Weather: Showers and thunderstorms with a high of 80. Wind SE 6-12 mph. Due to thunderstorms, the start of the final round was delayed four hours and began at 1:23 p.m. CT. The round was completed at 8:25 p.m. CT.

This marks the ninth event this season with a suspension/delay of play due to inclement weather or darkness.

Seven Things To Know

- Wise earns his first career PGA TOUR victory in his 26th career start on TOUR as a rookie
- Wise becomes the youngest winner (21 years, 10 months, 29 days) on TOUR since Si Woo Kim (21 days, 10 months, 16 days) at 2017 THE PLAYERS Championship.
- Wise becomes the second youngest winner of the AT&T Byron Nelson (21 years, 10 months, 29 days) behind Tiger Woods who won in 1997 (21 years, 4 months, 18 days)
- This win marks the 500th PGA TOUR victory by a former Web.com Tour member
- On his 30th birthday, Grace ties his career-low round on TOUR (9-under 62), previously set in the third round at the 2017 The Open Championship, the lowest round in a major.
- Grace only needed 22 putts in his final round en route to his 9-under 62
- Mitchell shoots his career-low round of 8-under 63 in his tournament debut

- Earns his first career PGA TOUR victory in his 26th career start on TOUR
- Becomes the first rookie to win the AT&T Byron Nelson since Keegan Bradley in 2011
- Becomes the youngest winner this season (21 years, 10 months, 29 days) and the youngest winner on TOUR since Si Woo Kim (21 days, 10 months, 16 days) at 2017 THE PLAYERS Championship.
- Becomes the second youngest winner of the AT&T Byron Nelson (21 years, 10 months, 29 days) behind Tiger Woods who won in 1997 (21 years, 4 months, 18 days)
- This win marks the 500th PGA TOUR victory by a former Web.com Tour member
- Becomes the second player, following Mackenzie Hughes, to win on the PGA TOUR, Web.com Tour and Mackenzie Tour- PGA TOUR Canada (Web.com Tour/2017 Wichita Open supporting Wichita’s Youth and Mackenzie Tour-PGA TOUR Canada/2016 Syncrude Oil Country championship presented by AECON)

- Becomes the seventh first-time winner this season (Patrick Cantlay/Shriners Hospitals for Children Open, Patton Kizzire/ OHL Classic at Mayakoba, Austin Cook/The RSM Classic, Brice Garnett/Corales Puntacana Resort & Club Championship, Satoshi Kodaira/RBC Heritage and Andrew Landry/Valero Texas Open)
- 23-under par is the third-lowest total in relation to par this season (CIMB Classic and Sentry Tournament of Champions won with 24-under par)
- With win at NCAA Men's Individual title in 2016, and helping the Oregon Ducks to their first ever team championship, became first player since Kevin Chappell (UCLA) in 2008 to win both the Individual and Team NCAA Championship
- In his previous start before the AT&T Byron Nelson, finished runner-up to Australian Jason Day at the Wells Fargo Championship
- Wise becomes the fifth player with a win and a runner-up in back-to-back starts this season. The other four players are currently in the top-10 of both FedExCup rankings and the Official World Golf Ranking.

Marc Leishman (2nd)

- Lowest 72-hole score: 261/2017 BMW Championship and 264/2018 AT&T Byron Nelson
- Leishman was seeking his fourth career PGA TOUR victory in his 238th start and 800th career round on TOUR
- Opened the week by recording his career-best round on the PGA TOUR (797th career round) with a 61, falling one shot shy of tying the tournament course record of 10-under 60 set by three other players (Keegan Bradley/R1/2013, Arron Oberholser/R2/2006, Sam Snead/R2/1957)
- Tied Hudson Swafford for the most eagles this week (3)
- Recorded his sixth top-10 finish and his second runner-up showing this season (P2/THE CJ CUP@ NINE BRIDGES)
- Looking to convert a 54-hole lead into a win for the second time in his career. (2017 BMW Championship)

Branden Grace (T3)

- On his 30th birthday, Grace tied his career-low round on TOUR (9-under 62)
- Made a nine-foot putt for par on the last hole and only needed 22 putts in his final round
- His other career-low round came at the 2017 The Open Championship where he fired an 8-under 62, the lowest round in a major.
- Finished five-under in his last five holes (eagle/No. 14, birdies/Nos. 15-17, par/No.18)
- Cumulative Strokes Gained: Around the Green: 6.536/1st
- Last PGA TOUR win: 2016 RBC Heritage
- Became a father less than a month ago (son Roger born April 25)

J.J. Spaun (T3)

- Came one shot shy of tying his career-low round on TOUR (8-under 62/R3/2017 RSM Classic)
- Finished 74th in his only other appearance at the AT&T Byron Nelson (2017)
- One of 12 bogey-free rounds on Sunday
- Best 2017-18 result: (2nd/ THE RSM Classic)

Keith Mitchell (T3)

- In his tournament debut, shot his career-low round of 8-under 63 in the final round (Previously 65/R4/2017 OHL Classic at Mayakoba and 65/R1/2018 AT&T Byron Nelson)
- One of 12 bogey-free rounds on Sunday
- Finished 1st in Cumulative Strokes Gained: Off the Tee (4.831)

- Earned his second top-five showing this season (2nd/Corales Puntacana Resort & Club Championship)

Jimmy Walker (T6)

- Best 2017-18 results: T2-2018 THE PLAYERS Championship
- Earned his fourth top-10 finish in the 2017-18 season: (T6/ AT&T Byron Nelson, T2/THE PLAYERS Championship, 4th/ Valero Texas Open, T8/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am).
- Best AT&T Byron Nelson finish: T2/2015
- Jimmy Walker is the only player to finish top-10 in both the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (T8) and AT&T Byron Nelson (T6) this season

Adam Scott (T9)

- Bogey-free round of 6-under 65 earned him his first top-10 finish of the season
- Scott was projected to earn a spot into the 2018 U.S. Open with a two-way tie for ninth this week. Scott finished in a three-way tie for ninth and will most likely not earn a spot in the U.S Open this week.
- Hit 18 of 18 greens and 12 of 14 fairways in his final round
- Cumulative Strokes Gained: Tee to Green: 11.524/ 1st

Jordan Spieth (T21)

- Dallas native and AT&T ambassador
- Made his PGA TOUR debut at this event in 2010 as a 16-year-old amateur (T16/his best showing at this event)
- Two top-10 finishes in his previous four starts: T3/Houston Open and 3rd/Masters Tournament
- Best 2017-18 results: 3rd/Masters Tournament, T3/Houston Open
- AT&T Byron Nelson is the only tournament held in the state of Texas that Spieth hasn't finished in the top- 10:
Fort Worth Invitational: T7/2013, T2/2015, 1st/2016, T2/2017
Valero Texas Open: 2nd/2015
Houston Open: T2/2015, T3/2018
WGC Dell Technologies Match Play: T9/2016
