

BRIAN CLAAR: The winds kept getting stronger and the golf course became unplayable. Balls were going up by the hole, rolling back off the green. Four or five of the greens you couldn't play. The forecast is to get as bad or worse. Tomorrow does not look any better. So taking everything into consideration, golf course, flights and the fact that just it's not getting any better, we've come to the tough decision that it's a 36-hole tournament.

Q. And was there a point during play today where it would have put the round in a position where you had to complete it?

BRIAN CLAAR: We didn't get close. Half the field has to finish. We weren't close. It was getting worse as the day went on and it just got to the point where we couldn't play. So it's terrible and we feel bad about it, but it's what it is.

Q. And as you took a look at the forecast, what would have put us in a position where you could have had a final round on Sunday, tomorrow?

BRIAN CLAAR: Well, that would have been a decision we would have had to make. We would have talked to the sponsor, and once we found out the forecast was terrible, those discussions never came. So we just made the best decision in the interest of everybody.
