## **Event History and Fact Sheet**

The 11th Presidents Cup will be contested at Jack Nicklaus Golf Club Korea in Songdo IBD in Incheon City, Korea. Korea becomes the first country in Asia to host The Presidents Cup. Nick Price will return as captain of the International Team, and Jay Haas, a three-time U.S. Team captain's assistant, will take the lead for the U.S. Team.

The first Presidents Cup was played September 16-18, 1994, at Robert Trent Jones Golf Club in Virginia, USA. The U.S. Team, captained by Hale Irwin, defeated the International Team, captained by David Graham, 20-12.

The United States also won the second Presidents Cup, held September 13-15, 1996, played again at Robert Trent Jones Golf Club. Arnold Palmer, no stranger to high-level international competition, had the reins as the United States edged Peter Thomson's International Team, 16-1/2 to 15-1/2. The U.S. Team was led by Mark O'Meara, who was the first player to go 5-0 in Presidents Cup history.

The Presidents Cup 1998 was played December 11-13 at Royal Melbourne Golf Club in Melbourne, Victoria, Australia. The International Team made the most of its home-field advantage, winning 20-1/2 to 11-1/2. Jack Nicklaus served as captain of the U.S. Team, while Thomson repeated his role as captain for the International Team. Japan's Shegeki Maruyama carried the International Team to its first victory with a perfect 5-0 performance.

In 2000, The Presidents Cup returned to Robert Trent Jones, with the United States avenging its 1998 loss with a decisive 21-1/2 to 10-1/2 victory over the International Team. Thomson captained the International Team for a third time, while Ken Venturi was victorious in his debut as U.S. Team captain.

The Presidents Cup 2003 was held at The Links at Fancourt Hotel and Country Club Estate in George, South Africa. The competition ended in a tie, after both teams completed regulation with 17 points. Ernie Els of the International Team and Tiger Woods of the U.S. Team were designated to represent their teams in a sudden-death playoff. After three playoff holes, and as darkness was descending, Captains Gary Player and Nicklaus, in the spirit of the competition, decided that the two teams would share the Cup.

In 2005, Nicklaus and Player returned as captains, and the matches were held once again at the Robert Trent Jones Golf Club. The tie from 2003 was broken with an 18-1/2 to 15-1/2 U.S. victory.

The U.S. Team wrapped up its fifth Presidents Cup victory in seven tries at The Royal Montreal Golf Club in 2007 with a 19-1/2 to 14-1/2 victory, the U.S. Team's first at an international venue in the competition's 13-year history, led once again by Nicklaus. David

Toms earned the most points for the U.S. Team, while Woody Austin earned a new nickname - Aquaman - after falling into the lake on hole 14 while attempting a shot. And while his team did not win, Canadian golf hero Mike Weir thrilled the crowds with a 1-up victory over World No. 1 Tiger Woods in Sunday's singles competition. Player captained the International Team for a third and final time.

In 2009, The Presidents Cup was held at TPC Harding Park in San Francisco, Calif., one of the top public golf properties in the United States. Two of the most dominant players on the PGA TOUR during the 1980s and 1990s, Fred Couples and Greg Norman led the U.S. and International Teams, respectively. The Presidents Cup 2009 marked the first time in event history that both captains were former participants. Couples has appeared four times (1994, 1996, 1998, 2005) for the United States and Norman three (1996, 1998, 2000) for the Internationals, and both factored prominently in victories secured by their respective teams. As first-time captains, Couples and Norman each led strong teams with the U.S. Team retaining the Cup, winning for the sixth time by a score of 19-1/2 to 14-1/2.

The ninth playing of the event occurred November 15-20, 2011, at The Royal Melbourne Golf Club in Melbourne, Victoria, Australia, which was the first international venue to host this prestigious competition more than once. The U.S. Team captured The Presidents Cup for the seventh time, led once again by Captain Couples and a 5-0-0 performance by veteran Jim Furyk. Tiger Woods clinched the Cup for the United States with a 4-and-3 win over Australia's Aaron Baddeley in Sunday Singles. For Woods, it was the second consecutive time he had scored the winning point at The Presidents Cup, becoming only the second player to accomplish that feat (Couples, 1994, 1996) and the first captain's pick to do so. Norman's International Team was outscored 8-3 in foursomes and eventually lost the Cup by four points (19-15).

In 2013, The Presidents Cup was played at Muirfield Village Golf Club in Dublin, Ohio, which became the first golf course to host the Ryder Cup, The Solheim Cup and The Presidents Cup. Nick Price, who owns the distinction of the captain with the most Presidents Cup experience as a player (five appearances) led the International Team, which was defeated by Couples' U.S. Team, 18-1/2 to 15-1/2, despite an impressive Sunday charge by the Internationals. Woods once again clinched the victory for the U.S. Team for the third straight time, becoming the first player in event history to accomplish that feat. Couples became the winningest captain in Presidents Cup history with a 3-0-0 record.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:	U.S. TEAM The top 10 U.S. players who earn the most official FedExCup points, beginning with the 2013 BMW Championship through the 2015 Deutsche Bank Championship, with points earned in 2015 doubled. Two captain's selections were made September 8, 2015.
	INTERNATIONAL TEAM The top 10 international players (excluding those eligible for the European Ryder Cup team) from the Official World Golf Ranking at the conclusion of the 2015 Deutsche Bank Championship, and two captain's selections made on September 8, 2015.
FORMAT:	<ul> <li>The Presidents Cup competition consists of 30 matches:</li> <li>Thursday – 5 foursome matches</li> <li>Friday – 5 four-ball</li> <li>Saturday morning – 4 foursome matches</li> <li>Saturday afternoon – 4 four-ball matches</li> <li>Sunday – 12 singles matches</li> <li>All matches are worth one point each, for a total of 30 points. There are no playoffs, with each side receiving a half point if a four-ball, foursomes or singles match is tied after 18 holes. In a change inspired by the events of The Presidents Cup 2003, if the match is deadlocked at the end of singles play, the competition will be deemed a tie and the teams will share The Presidents Cup.</li> </ul>
PURSE:	Unlike many other events, the players do not receive prize money based on performance. Instead, the PGA TOUR pledges to contribute to charities, which are nominated by the players, captains and captains' assistants from both teams.

TROPHY:	Created by Tiffany & Company, The Presidents Cup trophy weighs a total of 28 pounds. The trophy is spun by a spinner from five sterling silver circles into five different shapes. The spun components then are put together by a silversmith to create a cup. The smith runs a roller die to create the beaded embellishment that goes around the cup and the foot of the trophy. The oval logo is etched and applied on the cup. Labor dedicated to creating the trophy totaled 80 hours (spinning, smithing, finishing). The entire trophy is vermeil in 24-carat gold, and the original trophy is housed at the World Golf Hall of Fame in St. Augustine, Fla.

# **Glossary of Match-Play Terminology**

Team: The team is the entire 12 players and captain(s).

Match Play: Match Play is the game played by holes.

**Advice:** Any counsel or suggestion that could influence a player in determining his play, the choice of a club or the method of making a stroke. Each team may appoint one person who may give advice to members of that team. Such person must be identified to the Committee before giving advice.

**Side (not team):** A side is a player, or two or more players who are partners (Foursomes or Four-ball)

**Partner:** A partner is a player associated with another player on the same side.

**Opponent:** In match play it is never a competitor, always an opponent or player.

**Four-Ball (not Best Ball):** A Four-ball match is when two play their better ball against the better ball of two other players.

**Order of Play in Four-Ball:** The balls belonging to the same side may be played in the order the side considers best.

**Foursomes:** A Foursomes match is when two play against two, and each side plays one ball. Players alternate hitting tee shots.

**Singles (not individual):** A singles match is when one plays against another.

**Committee:** "The Committee" is the committee in charge of the competition.

**Referee:** The referee is one who is appointed by the committee to accompany players to decide questions of fact and apply the Rules. He shall act on any breach of a Rule that he observes or is reported to him. A referee's decision is final.

**Observer:** An observer is one who is appointed by the Committee to assist a referee to decide questions of fact and report to him any breach of a Rule.

**Honorary Observer:** An honorary observer is one who is appointed by the Committee to assist the observer.

**Reckoning of Hole (status of match):** Reckoning of holes is kept by the terms: so many "holes up," or "all square" and so many "holes to play."

**Halved Hole:** A hole is halved when each side holes out in the same number of strokes.

**All Square:** A match is all square when each side has won the same number of holes as the other side, or when each hole has been halved.

**Dormie:** A match is dormie when a side is as many holes up as there are holes remaining to be played.

**Concession of next stroke, hole or match (Rule 2-4):** When the opponent's ball is at rest or is deemed to be at rest under Rule 16-2, the player may concede the opponent to have holed out with his next stroke and the ball may be removed by either side with a club or otherwise. A player may concede a hole or a match at any time prior to the conclusion of the hole or the match. Concession of a stroke, hole or match may not be declined or withdrawn.

**Claims (Rule 2-5):** Any claim or dispute which arises between sides shall be made to the referee before any player in the match plays from the next teeing ground or, in the case of the last hole of the match, before all players in the match leave the putting green.

#### Practice (Rule 7) is allowed as follows:

- 1. Before or between rounds, a player or players may practice on the course.
- 2. During the round, a player shall not practice either during the play of a hole or between the play of two holes, except that, between play of two holes, the player may practice putting or chipping on or near the putting green of the last hole played, any practice putting green or the teeing ground of the next hole to be played in the round, provided such practice stroke is not played from a hazard and does not unduly delay play. Strokes played in continuing the play of a hole, the result in which has been decided, are not practice strokes.

Jay Haas is a nine-time winner on the PGA TOUR and a 17-time winner on the Champions Tour. He has been a captain's assistant in the last three editions of The Presidents Cup (with Fred Couples as captain) and played on two teams, in 1994 and 2003, compiling a 5-3-1 record.

After joining the PGA TOUR in 1977, Haas won his first title the following year at Torrey Pines in San Diego, in what is now known as the Farmers Insurance Open. Two wins followed in 1981 and he took home another double haul of titles in 1982. He won four more tournaments between 1987 and 1993 and remained competitive at the highest level before he joined the Champions Tour in 2005, with a top-10 finish in the 2003 PGA Championship and the 2004 U.S. Open.

On joining the Champions Tour, he won twice in October 2005 and then picked up four titles in 2006, including the Senior PGA Championship. He continued to rack up the victories with four more in 2007 and in 2008 he collected his second Champions Tour major at the Senior PGA Championship with a one-stroke win over Bernhard Langer. Another major followed in 2009 at the Constellation Senior PLAYERS Championship, and he won his 17th Champions Tour title last year at the Greater Hickory Kia Classic at Rock Barn.

Fred Couples was the victorious captain of the U.S. Team for the previous three editions of The Presidents Cup, the only 3-0 captain in event history, and he was a player four times in 1994, 1996, 1998 and 2005, during which he compiled a 9-5-2 record. This is his first stint as captain's assistant, trading places with his good friend Jay Haas, who served as Couples' assistant in 2009, 2011 and 2013.

Couples won the Masters Tournament in 1992 with a two-stroke victory over Raymond Floyd and captured THE PLAYERS Championship in 1984 and 1996. He was 1991 and 1992 PGA TOUR Player of the Year and Vardon Trophy winner. With 15 career PGA TOUR titles, 11 Champions Tour titles and two Champions Tour majors, he was inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame in 2013

In addition to his Presidents Cup pedigree, Couples competed on the U.S. Ryder Cup Team five times (1989, 1991, 1993, 1995, 1997), won the World Cup of Golf for the United States four times in succession from 1992 to 1995 and the Dunhill Cup at St. Andrews in 1993.

Davis Love III is a veteran of six Presidents Cups from 1994 to 2005, during which he compiled a 16-8-5 record. He also competed for the U.S. Ryder Cup Team six times and served as U.S. Team captain in 2012, a role he is reprising in 2016. Love served as one of Fred Couples' assistants for the 2013 Presidents Cup at Muirfield Village Golf Club, making this his second turn as captain's assistant

Love turned professional in 1985 and won his first TOUR title two years later at the RBC Heritage. He was a regular winner throughout the 1990s and won the 1992 PLAYERS Championship and the 1997 PGA Championship at Winged Foot GC. He won a second PLAYERS Championship in 2003 and posted 21 top 10s in the majors throughout his career. Earlier this year, Love won his 21st PGA TOUR title at the Wyndham Championship in his home state of North Carolina, at the age of 51. That victory made Love the third-oldest PGA TOUR winner in history, behind only Sam Snead and Art Wall, Jr.

Stricker is a five-time U.S. Team member of The Presidents Cup (1996, 2007, 2009, 2011, 2013) and holds a 14-10-0 record in the event. He also played on the U.S. Ryder Cup Team three times (2008, 2010, 2012).

Stricker, who will be eligible for the Champions Tour when he turns 50 in February 2017, is a 12-time PGA TOUR winner, most recently at the 2012 Hyundai Tournament of Champions. Stricker won his first TOUR titles in quick succession in 1996 at the Kemper Open and the Western Open. In 2001, he won the World Golf Championships—Accenture Match Play Championship but then had to wait six years for his next title, which came in 2007 at The Barclays - the first ever event in the newly launched FedExCup Playoffs. ### Jack Nicklaus Golf Club Korea

The Jack Nicklaus Golf Club Korea is a unique, urban golf course that offers views of modern high-rise buildings along with the peaceful natural scenery of the West Coast. It is situated close enough to the West Sea to enjoy gentle sea breezes and flocks of seagulls flying in the sky. Unlike most other inland golf clubs in Korea, bent grass is utilized in the fairways as well as the teeing grounds. The bent grass is green throughout the year, and will create an ideal playing surface for the best golfers in the world. A round of golf on this course is a unique experience.

Officially opened in 2010, the club has attracted international attention. Jack Nicklaus Golf Club Korea celebrated its opening with the Champions Tour's first official money/official victory event held in Asia. The course hosted the Songdo Championship in 2010 and

2011, and the 2012 Korea Women's Open on the KLPGA Tour. The Presidents Cup 2015 adds another chapter to Jack Nicklaus Golf Club Korea's already storied history.

The Songdo International Business District has recognized the importance of the Jack Nicklaus Golf Club Korea for economic development. The city is designed to facilitate global business and offers luxurious housing and international schools, as well as a wide range of cultural and leisure activities. The Jack Nicklaus Golf Club Korea has helped to further improve the quality of life in the Songdo International Business District and greatly contributes to attracting more international business personnel and investors to this city as their destination of choice.

### Hole 1

### Par 4 426 Yards, 390 Meters

The first hole is a 426-yard par 4 and from the tees offers views of the major components of the golf experience: a sweeping Songdo IBD skyline vista, dynamic topography, rock features and mature vegetation.

### Hole 2

### Par 4 424 Yards, 388 Meters

Players will be rewarded on this rather short par 4 with a simpler approach shot if the right fairway bunkering is challenged off the tee.

### Hole 3

### Par 5 591 Yards, 540 Meters

This long 591-yard par 5 has a slight left-to-right dogleg. Golfers should be at ease when facing a wide landing area.

### Hole 4

### Par 4 396 Yards, 362 Meters

The 396-yard par 4, with lush surroundings, plays along a lake enhanced with rock features and aquatic plants. A golfer playing away from the water feature will be faced with a longer approach into the green.

### Hole 5

### Par 3 170 Yards, 155 Meters

Creeks and waterfalls are created for both the strategy of this 170-yard, par-3 hole and the aesthetic enjoyment of visitors driving through the main entrance.

### Hole 6

### Par 4 481 Yards, 440 Meters

A minimum of 488 yards will be travelled from the back tee in order to reach this hole's elevated green. A friendly, left-side green approach offers golfers relief, if needed, to recover a stroke on this long par 4.

### Hole 7

### Par 5 560 Yards, 512 Meters

This 560-yard par 5 is reachable in two if played down the left side of the fairway. A strong drive is required, as well as an accurate shot into a green that is nestled alongside a lake.

### Hole 8

### Par 3 234 Yards, 214 Meters

The longest par 3 of Jack Nicklaus Golf Club Korea plays to 234 yards. The low area running between the tees and the green complex creates a dramatic look on this hole.

### Hole 9

### Par 4 429 Yards, 392 Meters

Golfers can choose to carry the fairway bunkers to catch the downhill slope on the 435-yard 9th hole and will be rewarded with a shorter approach into the green. The green sits along the lake's edge, defined by a rock wall.

### Hole 10

### Par 4 435 Yards, 398 Meters

The 435-yard starting hole on the back nine of the course greets golfers with tees set along a rock cliff from which they face a slight uphill shot. The fairway extends through a picturesque valley before leading to a green positioned at a lower elevation.

### Hole 11

### Par 4 423 Yards, 387 Meters

This 448-yard par 4 is a dogleg right with water that comes into play for both the tee shot and the approach. A landform splits the fairway and creates a number of playing options for golfers.

### Hole 12

### Par 4 463 Yards, 423 Meters

The taller fescue grasses come into play on this hole, which is highlighted with a natural, dune-style landscape unique to this section of the golf course. The 463-yard par 4 is framed with landforms on both sides of the fairway.

### Hole 13

### Par 3 207 Yards, 189 Meters

The par-3 13th hole at Jack Nicklaus Golf Club Korea plays to 207 yards and over water. The grassed collection areas on either side of the green are receptive to errant tee shots.

### Hole 14

### Par 4 361 Yards, 330 Meters

The focus of this 361-yard par 4 is the stream system running through the golf hole. The water feature runs down the center line of play, splitting the fairway in two. The left side fairway is then defined as a peninsula by the wetland plantings along the left side of the hole. From there, golfers are faced with an easier green approach, but they are challenged off the tee.

### Hole 15

### Par 5 572 Yards, 523 Meters

This 572-yard par 5 plays slightly downhill. A well-designed landscape directs the views toward the inside of the property where rock and water features dominate the eye. The twin 300-foot spires of Incheon Bridge are visible from this fairway.

### Hole 16 Par 4 477 Yards, 436 Meters

This is one of the longer par 4s at 477 yards. An approach to the right of the green should feed onto the putting surface.

### Hole 17


### Par 3 189 Yards, 173 Meters


The 189-yard par 3 requires a long carry over water. However, a generous fairway area should keep the golf ball in play.

### Hole 18 Par 5 542 Yards, 496 Meters

This 542-yard par 5 presents a dramatic finishing hole. The fairway gradually climbs toward the Clubhouse around a series of cascading ponds and tall rock cliffs.


