

Gusts of 15-20 mph will be possible after 2pm. The temperature should reach a high near 87 degrees, while the overnight low will be near 58 degrees.

Extended forecast – A trough of low pressure moving into the Pacific Northwest will weaken the high pressure overhead, resulting in slightly cooler temperatures for the weekend. This trough will also likely increase the depth of the marine layer, and therefore returns the threat for fog on the weekend. Fog may become possible Saturday morning, but would likely burn off by 8am if it did occur. Sunday poses a higher risk for fog development, and would likely burn off between 8-9am. Westerly winds may gust between 15-20 mph each afternoon this weekend.
