Weather

Partly cloudy, with a high of 89 degrees. Winds W/SW 5-10 mph. Round three resumed at 7:30 a.m. and ended at 11:24 a.m. CT. Due to morning fog, round three was suspended from 7:52 a.m. until 7:59 a.m. CT. Players remained in place on the course.

Players were not re-paired between the third and final rounds. The last time the entire field finished the third and final round on the same day was at the 2014 FedEx St. Jude Classic.

This week marked the eighth event of the 2014-15 PGA TOUR Season to experience a delay/suspension. Of the previous seven, three were related to inclement weather (as opposed to darkness).

Due to wet conditions, preferred lies in closely-mown areas are in effect for all four rounds.

Justin Rose

Zurich Ambassador Justin Rose recorded rounds of 69-66-65-66 this week at the Zurich Classic of New Orleans for a 72-hole total of 22-under 266, good for a one-stroke victory over Cameron Tringale.

Rose's winning score of 266 is the lowest at the Zurich Classic since Vijay Singh posted the same score in 2004.

A 13'6" inch putt on the 72nd hole capped off a birdie-birdie finish to secure Rose's seventh PGA TOUR victory. He played the final 66 holes this week without a bogey.

Rose records his seventh career PGA TOUR in his 257th start:

Rose has at least one PGA TOUR victory in six consecutive seasons (2010-2015), second only to Dustin Johnson's current total of eight straight seasons with a victory (2008-2015).

Rose earns 500 FedExCup points to move up from No. 82 to No. 15 in the FedExCup standings.

Rose wins at the age of 34 years, 8 months and 27 days. He is the 11th player (12 wins) in his 30s to win on TOUR this season, compared to eight winners (nine wins) in their 20s and three in their 40s.

Rose wins in his seventh-consecutive start in the Zurich Classic and 10th overall. His previous-best finish was T5 in his inaugural start in 2004. He now owns a streak of four-consecutive top-15 finishes at TPC Louisiana (T10-2012, T15-2013, T8-2014, Won-2015).

He has now extended his string of consecutive, sub-par scores at TPC Louisiana to 16. Dating to 2012, Rose is now 60-under-par at TPC Louisiana.

Rose wins in his eighth start of the 2014-15 PGA TOUR Season and two weeks after a T2 finish at the Masters.

Rose has held a 54-hole lead/co-lead 10 times, winning the 2015 Zurich Classic, 2011 BMW Championship and 2010 Quicken Loans National.

Rose is the second-consecutive international winner of the Zurich Classic (Seung-Yul Noh/2014). Prior to that, Americans had won five straight at this event.

Third-Round Lead Notes

The third-round leader/co-leader of the Zurich Classic has won six of the past seven times: (Jerry Kelly/2009, Jason Bohn/2010, Bubba Watson/2011, Jason Dufner/2012, Seung-Yul Noh/2014, Justin Rose/2015).

Eight of 24 third-round leaders on the PGA TOUR this season have been able to convert for the win. Prior to Rose's win this week, the most recent to do so was Jordan Spieth at the Masters Tournament.

During today's final round of the Zurich Classic of New Orleans, D.H. Lee aced the 17th hole with a 4-hybrid from 210 yards. As the Official Mortgage Sponsor of the PGA TOUR, Quicken Loans will award one year's worth of mortgage payments to a registered sweepstakes participant to commemorate the ace. The Quicken Loans' Hole-In-One Sweepstakes awards one year's worth of mortgage payments to a randomly selected entrant for every ace during official PGA TOUR events from the Waste Management Phoenix Open through the TOUR Championship by Coca-Cola. Lee's ace was the 22nd of the season on the PGA TOUR. It was his first on the PGA TOUR.

Miscellaneous Notes

Cameron Tringale finished runner-up this week, equaling his career-best finish in 152 TOUR starts (T2 at the 2014 Barclays). This week marked his fourth top-20 finish in six starts at the Zurich Classic.

Boo Weekley, who shared the opening-round lead this week with an 8-under 64, finished third in his eighth start at the Zurich Classic of New Orleans. His previous-best finish was T6 in 2013.

Jim Herman (T4) posted four rounds in the 60s for just the second time in 80 PGA TOUR starts (2013 John Deere Classic/T10). This week's career-best finish was his fourth-career top 10, topping his previous best mark of T7 at the 2015 Honda Classic.

Jason Day, who shared the third-round lead with Justin Rose, carded final-round 3-under 69 to finish T4. This week marked his third start in New Orleans (MC-2008, T32-2009, T4-2015). Day has held a 54-hole lead/co-lead five times on the PGA TOUR, with his lone victory in those events coming at the 2010 AT&T Byron Nelson Championship.

Chad Campbell finished T8 for his first top-10 finish since a T7 at the 2014 Valspar Championship. Scott Stallings (T22) equaled the best birdie streak on the PGA TOUR this season, with seven birdies in a row on Nos. 2-8. The feat has now occurred five times this season, most recently by James Hahn in the final round of the Humana Challenge in partnership with the Clinton Foundation.

There were eight past Zurich Classic of New Orleans winners in this week's field: Jerry Kelly/2009 (T22), K.J. Choi/2002 (T36), Billy Horschel/2013 (T48), David Toms/2001 (69), Jason Bohn/2010 (MC), Andres Romero/2008 (MC), Nick Watney/ 2007 (MC) and Seung-Yul Noh/2014 (WD).

The Zurich Classic of New Orleans is the penultimate PGA TOUR event for players, not previously eligible, to earn a start in THE PLAYERS in one of three ways: 1) moving into the top 50 in the Official World Golf Ranking; 2) winning the Zurich Classic of New Orleans; and 3) moving into the top 10 in the FedExCup standings.

The Zurich Classic has now seen its champion determined by one stroke or a playoff 10 times since 2003.
