Jason Day

With a final-round 8-under 62 (equaling the lowest score of his career and his lowest in a FedExCup Playoffs event), Jason Day finished The Barclays with a 72-hole total of 19-under 261, good for a six-stroke victory over Henrik Stenson.

Day's 62 is the lowest finishing score by a PGA TOUR winner this season, supplanting 63s posted by Jim Furyk (RBC Heritage), Robert Streb (The McGladrey Classic) and Jimmy Walker (Sony Open in Hawaii).

Day collects 2,000 points and moves from No. 2 to No. 1 in the FedExCup standings. Here's a look at his year-by-year results in the FedExCup: 2008 (83), 2009 (48), 2010 (8), 2011 (12), 2012 (87), 2013 (17), 2014 (10).

Today's victory guarantees Day a top-five spot heading into the TOUR Championship by Coca-Cola, meaning that he controls his own destiny at East Lake and will win the FedExCup with a victory there.

The victory is the sixth of Day's career and comes in his 168th PGA TOUR start at the age of 27 years, 9 months and 18 days.

Day's 36-hole score of 125 (63-62) over the weekend equals the lowest 36-hole score of the season (Jordan Spieth/R2-3/John Deere Classic; Jimmy Walker/R3-4/Sony Open in Hawaii).

With four wins, Day joins Jordan Spieth with the most wins on TOUR this season. Since 2010, the only players to record four or more wins in a season are Tiger Woods (2013, 5), Spieth (2015, 4), Day (4) and Rory McIlroy (2012, 4).

Day wins for the fourth time in 17 starts this season. Here's a look at his last six starts on TOUR:

Prior to Day this week, the only player since 2000 to win his next worldwide start after capturing his first major championship was Martin Kaymer, who captured the KLM Open following his win at Whistling Straits in 2010. Day also won his first major championship at the PGA Championship at Whistling Straits this year.

Day now owns nine top-10 finishes this season, one shy of equaling his career-best mark in 2011 (10). Today's victory marks the 45th top-10 finish of his career.

Dating to the first round of The Open Championship, and including all four rounds this week, Day has now posted his last 20 rounds at par-or-better (with 19 of those being under-par). During that stretch, he is a collective 73-under par.

Day becomes the 10th player to win both a Major Championship and FedExCup Playoffs event during their career and the fourth to do so in the same season:

Day wins in his eighth start at The Barclays, having never missed the cut and recording three top-10 finishes (1st-2015, T2-2014, T5-2010). The PGA Championship winner finished T13 the last time The Barclays was held at Plainfield Country Club in 2011.

Day becomes the 11th international winner of The Barclays and the fifth from Australia (Bruce Crampton/1970, David Graham/1976, Wayne Grady/1989, Adam Scott/2013, Jason Day/2015).

Largest winning margin on TOUR this season:

9 strokes – Jimmy Walker (Sony Open in Hawaii)

7 strokes – Rory McIlroy (Wells Fargo Championship)

6 strokes – Jason Day (The Barclays)

Largest winning margin in the FedExCup Playoffs:

6 strokes – Jason Day – 2015 The Barclays

5 strokes – Charley Hoffman (2010 Deutsche Bank Championship); Vijay Singh (2008 Deutsche Bank Championship).

This marks the third time (of nine) in which Day has converted a 54-hole lead/co-lead into victory: 2010 AT&T Byron Nelson, 2015 PGA Championship, 2015 The Barclays.

Day becomes the first 54-hole leader/co-leader to go on to win The Barclays since Steve Stricker in 2007. In total, 25 of 47 54-hole leaders have gone on to win The Barclays (does not include rain-shortened 1998 or 2011 events).

Day records the 18th win out of 43 stroke-play events by a 54-hole leader/co-leader this season.

Day records the 21st win by a player in his 20s this season, compared to 18 wins by players in their 30s, four victories by players in their 40s and one win by a player in his 50s (Davis Love III).

FedExCup Implications

One change was made to the Playoff points structure for 2014-15: Points are awarded 4X what they were during the PGA TOUR Season for a standard PGA TOUR event, with 2,000 points awarded to the winner. Over the last six years, points had been awarded 5X, with 2,500 awarded to the winner of each Playoff event.

It took 614 points to advance to next week’s Deutsche Bank Championship, with Jason Kokrak earning the final spot. Nick Taylor, who finished No. 101 in the standings by just one point, missed a 7-foot birdie putt on the final hole that would have moved him inside the top 100 and bumped Kokrak out.

Eight players moved into the top 100 this week and played their way into the Deutsche Bank Championship: Zac Blair (from No. 106 to No. 45), Spencer Levin (from No. 115 to No. 80), Jason Dufner (from No. 103 to No. 82), Carlos Ortiz (from No. 112 to No. 83), Mark Wilson (from No. 114 to No. 85), Luke Donald (from No. 119 to No. 87), Johnson Wagner (from No. 101 to No. 92) and Camilo Villegas (from No. 123 to No. 99).

Players ranked between No. 101-125 entering the week needed a good finish at The Barclays to move into the top 100 in the standings to move on to the Deutsche Bank Championship. Here’s how they fared this week:

Eight players dropped out of the top 100 this week and are eliminated from the FedExCup Playoffs: Padraig Harrington (from No. 87 to No. 103), Greg Owen (from No. 90 to No. 104), John Peterson (from No. 93 to No. 105), Adam Scott (from No. 94 to No. 106), Adam Hadwin (from No. 95 to No. 107), Charl Schwartzel (from No. 96 to No. 108), John Huh (from No. 97 to No. 110) and Francesco Molinari (from No. 99 to No. 111).

Camilo Villegas has now played his way into the Deutsche Bank Championship from outside the top 100 three times (2011, 2013, 2015). He also played his way into this week's event last week at the Wyndham Championship (from No. 129 to No. 123).

Brian Harman

Playing in the final round of The Barclays today, Brian Harman became the first player since Yusaku Miyazato in 2006 with two aces in one round on the PGA TOUR. The former University of Georgia Bulldog aced the par-3 third hole with a 7-iron from 183 yards and the par-3 14th hole with a 4-iron from 218 yards.

Here’s a list of players with two aces in one round on the PGA TOUR:

- 1955 Insurance City Open (R1) – W.W. “Bill” Whedon (amateur)
- 2006 Barracuda Championship (R2) – Yusaku Miyazato
- 2015 The Barclays (R4) – Brian Harman

Harman’s aces are the 40th and 41st of the season on the PGA TOUR.

Harman concluded the final round with a 2-under 68, finishing 2-under for the tournament as well (T30). He is now No. 62 in the FedExCup standings.

Additional Player Notes

2013 FedExCup champion Henrik Stenson finished solo second and will enter the Deutsche Bank Championship No. 4 in the FedExCup. This week marked the fifth runner-up finish in 140 PGA TOUR starts for Stenson, with his most recent coming earlier this season at the Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by MasterCard.

One day after seeing his bogey-free streak end at 44 holes on the 18th hole (the longest such streak at The Barclays since Bob Tway’s streak of 43 holes in 1986), Open Championship winner Zach Johnson added two



additional bogeys on the first two holes Sunday en route to a 1-under 69 (T4). Including his win at the 2013 BMW Championship, Johnson now has six top-10 finishes in the Playoffs, with this week's T4 finish his first top 10 at either The Barclays or Deutsche Bank Championship.

Bubba Watson finished solo third for his eighth top-10 finish of the season, equaling the most of his career (2014). Watson is No. 3 in the FedExCup standings heading into the Deutsche Bank Championship, maintaining his career-best position in the season-long competition. This week marked Watson's fourth top-15 finish in 10 starts at The Barclays: 3-2015, T10-2012, T12-2008, T13-2013.

Sangmoon Bae, who entered the final round sharing the lead with Jason Day, struggled to a 2-over 72. Following his T6 finish, he'll head to the Deutsche Bank Championship No. 23 in the FedExCup standings. Bae falls to one for two when holding at least a share of the lead heading into the final round of a TOUR event (having won the Frys.com Open earlier this season).

Jim Furyk finished T11 for his 26th top-25 finish in 30 starts in FedExCup Playoffs events.

Dustin Johnson, who won the weather-shortened Barclays at Plainfield Country Club in 2011, finished T9.

In his bid to join Ernie Els as players to win in successive years (1996-1997), defending champion Hunter Mahan missed the cut this week, just his third missed cut in 33 FedExCup Playoff events. Mahan will enter the Deutsche Bank Championship No. 91 in the standings and will have work to do to maintain his title as the only player to qualify for/play in every Playoffs event (only the top 70 advance to the BMW Championship).
