FINAL ROUND INTERVIEW:

PAUL GOYDOS (-14) KEVIN SUTHERLAND

Q. I was going to talk to you about that last putt. You guys came up there, needed two birdies, and it just sat on the lip of that cup. Tell me about that.

KEVIN SUTHERLAND: Well, it was obviously a big putt and very disappointed right now to be one back. I'll be honest with you, I didn't think I left it short when I hit it. I felt good, like I felt like I hit a good putt. I just misread how downhill it was, I guess, because I felt like I hit a good putt and it just didn't get there. Not much to say, just a little disappointed at this point. Paul played fantastic. He was the one who got us to where we are, and I just hoped I could contribute a little bit there and unfortunately it didn't happen.

Q. How long was that putt?

KEVIN SUTHERLAND: 12 feet I would guess, probably somewhere in that area. I hit a good putt, it just didn't get there. It's just disappointing. But Paul played great all day. I made some putts in the first part of it, I just left that one short. Just disappointing.

Q. You guys came up so close on that putt at the end just to sit on the lip. How disappointing is that for a round that you played really good?

PAUL GOYDOS: We played good. I don't think you can -- I think that's a bit nitpicky. I thought we played good. Kevin made a lot of good putts on the first nine holes to kind of keep the momentum going. We needed a good putt there, it just didn't go in. We can go back over a whole bunch of shots and say "what if." I'm happy with the way we played. I'm lucky in a sense that I've got a pretty good anchor. Kevin's floor is very high so he's never out of play, so it makes it a little easier to hit second, quite frankly.
