Five Things To Know

- Justin Rose moves to No. 2 in the FedExCup
- Justin Rose ties Nick Faldo for the most PGA TOUR victories by an Englishman since 1983
- Justin Rose recorded the lowest 72-hole score since Henrik Stenson at the 2017 Wyndham Championship
- Kevin Na became the fifth player to have multiple rounds of 62-or-better in an event since 1983
- Brooks Koepka shot his career-low 72-hole score

Wins (9): 2010 the Memorial Tournament presented by Nationwide, 2010 The National, 2011 BMW Championship, 2012 World Golf Championships-Mexico Championship, 2013 U.S. Open, 2014 The National, 2015 Zurich Classic of New Orleans, 2017 World Golf Championships-HSBC Champions, 2018 Fort Worth Invitational

- Moves to No. 2 in the FedExCup standings, tying the highest position of his career (spent one week at No. 2 following his win at The National in 2010); stands 305 points behind leader Justin Thomas
- Ties career-low 72-hole score (260/2017 Sony Open in Hawaii)
- Lowest 72-hole score on PGA TOUR since 2017 Wyndham Championship (Henrik Stenson/258)
- Second-lowest 72-hole score in Fort Worth Invitational history (Zach Johnson/259/2010)
- Ties Nick Faldo for the most PGA TOUR victories by an Englishman since 1983 (9)
- One of five multiple winners in the 2017-18 season (Patton Kizzire/2, Justin Thomas/2, Bubba Watson/2, Jason Day/2, Justin Rose/2), the most through 30 events since the TOUR went to a wrap-around schedule in 2013-14
- Fifth win by an international player at the Fort Worth Invitational since 2000 (Sergio Garcia/2001, Nick Price/2002, Rory Sabbatini/2007, Adam Scott/2014)
- Ninth top-10 since the start of the 2017 FedExCup Playoffs, the most of any player in that span

- 25th champion of the Fort Worth Invitational to have held the 36-hole lead/co-lead and 36th to have held the 54-hole lead/co-lead
- Has now converted 3/13 career 36-hole leads/co-leads (2010 The National, 2011 BMW Championship, 2018 Fort Worth Invitational) and 4/14 career 54-hole lead/co-leads (2010 The National, 2011 BMW Championship, 2015 Zurich Classic of New Orleans, 2018 Fort Worth Invitational) to victory
- Captures first domestic PGA TOUR victory since 2015 Zurich Classic of New Orleans

Brooks Koepka (2nd)

- Best result since winning 2017 U.S. Open; previous best result in 2017-18 season was T2/WGC-HSBC Champions (won by Rose)
- Career-low 72-hole score (263; previous: 265/2016 AT&T Byron Nelson)
- Led the field in Strokes Gained: Off the Tee (+5.172)
- Made his debut at the event; most recent of five players to win in their first start at the Fort Worth Invitational was Sergio Garcia in 2001

Emiliano Grillo (3rd)

- Best finish since 2016 THE NORTHERN TRUST (T2)
- Third start at Fort Worth Invitational (3rd/2018, T24/2017, T55/2016)
- Fifth top-10 in 16 starts in 2017-18
- Has not missed a cut in an individual stroke-play event in 2017-18 (MC/Zurich Classic of New Orleans)

Kevin Na (4th)

- Shot a final-round 61 to tie the Colonial Country Club record (seventh instance; most recent: Chad Campbell/2004/R3)
- Becomes the fifth player since 1983 to have multiple rounds of 62 or better during a PGA TOUR event (sixth instance)

Jon Rahm (T5)

- Second top-five in two starts at the event (T5/2018, T2/2017)
- 16th career top-five in 47 starts on the PGA TOUR

Additional Player Notes

- Kevin Tway has top-10s in each of the past two weeks (T5/Fort Worth Invitational, T9/AT&T Byron Nelson), his first two top-10s of 2017-18 (21 starts)
- Ben Crane (T8) earned his best result since winning the 2014 FedEx St. Jude Classic
- In his fourth career PGA TOUR start as a professional, Joaquin Niemann earned his second top-10 (T8/Fort Worth Invitational, 6th/2018 Valero Texas Open); with the top-10, qualifies for the FedEx St. Jude Classic
- Jordan Spieth finished T32 after not finishing worse than T14 in five previous starts at the event (T2/2017, Won/2016, T2/2015, T14/2014, T7/2013)
