Dustin Johnson (No. 1 in the FedExCup)

In a bid to join Justin Thomas with four victories this season, Dustin Johnson entered the final round of THE NORTHERN TRUST trailing Jordan Spieth by three strokes. Spieth extended that lead to five strokes after five holes before suffering a double bogey at No. 6 to give Johnson hope. With birdies at the 9th and 10th holes, Johnson completely erased the margin to tie the lead at 11-under. Two additional birdies saw both players finish tied at 13-under 267. After a 341-yard tee shot on the playoff hole, Johnson prevailed with a stellar shot from 95 yards to inside four feet and made the putt to win and take over the No. 1 position from Hideki Matsuyama in the FedExCup.

Johnson won his 16th PGA TOUR title in his 218th start at the age of 33 years, 2 months, 5 days.

With the victory, Johnson collects 2,000 FedExCup points and moves from No. 4 in the standings to No. 1 with 4,466 points, 1,200 ahead of Jordan Spieth. Last year, it took 633 to qualify for the Dell Technologies Championship, 853 for BMW Championship and 1,607 for the TOUR Championship.

Johnson now owns a 1-1 playoff record and won a playoff for the first time to claim a PGA TOUR title.

Last year, Johnson's T18 at THE NORTHERN TRUST was his weakest performance in the four FedExCup Playoff events (T8/Dell Technologies Championship, 1/BMW Championship, T6/TOUR Championship) while finishing No.

2 behind Rory McIlroy in the FedExCup. Johnson is seeking to advance to the TOUR Championship for the eighth time in his career.

Johnson sits atop the 2017 U.S. Presidents Cup team list with 10,353 points.

Johnson (4) joins Justin Thomas (4) with the most victories this season. Hideki Matsuyama (3) and Jordan Spieth (3) are additional multiple winners on the PGA TOUR this season.

Johnson has now finished in the top-25 in 51 percent of the PGA TOUR events he has played during his career – 111 top-25 finishes in 218 PGA TOUR starts.

Johnson (16/2008-present) has at least one win in each of his first ten seasons on the PGA TOUR (the best current streak) and joins Arnold Palmer (17/1955-1971), Jack Nicklaus (17/1962-1978) and Tiger Woods (14/1996-2009) as the only players since 1960 to achieve this feat.

Last season, Johnson claimed the Jack Nicklaus Trophy as PGA TOUR Player of the Year. He also took home the Byron Nelson Award for Adjusted Scoring Average (69.172) and the Arnold Palmer Award as the TOUR's leading money-winner (\$9,365,185).

Following his first victory of the season at the Genesis Open, Johnson won the World Golf Championships-Mexico Championship in his next start. His third win of the season in three consecutive starts, at the World Golf Championships-Dell Technologies Match Play, made him the first player to win each of the four World Golf Championships events, completing the 'WGC Slam'.

Johnson also took the No. 1 spot in the FedExCup standings after the win in Austin, Texas, and held it for 17 straight events before relinquishing it to Jordan Spieth at The Open. After injuring his back in a fall on the eve of the Masters, Johnson withdrew from the first major of the season. He returned to the TOUR with a T2 at the Wells Fargo Championship and posted just one additional top-10 result (T8/RBC Canadian Open) before the FedExCup Playoffs began.

This marked Johnson's ninth appearance at THE NORTHERN TRUST, an event he also won in 2011 (shortened due to Hurricane Irene). He has three additional top-10 finishes along with his victories in 2011 and 2017 (T3/2012, T9/2015, T9/2010) as well as a T15 in 2009 and missed cuts in both 2013 and 2008.

Third-Round Lead Notes

25 of 49 third-round leaders have won THE NORTHERN TRUST since its inception in 1967, most recently by Jason Day (tied) in 2015 at Plainfield Country Club. The 54-hole lead stats at THE NORTHERN TRUST do not include the rain-shortened 1998 or 2011 events.

Through 43 stroke-play events this season, 13 players have managed to hang on for the win after holding the 54-hole lead. Most recently, Henrik Stenson at the Wyndham Championship.

Jordan Spieth (No. 2 in the FedExCup)

Jordan Spieth began the final round with a three-stroke lead and extended it to five before posting his only double bogey of the tournament at the par-3 6th hole when he hit his tee shot in the water. After a bogey at the ninth hole and a birdie by Johnson at No. 10, the pair were tied at 11-under. They finished tied at 13-under before lost the first extra hole to a Johnson birdie, falling to 4-3 in playoffs.

Spieth, the 2015 FedExCup champion, is hoping to join Tiger Woods (2007, 2009) as the only multiple winners of the FedExCup.

Spieth has finished in the top-10 in 49 of 124 PGA TOUR starts – or 40 percent of his starts.

This marked Spieth's 15th 54-hole lead/co-lead on the PGA TOUR, converting nine of his last 11 into victory:

With the runner-up finish, Spieth moved from No. 3 to No. 2 in the FedExCup standings. Spieth has never finished worse than 15th in the FedExCup (7th in 2013, 15th in 2014, first in 2015, ninth in 2015).

This week marked the 20th start of the season for Spieth, highlighted by victories at The Open Championship, AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and Travelers Championship. With nine top-10 finishes, he matches Rickie Fowler with nine but sits behind Justin Thomas, who has the most with 10 this season thanks to his T6 at THE NORTHERN TRUST.

Spieth made his fifth start at THE NORTHERN TRUST, with his T10 a year ago his best outing before the runner-up this week.

Jhonattan Vegas (29th in the FedExCup)

Jhonattan Vegas posted a bogey-free final-round 65 to finish T3 at 9-under 271 and move from No. 29 to No. 10 in the FedExCup.

Vegas has experienced both ends of the FedExCup ramifications in his career. After finishing No. 54 in his first full season in 2011, he earned the dreaded No. 126 position following the 2012 season, although he remained exempt thanks to his 2011 CareerBuilder Challenge victory. At No. 153 following the 2015 season, he lost full status and played on Past Champions status before winning the 2016 RBC Canadian Open which helped him advance all the way to the season finale at East Lake last year, finishing No. 29. Vegas defended his RBC Canadian Open title last month to earn his third TOUR title.

Vegas has improved his performance each year he's played THE NORTHERN TRUST (2011/70th, 2014/T66, 2016/T22, 2017/T3).

Vegas began the week at No. 9 in the 2017 Presidents Cup International Team standings and is projected to pass South Korea's Si Woo Kim by a slim margin and move to No. 8, likely securing his spot before the team is finalized following next week's Dell Technologies Championship at TPC Boston.

This week marked the 26th start of the season for Vegas, highlighted by his third win on the PGA TOUR (RBC Canadian Open). In all, he now owns 15 made cuts in 26 starts.

Additional Player Notes

Jon Rahm made his first appearance in a FedExCup Playoffs event, finishing T3 at THE NORTHERN TRUST to move from No. 6 to No. 5 in the standings. Any player in the top five heading into the TOUR Championship is guaranteed to win the FedExCup with a victory at East Lake.

Paul Casey's solo-fifth finish marked his eighth top-10 result in his 16th FedExCup Playoffs event and his fifth in his last six Playoffs event (5/2017 THE NORTHERN TRUST, 4th/2016 TOUR Championship, 2nd/2016 BMW Championship, 2nd/2016 Dell Technologies Championship, T31/2016 THE NORTHERN TRUST, T5/2015 TOUR Championship).

Webb Simpson hit 14 of 18 greens, his best effort in that category this week, to produce a 5-under 65 in the final-round. Simpson's T6 marked his third top-10 result in nine appearances at THE NORTHERN TRUST, and his second-consecutive on TOUR following a third-place finish at the Wyndham Championship last week. The last time Simpson posted top-10 results in consecutive starts was in 2013-14 when he had four-in-a-row (2013 TOUR Championship/4th, 2013 Shriners Hospitals for Children Open/1, 2013 The RSM Classic/T7, 2014 Sentry Tournament of Champions/T3).

Charley Hoffman shot a final-round 5-under 65 to finish T17, marking 13 of 20 final-rounds under-par on the PGA TOUR this season, including eight consecutive to this point. His final-round scoring average this season is 70.29. Last season, Hoffman averaged 72.44 in 18 final-rounds, with just five of those under-par. Unlike most players in the field this week, Hoffman performed better on the front nine (-4) than the back nine (+1).

Kevin Chappell began No. 30 in the FedExCup and advanced to No. 17 with a T6 finish. Chappell remains No. 11 in the Presidents Cup points list with the only movement in the U.S. Team being Brooks Koepka (6) and Kevin Kisner (7) trading positions from last week. There is one more week for players to accrue points and the U.S. and International teams will make their captain's picks on Sept. 6. Interestingly, Chappell holds the course record at Liberty National Golf Club, firing a 62 in the third round of THE NORTHERN TRUST in 2013.

After injuring his right knee when he slipped while hitting a shot on the final hole of the third round, Lucas Glover, who entered the week No. 55 in the FedExCup, received treatment for the on-site Player Performance Center to return on Sunday and shoot a final-round 71. He sits No. 57 in the FedExCup heading to the Dell Technologies Championship.

Hideki Matsuyama, who entered the week with the lead in the FedExCup, missed the cut at THE NORTHERN TRUST and now sits at No. 4 in the standings headed to TPC Boston. Jordan Spieth (2015) and Billy Horschel (2014) are the only players to win the FedExCup after missing the cut at THE NORTHERN TRUST.

Daniel Berger was the only player to birdie the 516-yard par-4 opening hole in the final round, holing a putt after a 210-yard approach to six feet.

Luke List recorded two eagles in a round for the third time this season, making 3s at the par-5 third and 13th holes. List also made two eagles in a round at the FedEx St. Jude Classic (R3) and the John Deere Classic (R1). List entered the week tied with Tony Finau for most eagles this season (14) and now heads the list with 16.

FedExCup and THE NORTHERN TRUST

- THE NORTHERN TRUST is the opening event of the FedExCup Playoffs for the 11th consecutive season since the FedExCup Playoffs were introduced in 2007.
- Each playoff event offers 2,000 FedExCup points to the winner.
- The top-125 players on the final PGA TOUR Season FedExCup points list (following the Wyndham Championship) qualified for THE NORTHERN TRUST.
- The top-100 players on the FedExCup points list following THE NORTHERN TRUST qualify for the Dell Technologies Championship at TPC Boston.
- The top-70 players on the FedExCup points list after the Dell Technologies Championship advance to the BMW Championship, contested at Conway Farms Golf Club in Lake Forest, Ill.
- The top-30 players following the BMW Championship will qualify for the TOUR Championship. Prior to the TOUR Championship, a points reset will take place, giving all players in the field a mathematical opportunity to win the FedExCup title. The top-five players control their own destiny and would claim the FedExCup with a victory at East Lake.

Players advancing in the FedExCup Playoffs

Three players – Harold Varner III, Bubba Watson and David Lingmerth – played their way into the top 100 in the FedExCup standings to advance to the Dell Technologies Championship next week, while three players – Byeong Hun An, Robert Garrigius and Seung-Yul Noh – fell out of the top 100 to end their respective seasons.

Three players advancing from THE NORTHERN TRUST to the Dell Technologies Championship is the fewest since two players did it in the inaugural FedExCup Playoffs event in 2007.

Entering the Wyndham Championship at No. 138 and beginning the FedExCup Playoffs at No. 123, Harold Varner III became the fifth player in FedExCup history to advance from outside the Wyndham Championship and The NORTHERN TRUST in the same year, joining Camilo Villegas (2015), William McGirt (2011), Padraig Harrington (2011) and Ernie Els (2011). Els (2011) is the only player to go onto to advance to BMW Championship.

In the history of the FedExCup Playoffs, the worst-ranked players entering THE NORTHERN TRUST to go on to qualify for the TOUR Championship were Morgan Hoffmann in 2014 and Heath Slocum in 2009 at No. 124. Slocum finished No. 8 on the strength of a victory at THE NORTHERN TRUST. The only other player to advance to the TOUR Championship after starting the FedExCup Playoffs outside the top 100 was Kevin Streelman in 2010 at No. 102.

Rookies and the FedExCup

Six rookies advanced to the FedExCup Playoffs last season, with Emiliano Grillo and Si Woo Kim the only rookies to advance to the TOUR Championship, the first time in FedExCup history more than one rookie advanced to the TOUR Championship. Both finished T10 at East Lake, with Kim winding up No. 17 in the FedExCup and Grillo at No. 11. Grillo's peers voted him as the PGA TOUR Rookie of the Year at the close of the 2015-16 season.
