#### FedExCup and the BMW Championship

The BMW Championship is the third of four events of the FedExCup Playoffs – with the entire season building toward the four-tournament stretch. There is more on the line than just the BMW Championship trophy – as players jockey for the coveted top-30 position to advance to the TOUR Championship in Atlanta.

A points reset will take place following the BMW Championship giving all 30 players in the field at the TOUR Championship a mathematical chance to win the FedExCup. The top-five players control their own destiny and are guaranteed to win the FedExCup with a victory at the TOUR Championship.

#### **Five Things To Know**

- Tiger Woods opens with 62 to claim his first 18-hole lead/co-lead in five years
- 2012 BMW Championship winner Rory McIlroy makes nine birdies, including six in a row, to take a share of the lead
- Tiger Woods (2007, 2009) and Billy Horschel (2014) won the BMW Championship before emerging those respective years as the FedExCup champion
- Bryson DeChambeau, winner of the first two FedExCup Playoffs events, opened with a 67
- Phil Mickelson, the only player to qualify for the BMW Championship every year, opened with a 3-over 73

#### **First-Round Lead Notes**

- Since 2000, the first-round leader/co-leader has won seven of 18 times at the BMW Championship (most recently Marc Leishman/2017)
- 9 First-round leaders/co-leaders to win on PGA TOUR in 2017-18 (Most recent: Brandt Snedeker/Wyndham Championship)

Beginning on No. 10, made four birdies and an eagle-three (No. 16) to make the turn in 6-under 29

- Marks his third occasion of posting a 29 on his first nine holes in round one of a PGA TOUR event (1999 AT&T Byron Nelson, 2006 WGC-Mexico Championship)
- His last 29-or-lower on any nine before this week was the 2007 TOUR Championship (28/front/R2/Won)
- Following his 28 at the 2007 TOUR Championship, went on to win at East Lake en route to claiming his first of two FedExCup titles
- Made six birdies, one eagle (par-5 16<sup>th</sup>) and one bogey (par-3 eighth). From the 2013-14 season through the end of the 2016-17 season, played 11 rounds with six or more birdies. In 17 starts this season, he now has played 14 such rounds
- Today's 62 marks his lowest score on the PGA TOUR since shooting 61 in round two of the 2013 WGC-Bridgestone Invitational (won)
- Last co-lead after 18 holes was at the 2013 World Golf Championships-Mexico Championship (won). Last outright lead after 18 holes on the PGA TOUR was the 2009 PGA Championship (finished 2<sup>nd</sup>)
- Of 28 previous 18-hole leads/co-leads on the PGA TOUR, has converted 14 times for the win
- Hit 9/14 fairways, 16/18 greens in regulation, 1/2 scrambling, needed 27 putts and made a total of 94' 3" of putts
- Is making his 17<sup>th</sup> start in the BMW Championship, sixth in the FedExCup era (2007) and first since 2013 (T11)
- When the Quicken Loans National was first contested at Aronimink Golf Club, in 2010, Woods posted scores of 73-70-70-71—284 (+4) to finish T46
- Of five top-10 finishes this season on the PGA TOUR, best were 2<sup>nd</sup>/PGA Championship and T2/Valspar Championship

- Beginning on No. 10, followed three-straight birdies on Nos. 11-13 with six straight on Nos. 18-5 en route to an 8-under 62
- Six straight birdies marks his career-best streak (previous was five on two occasions, most recently in round three of the 2015 Wells Fargo Championship)
- 62 marks his lowest score on TOUR since a 61 in round three of the 2015 Wells Fargo Championship (won)
- Takes an 18-hole lead/co-lead for the 12<sup>th</sup> time on the PGA TOUR. Of the previous 11, converted for the win three times, most recently at the 2014 Open Championship
- Most recent 18-hole lead/co-lead before this week was at the 2014 BMW Championship (T8). Also co-led after round 1 of the 2012 BMW Championship before winning
- Hit 11/14 fairways, 16/18 greens in regulation, and needed 27 putts to sink a total of 108' 2" of putts
- In addition to his win at the Arnold Palmer Invitational, has collected four top-10 finishes, including a T5 at the Masters and T2 at The Open Championship
- After not competing in the first FedExCup Playoffs event, THE NORTHERN TRUST, finished T12 at last week's Dell Technologies Championship
- Following wins at the 2016 Dell Technologies Championship and TOUR Championship, went on to win the FedExCup title

## Xander Schauffele (64/3<sup>rd</sup>)

- 2016-17 PGA TOUR Rookie of the Year overcame a bogey at his first hole of the day, No. 10, with eight birdies to open with 7-under 63
- In his only other start at the BMW Championship, finished T20 last year at Conway Farms
- In 25 starts this season leading up to this week, has collected five top-10 finishes, highlighted by T2s at THE PLAYERS Championship and The Open Championship
- After missing the cut at THE NORTHERN TRUST, finished T49 at last week's Dell Technologies Championship

### Peter Uihlein (64/T4)

- Thanks to his T12 finish at last week's Dell Technologies Championship, moved from 83<sup>rd</sup> in FedExCup points to No. 64 and into this week's BMW Championship field
- Led the field in birdies last week at TPC Boston with 24
- Best of four top-10 finishes this season is solo-fifth at the Memorial Tournament
- Made his way to the PGA TOUR this season by virtue of his third-place finish on the 2017 Web.com Tour priority list.
- On 2017 Web.com Tour, won the Nationwide Children's Hospital Championship in his third-ever start on that Tour

#### FedExCup Notes

The top five in the FedExCup Playoff standings is the goal for players after the BMW Championship. The top five in the standings entering the TOUR Championship will control their own destiny and will win the FedExCup with a victory at East Lake GC. Here's a look at the top 10 entering the week:

By finishing in the top 30 of the FedExCup standings, players earn one-year exemptions to: Masters Tournament, U.S. Open and The Open Championship; THE PLAYERS Championship, World Golf Championships-Mexico Championship and World Golf Championships-HSBC Champions, as well as invitationals including CIMB Classic, Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, RBC Heritage, DEAN & DELUCA Invitational, the Memorial Tournament presented by Nationwide and Quicken Loans National.
