Match 15

Louis Oosthuizen/Branden Grace (International) vs. J.B. Holmes/Bubba Watson (U.S.), 3 and 2 -

Branden Grace chipped in for birdie on the 16th hole to give the International pair a 1-up advantage. Oosthuizen hit his approach within 8 feet at the 17th but missed the birdie attempt and the match went to the 18th hole where after seeing his partner's approach on the par 5 find the water, Grace went for the green in two and landed just off the edge. A routine up-and-down halved the hole and gave the South African's the 1-up victory. It was the first time in four matches that Grace and Oosthuizen reached the 17th or 18th holes.

Holmes and Watson were defeated despite being 8-under as a team as Oousthuizen and Grace shot 9-under as a team.

Oosthuizen and Grace won for the fourth consecutive day, making the South African pair the first International partnership to win all four group rounds and post a 4-0-0 record. Grace went winless in his first Presidents Cup appearance in 2013 (0-4-0).

The South African pair of Oosthuizen/Grace (4-0-0) is the only International Team pairing to play together in all four matches and they squared off against an undefeated twosome of Bubba Watson and J.B. Holmes who were the only U.S. team to be paired together for all four rounds.

In Presidents Cup history, the International Team has only had four players go undefeated:

1998- Shigeki Maruyama (5-0-0) and Steve Elkington (3-0-2) 2005- Retief Goosen (4-0-1) 2009- Vijay Singh (2-0-3)

Three players from the International Team could join that group tomorrow - Sangmoon Bae (2-0-1), Branden Grace (4-0-0) and Louis Oosthuizen (4-0-0).

Match 16

Phil Mickelson/Zach Johnson (U.S.) defeated Adam Scott/Anirban Lahiri (International), 3 and 2 – Phil Mickelson and Zach Johnson took the lead on the first hole and never looked back with a 3-and-2 victory in the afternoon Four-Ball. Mickelson and Johnson were paired together for all three matches in which they played (they both sat out the Day 3 Morning Foursomes).

Mickelson (2-0-1) has gone undefeated in two of his previous 10 Presidents Cup appearance: 2009, 4-0-1; 2005, 3-0-2. Johnson's best career record in three past Presidents Cup appearances is 3-1-0 in 2013.

By picking up a victory in both Four-Ball and foursome matches this week, Phil Mickelson is now tied for the most Four-Ball matches won (9, Vijay Singh) and foursome matches won (11, Tiger Woods) in tournament history. Mickelson's 22 total career matches won are second only to Tiger Woods (24).

Match 17

Sangmoon Bae/Hideki Matsuyama (International) defeated Jimmy Walker/Chris Kirk (U.S.), 6 and 5 After a halve against Matt Kuchar and Bill Haas in the morning foursomes, Korea's Sangmoon Bae and Japan's Hideki Matsuyama defeated Chris Kirk and Jimmy Walker 6 and 5. The victory in 13 holes is the shortest Four-Ball match since 2005 when Phil Mickelson/Chris DiMarco defeated Peter Lonard/Nick O'Hern in Day 3 Four-Ball. Two matches have been won in 12 holes marking the shortest matches in tournament history. This is the 15th match to end after 13 holes.

Bae is now undefeated with a 2-0-1 record in his first career appearance at a Presidents Cup. After sitting out the opening day foursomes, Bae sank an 11-foot eagle putt on the final hole during Day 2 Four-Ball to notch a 1-up victory with teammate Danny Lee over Rickie Fowler and Jimmy Walker. Bae and Matsuyama halved their Day 3 foursomes match against Bill Haas and Matt Kuchar.

With only singles play remaining, Bae could become one of six first-time Presidents Cup participants to avoid losing a match during their debuts:

Stewart Cink (4-0-0) and Kirk Triplett (3-0-1), 2000;

Shigeki Maruyama (5-0-0), 1998;

David Duval (4-0-0) and Mark O'Meara (5-0-0) in 1996.

Duval is the only one of the five who was a captain's pick (like Bae).

Match 18

Jordan Spieth/Patrick Reed (U.S.) defeated Jason Day/Charl Schwartzel (International), 3 and 2 – With birdies on holes 7,8, 9, 12, 13 and 14, Jordan Spieth took control of his match along with a birdie from teammate Patrick Reed at the 11th, and held on in near darkness to win on the 16th hole with a 3-and-2 victory. The win was the first of Reed's debut at The Presidents Cup.

Additionally, Spieth rallied with Dustin Johnson in the morning foursomes, winning three of the final five holes. Johnson made a 7-1/2 footer for birdie on 17 to square the match; Jason Day found the bunker off the tee on 18 and Schwartzel failed to advance it out of the bunker, leading to a bogey for the International Team. Spieth holed a 7-footer for par and the win.

At 0-3-1, Jason Day has yet to win a match this year for the International Team.
