Chez Reavie (8-under-par 63, MP)

Former RBC Canadian Open winner Chez Reavie returned to the PGA TOUR in 2015-16 after winning the Small Business Connection at River Run during the 2015 Web.com Tour Finals where he was the leading money-winner over the four events. Reavie played in 19 events last year on the PGA TOUR on a medical extension, due to a wrist injury that required surgery in 2014 that limited him to just two events during the 2013-14 season.

Reavie, 85th in the FedExCup standings, is playing in his ninth event of the 2015-16 PGA TOUR Season. His best finishes to date were T17 at both the Frys.com Open and CareerBuilder Challenge.

Reavie was 5-under-par on the four par-5s on Thursday at Monterey Peninsula.

Reavie's round of 63 included seven birdies, an eagle (No. 16) and one bogey (No. 9). He posted a back-nine score of 7-under-par 30. The course record at MP is 61 by Charlie Wi in 2012.

The Arizona State graduate has made just two cuts in six previous AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am starts, with a T56 in 2010 being his best result to date in the event.

Cameron Smith (7-under-par 64, MP)

Australian Cameron Smith, 22, who earned his TOUR card via the non-member money list for 2015-16, is the second-youngest player on TOUR (Si Woo Kim). Smith is best-known for his T4 finish at the 2015 U.S. Open at Chambers Bay.

Freddie Jacobson (7-under-par 65, PB)

Freddie Jacobson started the season on a Major Medical Extension (Family Crisis clause) as his 2014-15 season was limited to 14 starts due to the diagnosis and subsequent open-heart surgery for his 7-year-old son Max last August 3. With two top-10s in seven starts (5th at RSM Classic, T4 at Farmers Insurance Open), the 2011 Travelers Championship winner sits 29th in the FedExCup standings and has successfully regained his top 125 status with \$653,686 and 321 FedExCup points to date.

Jacobson's 7-under 65 at Pebble Beach Golf Links was 7.06 shots better than the field average, the best margin of any player on Thursday.

Bronson Burgoon (7-under-par 64, MP)

Rookie Bronson Burgoon is playing in just his 11th career PGA TOUR event this week. This season, Burgoon has made five cuts in eight starts and sits 114th in the FedExCup standings. A 2015 graduate of the Web.com Tour, Burgoon's best career finish to date is T20 at the 2015 Sanderson Farms Championship.

Additional player notes

World No. 1 and reigning FedExCup champion Jordan Spieth posted a 1-under-par 71 at Spyglass Hill on Thursday. Spieth scattered three bogeys to go along with four birdies. He's making his fourth career start at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, having finished in the top 10 each of the last two years. For the round, Spieth hit 9-of-14 fairways and 10-of-18 greens in regulation with a total of 27 putts.

Jason Day, winner of five events last year, opened his week with a 1-under-par 71 at Spyglass Hill. Day missed the cut in his title defense two weeks ago at the Farmers Insurance Open, where he was under the weather most of the week and was forced to withdraw from the Wednesday Pro-Am. He opened with an even-par 72 at Pebble Beach last year on the way to a T4 finish.

Justin Rose, one of six players among the top 10 in the Official World Golf Ranking in the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am field, posted a 6-under-par 66 at Spyglass Hill. Rose has the second-longest streak of consecutive seasons with PGA TOUR wins with six, two shy of Dustin Johnson's streak of eight.

Two 'locals' are inside the top 10 through 18 holes – Ricky Barnes (T5) of Stockton and Spencer Levin (T5) of Sacramento.

Four players birdied all four par-5s played on the day: Kevin Chappell (MP), Dustin Johnson (SH), Phil Mickelson (SH), Sean O'Hair (MP) and Chez Reavie (MP). Chappell and Reavie played the four par-5s at Monterey Peninsula Country Club in 5-under on the day.

J.B. Holmes, T5 after a 6-under-par 66 at Spyglass Hill, was the first-round co-leader at last year's AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am before ultimately finishing T10.

Defending champion Brandt Snedeker, currently second in the FedExCup standings, recorded an even-par round of 72 at Spyglass Hill.

After missing the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am for the first time in 19 years last year, Phil Mickelson returned with a first-round 4-under-par 68 at Spyglass Hill. Mickelson is a four-time winner of the event, most recently in 2012.

Seven players inside the top 10 are searching for their first PGA TOUR win – Cameron Smith, Bronson Burgoon, Dawie van der Walt, Roberto Castro, Ricky Barnes, Shane Bertsch and Spencer Levin. There have been just six players since 1970 to earn his first win at this event, joining John Cook (1981), Steve Jones (1988), Brett Ogle (1993), Matt Gogel (2002), Arron Oberholser (2006) and D.A. Points (2011).

Since 2000, the first-round leader/co-leader of the AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am has held on for the win just five times; D.A. Points (2011), Dustin Johnson (2009, 2010) and Phil Mickelson (2005, 2007).
