TPC Deere Run is an Audubon Certified Cooperative Sanctuary. The ACSP is an education and certification program that helps golf courses protect the environment and preserve the natural heritage of the game of golf.

Water conservation, management and/or controls:

TPC Deere Run utilizes an on-site weather station to water based on plant need. Singlehead controlled irrigation allows for site specific watering to conserve resources.
