# **Charley Hoffman**

After storming up the Hero World Challenge leaderboard with a second-round 9-under 63 to take a three-shot lead over Jordan Spieth and first-round leader Tommy Fleetwood, Charley Hoffman added a 2-under 70 Saturday to move to 14-under 202. He will enter the final round with a five-stroke cushion over Justin Rose and Spieth.

Hoffman, currently making his first start at the Hero World Challenge, leads the field with 23 birdies.

Hoffman has qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs all 11 seasons, with his worst showing a 69<sup>th</sup> place finish in the FedExCup in 2012. Most recently, the four-time PGA TOUR winner finished 20<sup>th</sup> in the standings following the 2016-17 season.

Hoffman's R3 statistics: 10/18 greens, 8/13 fairways, 1/1 sand save, 24 putts.

Hoffman has led/co-led following the third round four times on the PGA TOUR, most recently carrying that lead on to a runner-up finish at the 2017 RBC Canadian Open. He has never gone on to win after leading/co-leading after the third round.

# Third-Round Leader Results at the Hero World Challenge

In 2016, eventual champion Hideki Matsuyama (at 19-under 197) held a commanding seven-stroke lead over Henrik Stenson and Dustin Johnson, tying Jordan Spieth (2014) for the largest 54-hole lead at the Hero World Challenge, with Spieth going on to a record 10-stroke win over Henrik Stenson in 2014.

The 54-hole leader/co-leader has won the World Challenge five times in the last 13 seasons (Tiger Woods/2007, Graeme McDowell/2012, Jordan Spieth/2014, Bubba Watson/2015, Hideki Matsuyama/2016).

Overall, the third-round leader/co-leader has gone on to win eight times in 18 attempts (Tom Lehman/1999, Padraig Harrington/2002, Davis Love III/2003, Woods/2007, McDowell/2012, Spieth/2014, Watson/2015, Matsuyama/2016).

### **Tiger Woods**

Host Tiger Woods (T10), the winner of 79 career PGA TOUR titles including 14 major championships, who is making his return to competitive this week at the Hero World Challenge, followed opening rounds of 68-68 with a 3-over 75 to fall to T10. He'll enter the final 18 holes trailing Charley Hoffman by 10 strokes.

A missed cut at the 2017 Farmers Insurance Open marks Woods' last start on the PGA TOUR. Before this week, his last round in a tournament was an opening-round 77 before withdrawing from the Omega Dubai Desert Classic (February 2).

Woods owns five victories (2001, 2004, 2006, 2007, 2011) and five runner-up finishes (most recent to Zach Johnson in 2013) in 15 prior Hero World Challenge starts. Last year, Woods led the field with 24 birdies en route to a 15<sup>th</sup> place finish.

Woods' R1 statistics: 12/18 greens, 7/13 fairways, 0/1 sand save, 28 putts.

Woods' R2 statistics: 12/18 greens, 9/13 fairways, 26 putts.

Woods' R3 statistics: 9/18 greens, 7/13 fairways, 1/2 sand saves, 28 putts.

## **Additional Player Notes**

2014 World Challenge champion Jordan Spieth (T2) opened with rounds of 68-67-72 and is currently five strokes behind Charley Hoffman. He won in 2014 by a record 10 strokes over Henrik Stenson with a tournament-record 26-under 262, becoming the first player to win the event in wire-to-wire fashion.

Albany resident Justin Rose posted a 1-under 71 to jump to T2, five strokes behind Charley Hoffman. He is making his fourth start at the Hero World Challenge (T6-2014, 13-2015, WD-2016), including a final-round, course-record 10-under 62 at Albany in 2015 to finish in 13<sup>th</sup> place.

Defending champion Hideki Matsuyama (T5) has rounds of 71-66-72 and will enter the final round of the Hero World Challenge seven strokes behind Charley Hoffman. He is attempting to join Tiger Woods (2006-07) as the only players to win the Hero World Challenge in back-to-back seasons. This week marks Matsuyama's fourth start at the Hero World Challenge (13/2014, T17/2015, 1/2016).

With rounds of 69-70-74, 2017 FedExCup champion and PGA TOUR Player of the Year Justin Thomas is currently in 12<sup>th</sup> place and trailing Hoffman by 11 shots.

Henrik Stenson (T16), with wife Emma serving as his caddie this week, recorded a third-round 2-over 74. In four prior starts at the Hero World Challenge, Stenson has never failed to finish inside the top five, including runner-up finishes in his last two starts (2014, 2016).
