Conrad Shindler leads by one as third-round play was suspended for the day at the Price Cutter Charity Championship

SPRINGFIELD, Mo. – Conrad Shindler will take a one-stroke lead into the final day of the Price Cutter Charity Championship presented by Dr Pepper. The third round was suspended at 8:01 p.m. local time as Shindler was on the fifth tee. The 76 competitors that made the 36-hole cut at 5-under-par 139 or better will resume play at 7:20 a.m. Sunday.

Shindler, who won the Rex Hospital Open earlier this season, leads Brandon Harkins and Chesson Hadley by one. With 39 players within five strokes of the lead, the 29-year-old from Phoenix, Ariz. must keep his foot on the pedal if he hopes to capture his second Web.com Tour win this season.

"The board is so jammed when you look at it," said Shindler. "At the moment, it's between 25 guys if not more. Birdies are just flying out the wazoo out here. Anyone can get into position. I've got to play my game and stick to my plan."

Shindler has played in 18 events this season and recorded two top-10s, including his victory in Raleigh. If Shindler were to win on Sunday, he would move to No. 1 on the money list. He would also become the second Texas A&M Aggie to win in consecutive weeks, after Martin Piller won last week's Ellie Mae Classic at TPC Stonebrae.

The stop-and-start nature of this week can wear on a player psychologically, and Shindler believes the key to tackling the marathon on Sunday will be more cerebral than physical.

"I think all these long days are more mental," said Shindler. "I played U.S. Open sectionals and when you know you've got 36 holes, you know you don't have time to feel tired. I think these rounds are more mental than anything."

Shindler held the 36-hole lead and would become just the fourth player in 20 events to convert a second-round lead into a win this season.

* The cut came at 5-under-par 139, with 76 players advancing to the weekend.
