493 different players have participated in 1 or more FedExCup seasons (and have been ranked) in the 8 year history of the FedExCup.

Just 30 players have managed to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs in each of the first 8 years.

Of those 30 players, 15 have advanced to the Deutsche Bank Championship every year.

Of those 15 players, 6 have advanced to the BMW Championship every year (Bubba Watson, Charley Hoffman, Jim Furyk, Phil Mickelson, Ernie Els and Hunter Mahan).

**Perfect Attendance in the FedExCup Playoffs (entering this week):** Hunter Mahan is the only player in the last 9 years of the FedExCup Playoffs to qualify for the TOUR Championship every year.

Mahan is also the only player to make all 34 starts in the Playoffs and has played in 129 of 135 possible FedExCup Playoff rounds (also the most).

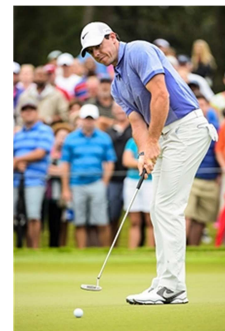

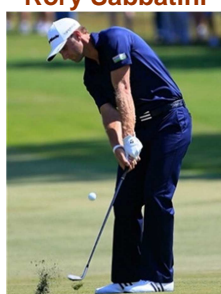

Billy Horschel finished a FedExCup Playoffs leading 34-under par en route to his FedExCup victory last season.

Tiger Woods is the only player who has lead the FedExCup Playoffs multiple times in this category.

**Lowest Ranked FedExCup Champion Entering Playoffs:** Billy Horschel entered the 2014 FedExCup Playoffs ranked 69<sup>th</sup> marking the lowest rank by a FedExCup Champion since the start of the FedExCup Playoffs in 2007 (next lowest ranked player was Brandt Snedeker in 2012 ranked 19<sup>th</sup>). Billy fell to the 80th position after missing the cut at The Barclays. After a change in his putting grip he completely turned around his game finishing T-2nd at the Deutsche Bank Championship moving to 20th in the FEC standings. He made a dramatic move into the top 5 with his victory at the BMW Championship. He then controlled his own destiny by winning the TOUR Championship by Coca-Cola and taking home the FedExCup trophy.

Last season, Horschel played his last 12 consecutive rounds in the 60's dating back to the opening round of the 2014 Deutsche Bank (longest streak in the history of the FedExCup Playoffs).

Jordan Spieth was not only the youngest player to participate in the TOUR Championship but he also became just the 6<sup>th</sup> PGA TOUR rookie to qualify (in the FedExCup Playoffs) and at 13<sup>th</sup> in the standings became the highest ranked rookie entering the TOUR Championship in the FedExCup era.

**Rickie Fowler** finished the 2010 FedExCup Playoffs ranked 32<sup>nd</sup> (best finish by 2010 Rookie). **Marc Leishman** was the only 2009 rookie to make it to the TOUR Championship (finished 20<sup>th</sup> in the standings). **Andres Romero** was the only rookie to advance to THE TOUR Championship in 2008, while **Brandt Snedeker** was the only rookie to advance in 2007. Snedeker, Romero, Leishman, Fowler, Bradley, Huh and Spieth all went on to win Rookie of the Year honors in each respective season. **Chesson Hadley** was the only Rookie in the FedExCup Playoffs and finished 49th in the standings.

**2014/15 Rookies:** Nine rookies have qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs this season. Currently 4 rookies remain entering the BMW Championship. Justin Thomas leads the way ranked 35<sup>th</sup> in the standings headed into the BMW Championship.

### Advancing from Outside the Cutline in 2 Consecutive Weeks

In 2009 and 2010, **Marc Leishman** and **Andres Romero** were the only 2 players to advance from outside the cut line in 2 consecutive weeks of the Playoffs. In 2009 **Leishman** entered the Deutsche Bank Championship outside the top 70 (93<sup>rd</sup>) moving to 67<sup>th</sup> with a T-15<sup>th</sup> finish. He then vaulted 51 spots, (from 67<sup>th</sup> to 16<sup>th</sup>) on a T-2<sup>nd</sup> finish at the BMW Championship advancing the TOUR Championship. In 2010, **Romero** began The Barclays outside the top 100 (115<sup>th</sup>) moving to 100<sup>th</sup> with a T-52<sup>nd</sup> finish. He then moved from 100<sup>th</sup> to 68<sup>th</sup> at the Deutsche Bank Championship with a T-11<sup>th</sup> finish.

In 2011 both **Ernie Els** and **Chris Stroud** were the only 2 players to advance from outside the cut line in 2 consecutive weeks of the 2011 FedExCup Playoffs. Els was the only player who entered the Wyndham Championship (was 126<sup>th</sup>) outside the top 125. Both Els and Stroud were eliminated at the BMW Championship.

**Geoff Ogilvy** was the only player to advance from outside the cut line in each of the last 2 weeks of the 2011 PLAYOFFS. Ogilvy began the Deutsche Bank ranked 91<sup>st</sup> and moved up to 69<sup>th</sup>. At the 2011 BMW Championship he moved from 69<sup>th</sup> to 24<sup>th</sup> with his solid final round performance. Ogilvy began his 2011 Playoff campaign ranked 79<sup>th</sup> and entered the TOUR Championship ranked 24<sup>th</sup> (lowest ranked entering the 2011 Playoffs to make the TOUR Championship).

In 2012 & 2013 no player advanced from outside the cutline in two consecutive weeks of the FedExCup Playoffs.

### Advancing from Outside the Cutline in 3 Consecutive Weeks

**2014: Morgan Hoffman** is the first player in the history of the FedExCup Playoffs to play his way from outside of the cut line in each of the first 3 FedExCup Playoff events. In the 8 year history of the Playoffs, 6 players have played their way from the outside in 2 consecutive weeks but Hoffman is the first to accomplish this feat in 3 consecutive weeks. Hoffman went onto finish T-27<sup>th</sup> at the TOUR Championship finishing a career best 26<sup>th</sup> in the FedExCup.

**The Odds of Advancing from Outside the Cut line in a FedExCup Playoff Event:** From 2009 to last season (current points structure), there have been 570 instances (based on various tiers) where a player has started outside cut line in a FedExCup Playoff event. In 91 of those 570 instances has a player been able to advance from outside the cut line in a given week (16% success rate). Just 6 players have advanced from outside the cut line in 2 consecutive weeks and Hoffman is the only player to advance from outside in 3 consecutive weeks.

In the 8 year history of the FedExCup, no player has made the TOUR Championship starting the Wyndham Championship outside the Playoffs cut line.

**2015:** 5 players advanced from outside the top 125 at the Wyndham Championship tying the record at this event under the current points structure.

**Biggest Move in Wyndham History:** With his win at the '15 Wyndham Davis Love III moved from 186<sup>th</sup> to 76<sup>th</sup> in the FedExCup standings (110 spots) marking the largest move up the standings in tournament history. Love III is the first player to move more than 100 spots in the standings at the Wyndham Championship.

The furthest any player has gone starting the Wyndham Championship outside the cut line since 2009 (new point structure) is **Ernie Els** in 2011. Els started the Wyndham Championship ranked 126<sup>th</sup> in the standings and went onto finish 67<sup>th</sup> in the standings in 2011.

Entering the 2009 Barclays, **Heath Slocum** ranked 124<sup>th</sup> in the standings. His victory vaulted him 121 spots to 3<sup>rd</sup> and secured a spot at the TOUR Championship (largest move in the 7 year history of the Playoffs).

Ranked 72<sup>nd</sup> entering the '07 FedExCup Playoffs, **Arron Oberholser** moved up to 34<sup>th</sup> thanks in part to a solid T-2<sup>nd</sup> at the '07 Deutsche Bank Championship.

**Camilo Villegas** vaulted up 28 spots in the '07 FedExCup Playoffs because of his 3 top 10's in his 4 starts.

**Camilo** was the lowest ranked player entering the '07 FedExCup Playoffs to make it to the TOUR Champ in '07 (started 52<sup>nd</sup>).

**Steve Stricker** entered the '07 FedExCup Playoffs ranked 12<sup>th</sup> and moved to 1<sup>st</sup> after his win at Barclays. He finished strong with 2 top 10's in his last 3 events but **Tiger Woods** took back the #1 spot with his win at the BMW Championship.
