Final-Round Notes - Monday, November 9, 2015

Weather: Mostly cloudy with a high of 66 degrees. NNW winds 5-10 mph.

All 74 players were back in position at 7 a.m. CT to complete round three, which ended at 9:54 a.m. Without being re-paired, players began the final round at 8:20 a.m., with the last group teeing off at 10:26 a.m.

The last unscheduled Monday finish on the PGA TOUR was the 2015 Open Championship.

Peter Malnati

University of Missouri's Peter Malnati made 495'7" of putts this week (110'1"/R1, 127'2"/R2, 132'11"/R3, 125'5"/R4) en route to winning the Sanderson Farms Championship by one stroke over David Toms and William McGirt. The PGA TOUR record for most feet of putts made in an event belongs to Ben Martin, who sank 551'2" at the 2015 Colonial National Invitation Tournament.

Malnati claims his first career PGA TOUR victory in his 22nd start at the age of 28 years, 4 months and 27 days.

With his win, Malnati moves to No. 8 in the FedExCup standings with 313 points. It took 458 points to qualify for the PGA TOUR Playoffs for the FedExCup in 2014-15, 554 to qualify for Deutsche Bank Championship, 692 for BMW Championship and 1,062 for the TOUR Championship by Coca-Cola.

If not otherwise exempt, Malnati earns a spot into the following PGA TOUR events in 2016: Hyundai Tournament of Champions, CareerBuilder Challenge, Arnold Palmer Invitational, RBC Heritage, PLAYERS Championship, Colonial National Invitation Tournament, the Memorial Tournament, Quicken Loans National and PGA Championship.

Malnati becomes the eighth player to make the Sanderson Farms Championship his first career PGA TOUR win; Nick Taylor (2014-15), Chris Kirk (2011), D.J. Trahan (2006), Luke Donald (2002), Cameron Beckman (2001), Willie Wood (1996), Ed Dougherty (1995) and Brian Henninger (1994).

Malnati becomes the fifth consecutive, first-time winner of the 2015-16 PGA TOUR Season, joining Emiliano Grillo (Frys.com Open), Smylie Kaufman (Shriners Hospitals for Children Open), Justin Thomas (CIMB Classic) and Russell Knox (World Golf Championships-HSBC Champions).

The last time the PGA TOUR produced five straight first-time winners was in 2002 and the Sanderson Farms Championship was the site of the fifth winner: Charles Howell III (Michelob Championship at Kingsmill), Phil Tataurangi (Shriners Hospitals for Children Open), Bob Burns (Disney Golf Classic), Jonathan Byrd (Buick Challenge) and Luke Donald (Sanderson Farms Championship).

Of the five PGA TOUR winners to start the 2015-16 season, all five are Web.com Tour alums, three of whom just graduated this past season (Emiliano Grillo, Smylie Kaufman and Malnati).

Malnati made his way back to the PGA TOUR this season by virtue of his ninth-place finish on the 2015 Web.com Tour priority list.

On the Web.com Tour last season, Malnati claimed five top-10 finishes, highlighted by his second Web.com Tour win at the Brasil Champions. Malnati fired a 9-under 62 in round two to propel him on to a four-stroke win over seven others.

Prior to this week, Malnati missed the cut at the Frys.com Open and finished T56 at the Shriners Hospitals for Children Open two weeks ago.

Malnati's previous-best finish is a T14 at the 2014 Puerto Rico Open.

Third-Round Lead Notes

Since 1990 - when the event was neither cancelled nor condensed in rounds, the 54-hole leader has held on for the win 10 times, including 2012 (Scott Stallings), 2011 (Chris Kirk) and 2010 (Bill Haas).

Through five events this season on the PGA TOUR, Justin Thomas (CIMB Classic) and Russell Knox (World Golf Championships-HSBC Champions) have been the only two to convert a share of the 54-hole lead for the win.

William McGirt

It took William McGirt the span of three days to post his second-round, 6-under 66 and two days to post a third-round 66. It took just Monday afternoon for him to post a final-round, 4-under 68 and claim a share of second place with David Toms.

McGirt's third runner-up finish on the PGA TOUR couldn't have been better timed, as his wife Sarah is scheduled for a c-section Friday morning to deliver the couple's second child.

McGirt also claimed a share of second place at the 2012 and 2013 RBC Canadian Open. This week's Sanderson Farms Championship marks his 11th career top-10 finish on TOUR.

In last year's final round of the Sanderson Farms Championship, McGirt was two strokes off the lead at 12-under 204. A final-round, even-par 72 resulted in a solo seventh-place finish.

McGirt, who finished 69th on last year's FedExCup points list on the strength of seven top-25 finishes, was making his third start of the season and coming off a T8 finish at the Shriners Hospitals for Children Open two weeks ago.

David Toms

Making his 10th start in the Sanderson Farms Championship and 594th on the PGA TOUR, 54-hole co-leader David Toms played 26 holes Sunday and 26 holes Monday to come away at 17-under 271 and T2 honors. Rounds of 67-69-66-69 resulted in Toms' best finish since finishing solo-second at 2012 RSM Classic.

Toms has held a 54-hole lead/co-lead 12 times now, seven of which he has converted into wins.

En route to last year's T9 finish at the Country Club of Jackson, Toms began the final round four strokes back at 10-under 206. He could manage no better than even-par 72 in the final round.

A 13-time winner on the PGA TOUR, Toms remains in search of his first title since the 2011 Colonial National Invitation Tournament.

Roberto Castro

Roberto Castro, who opened with a 10-under 62 to lead through 36 holes, posted a bogey-free, 4-under 68 in the final round, but came up two strokes short at 16-under 272.

Castro's T4 finish marked his first top-10 finish since a T8 at the 2014 Wells Fargo Championship.

Miscellaneous

Defending Sanderson Farms Champion Nick Taylor finished T20.

Fellow Canadian Graham DeLaet finished T33. DeLaet's wife Ruby will be induced Tuesday morning at 9:30 a.m. ET to give birth to the couple's twins.

There were six former Sanderson Farms Championship winners in the field: Nick Taylor/2014 (T20), Scott Stallings/2012 (T28), Will MacKenzie/2008 (T54), D.J. Trahan/2006 (T10), Heath Slocum/2005 (MC) and Cameron Beckman/2001 (MC).
