Environmental management/features

East Lake Golf Club has a fully automated and computerized irrigation system and the entire property drains to the irrigation source.

Water conservation, management and/or controls:

East Lake has installed over 100,000 linear feet of drainage pipe, upgraded irrigation sprinkler heads and piping around green complexes, upgraded control systems and implemented moisture meters on greens, and to some degree tees and fairways, to help control water use. The club has also created best management practices for water usage that are followed during periods of drought.

Unusual wildlife on the course

Coyote; Owls; Blue heron; Red-tail hawk

Predominate species of trees on course:

White and red oak; Red and sugar maple; Loblolly pine; Dogwood; Red bud

Interesting notes about the course:

With construction beginning in 1904, East Lake Golf Club is the oldest golf course in Atlanta. East Lake was the home course of Robert Tyre "Bobby" Jones, who learned to play at East Lake and played his last round of golf there on Aug. 14, 1948.

Comments overheard about the course:

"Everything is right out in front of you - no tricks, just straight-up golf."

The staff also frequently hear from golfers that the course looks easier than it plays.
