Ryan Moore

Ryan Moore fired a final-round 5-under-par to post 17-under 271 and become the first player in tournament history to defend his title at the CIMB Classic. Moore finished regulation of the 2013 event at 14-under 274. Moore becomes the first person to successfully defend a title on TOUR since Tiger Woods at the Arnold Palmer Invitational (2012, 2013).

After a bogey on the par-4, 16th, hole Moore's lead was down to one. Moore bounced back with a birdie on the 17th hole when he hit his approach to a foot. Na recorded a double-bogey on that same hole and fell four strokes back.

With this victory Moore moves up to No. 4 in the FedExCup Standings.

Moore wins at 31 years, 10 months and 28 days making him the oldest winner of the early 2014-15 TOUR season.
