Sungjae Im wins Web.com Tour's Regular Season finale at Winco Foods Portland Open presented by Kraft-Heinz

25 players receive PGA TOUR cards on Sunday at Pumpkin Ridge GC

NORTH PLAINS, Oregon – It's hard to find a more pressure-packed day than the Sunday final round at the WinCo Foods Portland Open presented by Kraft-Heinz. While the field may have had their eyes on capturing the final tournament title of the Regular Season, their attention was also focused on finishing inside the top 25 on the money list to earn a PGA TOUR card for the 2018-19 season, and inside the top 75 to earn a spot in the Web.com Tour Finals and exempt status on the Web.com Tour in 2019.

Florida State University alum Hank Lebioda experienced the drama firsthand, entering the week in Portland at No. 24 on the money list. The 24-year-old opened with rounds of 69-66-72, leaving him right on the bubble heading into Sunday. Lebioda battled Pumpkin Ridge Golf Club's Witch Hollow Course Sunday, posting an even-par 71 to finish the week at 6-under 278.

"I was doing my best to be calm, cool and collected," Lebioda remarked to Golf Channel when asked about his round, "not that I was calm, cool and collected."

Lebioda was then left to wait as play finished out, unsure of where he would finish on the money list, forced to watch his projected number fluctuate as things played out on the course.

"It sucked," Lebioda said of the wait. "The last hour and a half or so was miserable. It was terrible. I was pacing, sitting, pacing, drinking, pacing – anything but sitting still. It was nuts."

The Orlando native spent his first two years as a professional competing on the Mackenzie Tour – PGA TOUR Canada and PGA TOUR Latinoamérica. Lebioda picked up three top-10 finishes in Canada in 2017, including a win at the Mackenzie Investments Open presented by Jaguar Laval. He continued that success into his rookie season on the Web.com Tour, picking up four top-10 finishes in 21 starts.

Lebioda ended up finishing the week T34 in the Beaver State, enough to move him to \$167,014 in earnings on the season, clinching the 25th spot in the process.

"It hasn't sunk in yet," an emotional Lebioda commented after securing the spot. "Absolutely nuts. It's been a crazy year. It's been an unbelievable year. It's been a year full of growth, full of learning, and hopefully I have more of that to come."

Fellow Tour rookie Kevin Dougherty attempted to overtake Lebioda for the 25th spot, entering Sunday T4, just four shots back of the lead. He continued his dominant style of play into Sunday and entered the final hole needing just a

birdie to claim the final PGA TOUR card of the Regular Season. The 27-year-old's chip came up just short, causing the Oklahoma State University alum to fall to his knees. Dougherty ended up \$1,923 short of the final card.

Making the biggest leap into The 25 Sunday was University of California – Irvine alum John Chin, who entered the week at No. 41 on the money list, having picked up just two top-10 finishes in 19 starts. Chin posted rounds of 66-69-69-66–270 (-14) to end the day in solo-second, picking up \$86,400 in earnings to move inside The 25 and earn a PGA TOUR card for the first time since turning professional in 2010.

"I had a little bit of a dry spell in the middle of the year," Chin said after his final round, "where I wasn't playing very well. I started off pretty well so there was almost less pressure, because some guys that aren't playing well have to play better by the end of the year, but I'm just happy that I played well this week and locked it up."

Taking home the tournament title was Sungjae Im, who posted a final-round 4-under 67 to finish the event at 18-under 266, besting Chin by two strokes to become the second repeat winner of the 2018 season. Im, who won the season-opening The Bahamas Great Exuma Classic at Sandals Emerald Bay, became the first player to win both the first and last events of the Regular Season since Mike Springer in 1990.

"Thanks to my stellar play in the first three rounds," Im remarked after the victory, "I was able to pull out a win today. I couldn't be happier. I'm really proud of the results I've had this season."
