

## 2015 The Barclays

### Broadcast Window & Pre-Tournament Notes

The Barclays serves as the kickoff to the FedExCup Playoffs– the entire season has built to this four-tournament stretch. There is more on the line than just The Barclays trophy – players in the top half of the 125 will be looking to move up, jockeying for the coveted top-five position heading to the TOUR Championship by Coca-Cola; those near the bottom need enough points to survive to the next week at the Deutsche Bank Championship (100). The top 125 players on the FedExCup points list qualify for The Barclays.

### Potential #1 Scenario's at The Barclays

**Only 2 Players can Move to #1:** Only 2 players in the field are currently within 2,000 points of the #1 ranked Jordan Spieth and can in turn potentially move to #1 with a victory this week. Jason Day & Bubba Watson is the only two players that can possibly overtake the #1 position this week. The 125<sup>th</sup> position currently owned by Jeff Overton is currently 3,711 points behind first place and could move as high as 3<sup>rd</sup> with a victory. This is the smallest number of players who have a chance of becoming #1 since the 2009 FedExCup Playoffs where the points structure changed (2014 All Players had a chance to move to #1, 2013- 84 players, 2012 All, 2011 All, 2010 All, 2009- 32 players).

### Moving Week at The Barclays

This is the first week where point values are quadrupled (4x their Regular Season value). Prior to this week event winners would receive 500 points (regular events) where now they will receive 2000 points. That being said, The Barclays has traditionally served as the greatest opportunity to make large moves in the FedExCup standings.

Entering the 2009 Barclays, **Heath Slocum** ranked 124<sup>th</sup> in the standings. His victory vaulted him 121 spots to 3<sup>rd</sup> and secured a spot at the TOUR Championship (largest move in the 7 year history of the FedExCup Playoffs).

Last Season, 4 of the 9 all-time biggest moves in the FedExCup Playoffs were made. Stuart Appleby made the biggest move at The Barclays going from 98<sup>th</sup> to 19<sup>th</sup> with his T-2<sup>nd</sup> place finish.

1 first-timer currently ranks inside the top 30 of the standings entering this week. **Brooks Koepka (12<sup>th</sup>)** currently ranks inside the top 30 of the standings based on his play this season. Brooks Koepka has the T-4<sup>th</sup> most weeks ranked inside the top 30 this season (Hideki Matsuyama has the most with 39).

PGA TOUR rookies **Justin Thomas (36<sup>th</sup>) & Tony Finau (39<sup>th</sup>)** are the two highest ranked rookies out of 9 currently inside the top 125 of the standings entering the Barclays. **Keegan Bradley** holds the record as the highest ranked rookie in the 9 year history entering the Playoffs (was 5<sup>th</sup> entering 2011 FedExCup Playoffs).

**9<sup>th</sup> Year Qualifying for FedExCup Playoffs:** 22 of the top 125 players entering this week have qualified for all 9 seasons of the FedExCup Playoffs (*21 are in the field – Garcia not playing*). 2 of the top 10 players in the current standings have participated in all 9 FedExCup Playoff seasons.

### Jordan Spieth (1), Jason Day (2), & Bubba Watson (3)

Current FedExCup leader **Jordan Spieth** has led the standings for the last 20 weeks of the FedExCup season thanks to 4 wins in his last 15 starts on TOUR. Jordan moved from 2<sup>nd</sup> to 1<sup>st</sup> in the standings after his Playoff loss to J.B. Holmes at the Shell Houston Open. Spieth is looking to become the first #1 seed entering the FedExCup Playoffs to go onto to win the FedExCup since Tiger Woods in 2009.

Jordan is coming off a solo 2<sup>nd</sup> place finish at the PGA Championship setting the record for most under par in majors (-54) since Tiger Woods -53 in the 2000 PGA TOUR season.

**Jason day (#2)** moved from 4<sup>th</sup> to 2<sup>nd</sup> in the FedExCup standings with his victory at the 2015 PGA Championship. Day became the first player in major championship history to finish the week at 20-under par.

The 2015 PGA Championship marked the first time in Day's PGA TOUR career where he outperformed the field by more than 4 strokes per round from tee-to-green.

**Bubba Watson (#3)** is the highest ranked player (2<sup>nd</sup> year in a row) entering the FedExCup Playoffs who has qualified for all 9 years of the Playoffs. Bubba starts the 2015 FedExCup Playoffs in the same position as he did last season in the 3<sup>rd</sup> position (finished 5<sup>th</sup> in 2014) looking to make it back to the TOUR Championship for the 6<sup>th</sup> time in his career.

**Jimmy Walker (#4)** two-time Champion in the 2014-15 PGA TOUR season, Jimmy Walker (Sony Open & Valero Texas Open) enters the FedExCup Playoffs inside the top 5 for the second consecutive season. Walker makes his 6<sup>th</sup> straight FEC Playoff appearance finishing a career high 7<sup>th</sup> last season. In the last 2 FedExCup regular seasons, Jimmy Walker has the most weeks ranked 1<sup>st</sup> in the standings with a combined total of 48 weeks.

Justin Rose is approaching his 400<sup>th</sup> career birdie in the 8 year history of the FedExCup Playoffs. Only 6 players have over 400 birdies in their respective FedExCup Playoff careers.
