

# 2015 World Golf Championships-Cadillac Match Play

(The 25<sup>th</sup> of 43 events in the PGA TOUR Season)

San Francisco, Calif. April 27-May 3, 2015 Purse: \$9,250,000 (\$1,570,000 to the winner)

Championship Match - Match 112: Rory McIlroy (1) defeated Gary Woodland (50), 4 and 2

#### **Rory McIlroy**

McIlroy defeat Gary Woodland, 4 and 2, in the Championship Match at the Cadillac Match Play to go undefeated (7-0) in his matches this week at TPC Harding Park in San Francisco.

McIlroy earns his 10th PGA TOUR victory in his 92<sup>nd</sup> start at the age of 25 years, 11 months, 29 days.

McIlroy joins Tiger Woods (29) and Jack Nicklaus (17) as the only players to win 10 events prior to their 26th birthday on the PGA TOUR in the last 75 years.

McIlroy won his first event on TOUR on May 2 at the 2010 Wells Fargo Championship, he wins the 2015 Cadillac Match Play on May 3, 2015 and his birthday is May 4.

McIlroy earns 550 FedExCup points with the win and moves to No. 19 in the FedExCup standings.

McIlroy's 10 PGA TOUR wins: 2010 Wells Fargo Championship, 2011 U.S. Open, 2012 The Honda Classic, 2012 PGA Championship, 2012 Deutsche Bank Championship, 2012 BMW Championship, 2014 The Open Championship, 2014 WGC-Bridgestone Invitational, 2014 PGA Championship, 2015 Cadillac Match Play.

McIlroy is the ninth player with at least two career World Golf Championships victories (2014 Bridgestone Invitational and 2015 Cadillac Match Play). Players with multiple World Golf Championships wins include Tiger Woods (18), Geoff Ogilvy (3), Darren Clarke (2), Ernie Els (2), Hunter Mahan (2), Phil Mickelson (2), Ian Poulter (2), Dustin Johnson (2).

At 25 years, 11 months, 29 days, McIlroy is the youngest winner of the Cadillac Match Play and the sixth youngest in the history of the World Golf Championships series:

McIlroy is the second player to win the Cadillac Match Play as a No. 1 seed. Tiger Woods won the tournament three times (2008, 2004 and 2003) as the No. 1 seed.

McIlroy wins in his seventh career start in the Cadillac Match Play. He made his 24<sup>th</sup> career start in a World Golf Championships event.

McIlroy lost to Hunter Mahan (2 and 1) in the Championship Match at the 2012 Cadillac Match Play.

#### **Gary Woodland**

Woodland records his second runner-up finish of the season (T2/CIMB Classic). He also finished T3 at the Sony Open in Hawaii. He moves to No. 20 in the current FedExCup standings.

Woodland was looking for his third PGA TOUR victory in his 136th start at the age of 30 years, 11 months, 12 days.

Woodland was looking to notch a win in three different scoring formats on TOUR: match play, Modified Stableford and stroke play. Woodland's PGA TOUR wins: 2011 Valspar Championship (stroke play) and 2013 Reno-Tahoe Open (Modified Stableford).

In his previous two attempts at the Cadillac Match Play (2012 and 2014), Woodland failed to advance beyond the first round.

Woodland birdied the par-5 first hole in six of his seven matches (did not birdie it in the semi-final). He also birdied the first hole as the 19<sup>th</sup> hole during a playoff with Jimmy Walker.

As the 50<sup>th</sup> seed, Woodland would have been the fourth-lowest seed to win the Cadillac Match Play. Below are the highest seeds to win the Cadillac Match Play:

#### Consolation Match - Match 110: Danny Willet (48) defeated Jim Furyk (5), 3 and 2

#### **Danny Willet**

Willet defeated Jim Furyk in the Consolation Match to finish third in his first-'ever start in the Cadillac Match Play. Willet had to finish third or better this week to earn enough FedExCup points to take up Special Temporary Membership on the PGA TOUR.

Willet is not a member of the PGA TOUR, but can take up Special Temporary Membership for the remainder of the 2014-15. He has earned more than the player that finished No. 150 on the 2013-14 FedExCup points list (323/Johnson Wagner). If he accepts STM, he will be eligible for unlimited sponsor exemptions for the remainder of the 2014-15 season in his attempt to earn his 2015-16 TOUR card. He has 60 days to accept STM.

Willet had 131 non-member FedExCup points entering this week and earned 200 points by finishing third (200 pts) to take his season total to 331 points. Willet is the first player this season to earn enough points for STM.

The 27-year-old Willet has two career wins on the European Tour (2012 BMW International Open, 2015 Nedbank Golf Challenge). He is currently ranked No. 2 in the European Tour's Race to Dubai Standings behind Rory McIlroy.

## Jim Furyk

Jim Furyk finishes fourth in the Cadillac Match Play to notch his best finish in his 15<sup>th</sup> start in the event.

Last year, Furyk lost to Rickie Fowler, 1-down in the quarterfinals (T5).

Furyk's win at the RBC Heritage in his last start was his 17<sup>th</sup> career PGA TOUR win and his first since winning the 2010 TOUR Championship by Coca-Cola.
