highest finish is T21 in 2010.

Snedeker becomes the fourth winner in the last five years to have emerged after playing Pebble Beach in rounds three and four. Last year, Jimmy Walker played Monterey Peninsula Country Club in round three.

Snedeker claims the sixth win of the 2014-15 PGA TOUR Season by a player in his 30s.

Snedeker's win marks his fourth top-10 finish in seven starts this season on the PGA TOUR.

Snedeker's win marks his 51st top-10 finish on the PGA TOUR, and 16th since 2013.

With his final-round, 5-under 67, Snedeker has now posted 25 of 27 rounds of par-or-better since the start of his season.

With the win, Snedeker becomes the seventh player since 2000 to come from behind in the final round to win the AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am. The last to do so was Phil Mickelson in 2012.

Through 13 events so far this season on the PGA TOUR, seven players have now come from behind after 54 holes to win.

Of Snedeker's seven PGA TOUR victories, four have now been in come-from-behind fashion.

With his win, Snedeker extends the stretch of American-born players to win the AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am to 11. The last international winner of the event was Vijay Singh in 2004.

Snedeker becomes the first 36-hole leader of the season to emerge victorious.

Nick Watney

Following back-to-back bogeys at Nos. 14 and 15 in the final round, Nick Watney finished strong with birdies at his last two holes to finish alone in second at 19-under 268. The finish marks his best result since finishing in the same position at the 2013 BMW Championship.

Watney was making his 12th consecutive start at this week's AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am, where he has now collected three top-10 finishes. Before this week, he took T7 honors in 2006 and finished T6 in 2011. Watney missed the cut in both 2013 and 2014.

Watney was making his eighth start of the season at this week's AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am and was coming off his previous-best finish with last week's T7 at the Farmers Insurance Open.

Watney has collected five wins on the PGA TOUR, and remains in search of his first since the 2012 Barclays.

Charlie Beljan

Despite a history of three missed cuts in as many starts at the AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am before this week, Charlie Beljan performed like a seasoned veteran, taking third-place honors, his best finish since a playoff loss at the 2013 Northern Trust Open.

Beljan posted an 8-under 63 at Monterey Peninsula Country Club in round two.

Prior to this week, Beljan had not enjoyed much success on the PGA TOUR this year. In seven previous starts, he has missed three cuts, withdrawn once (OHL Classic at Mayakoba) and finished no higher than T31 (Frys.com Open).

Beljan's 2013-14 PGA TOUR Season wasn't much better than the start he's off to this season. In 26 starts, he made just 12 cuts and claimed just one top-10 finish (T9/Humana Challenge). As a result, he finished outside the top-125 in FedExCup points (No. 130). By virtue of his 124th-place finish on the 2013-14 money list, he retained full-exempt status for the 2014-15 PGA TOUR Season.

Beljan was in search of his second career PGA TOUR win this week (2012 Children's Miracle Network Hospitals Classic).

Dustin Johnson

With a 6-under 66, 2009-2010 AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am champion Dustin Johnson made a solid, final-round run in his bid to become just the fifth player to win the event more than twice; Mark O'Meara (5), Phil Mickelson (4), Johnny Miller (3), Jack Nicklaus (3).

Johnson finished T4 at 17-under 270 (T4) in just his second start back on the PGA TOUR since missing the cut at the 2014 RBC Canadian Open. Johnson missed the cut at last week's Farmers Insurance Open.

Johnson is an eight-time winner on the PGA TOUR and was in search of his first win this week since the 2014-World Golf Championships-HSBC Champions.

Jason Day

Following his 9-under 62 at Monterey Peninsula Country Club in round two, the low round of the week, Jason Day was making his sixth start at the AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am. Previous top-10 finishes in the event are sixth-place honors in 2008 and 2013.

Day finished at 17-under 270 (T4). Had he won, Day would have become the first player to win in back-to-back weeks since Billy Horschel won the 2014 BMW Championship and TOUR Championship by Coca-Cola.

Had he won, he would have become the first Aussie champion of the AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am since Brett Ogle in 1993, and first international winner since Vijay Singh in 2004.

Jim Furyk

Jim Furyk was taking the lead/co-lead into a final round for the 24th time this week. Of them, he has converted for victory nine times, but is now zero for nine at converting a 54-hole lead/co-lead for a win. The last event in which he closed the deal was the 2010 TOUR Championship by Coca-Cola. In 2014, Furyk lost a three-stroke lead in the final round of the RBC Canadian Open, and could not convert at The Barclays with a share of the lead after 54 holes.

With today's final-round score, Furyk has now posted a 2-over 74 in three of his last five final rounds at Pebble Beach (2010, 2014 and 2015).

Even though today was not one of them, beginning with the final round of the 2014 U.S. Open, Furyk has now played 33 of his last 37 rounds on the PGA TOUR with sub-par scores.

Furyk was making his 19th start in the AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am this week, where he has now amassed four top-10 finishes and missed just two cuts (1999, 2011). His best finish in the event is a T3 in 1998.

Furyk was making his first start of the 2014-15 PGA TOUR Season this week, and is coming off a season highlighted by 11 top-10 finishes. Of them, four were runner-up showings.

Furyk, a 16-time winner on the PGA TOUR, was in search of his first win since the 2010 TOUR Championship by Coca-Cola. With that win, Furyk also claimed the FedExCup title.

Miscellaneous Notes

Defending champion Jimmy Walker closed with a 3-under 69 to finish a 13-under 274 (T21).

During Sunday's final round, Matt Bettencourt's caddie (and brother-in-law) Brian Rush fell on some rocks at No. 18 looking for his player's ball. He suffered a broken shoulder, a compound break in his forearm and concussion. Rush was replaced on the bag for the round's duration by Bettencourt's friend Carl Wesenberg from Modesto, Calif.
