# Environmental management/features

The Plantation Course is an Audubon Certified Cooperative Sanctuary. The ACSP is an education and certification program that helps golf courses protect the environment and preserve the natural heritage of the game of golf. Kapalua also completed the EPar environmental management system for golf courses.

### Water conservation, management and/or controls:

The Plantation Course uses evapotranspiration rates calculated from two weather stations positioned around the golf course to help determine watering schedules. Evapotranspiration, or ET, is a term describing the transport of water into the atmosphere from surfaces, including soil (soil evaporation), and

The course also performs quarterly irrigation audits to ensure the irrigation system is operating without error.

# Abnormal weather conditions/occurrences in the last 12 months that affected the course:

The course received 60 inches of rain in 2014, which is 20 inches above normal rainfall totals.
