Six Things To Know

- Three players sharing the 36-hole lead is the second most in Quicken Loans National history (4/2014)
- Beau Hossler recorded his TOUR-best 41st round in the 60s of the 2017-18 season
- Tiger Woods equaled his low round of the season to move to T11
- Francesco Molinari hit all 18 greens in regulation for just the second time in his PGA TOUR career
- Kevin Streelman tied his career-low round on the PGA TOUR to jump 82 spots on the leaderboard
- · Players, caddies, etc. wore orange ribbons in support of Hunter Mahan's sister-in-law, Katie Enloe, who is battling leukemia

Best 2017-18 results: P2/Houston Open, T2/Travelers Championship

- With a 66, recorded his 41st round in the 60s this season, four more than any other player on TOUR (second: Emiliano Grillo, 37)
- 131 tops previous-best 36-hole score of 132 at last week's Travelers Championship and the 2018 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am
- Has two runner-up finishes in his last nine starts (P2/Houston Open, T2/Travelers Championship)
- Is 23-under in his last six rounds on TOUR (14-under last week at Travelers Championship with scores of 65-67-68-66)
- Round-by-round scoring average/rank this season entering the week: R1 (68.91/2), R2 (69.86/21), R3 (70.68/86), R4 (71.89/159)
- Finished T74 in his only other start at the Quicken Loans National (2012)
- Has held/shared the 36-hole lead twice previously on TOUR: 2018 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (T43), 2018 Houston Open (P2)

- Posted five birdies en route to an opening 9-hole score of 30 in round two
- With scores of 67-64, marks first time in seven starts he has posted multiple rounds in the 60s at this event
- Making his seventh start at the Quicken Loans National (T30/2007, MC/2008, T16/2010, MC/2011, MC/2012, T43/2017)
- Has held/shared the 36-hole lead three times previously on TOUR: 2001 Zurich Classic of New Orleans (T5), 2009 RBC Heritage (won), 2009 FedEx St. Jude Classic (won)

Additional Player Notes

Tiger Woods (T11)

- Equaled best round of the season (65/R3/THE PLAYERS Championship)
- Ranked 92nd in Strokes Gained: Putting (-1.198) after the first round, but rebounded with a +2.041 effort in R2 (8th)
- Leads the TOUR this season in third-round scoring average (68.50)

- Making seventh start at the event and first since 2015 (T18); two-time winner (2009, 2012)
- Two top-10s in 10 prior starts this season (T2/Valspar Championship, T5/Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard)

Francesco Molinari (T4)

- Hit all 18 greens in regulation for just the second time in his PGA TOUR career (R2/2010 THE PLAYERS Championship)
- Finished T8 in his only other Quicken Loans National start (2016)
- Seeking to become the third (four times) international winner of the event (K.J. Choi/2007, Justin Rose/2010, 2014)

Billy Horschel (T4)

- With scores of 64-68, marks first time in six starts at this event he has multiple rounds in the 60s
- Making sixth start at Quicken Loans National (best result: T11/2014)
- Making 19th start of the 2017-18 season and has two top-10s (Won/Zurich Classic of New Orleans, T5/RBC Heritage)

Kevin Streelman (T7)

- 62 fell one shy of Quicken Loans National record of 61 (Troy Merritt/R3/2015)
- 62 equals his career-best round on TOUR (62/R3/2008 Travelers Championship)
- 62 is lowest score at TPC Potomac in six rounds as event host (Note: Charles Howell III posted a 61 at the 2004 Booz Allen Classic)

C.T. Pan (T7)

Leads the field with 13 birdies, one more than co-leader Beau Hossler

Andrew Landry (T11)

- First-round co-leader and 2018 Valero Texas Open champion carded a second-round 2-over 72 to fall to T11
- Opened the week with a 63, tying his career-low on PGA TOUR (R1/2018 CareerBuilder Challenge; lost to Jon Rahm in a playoff)

Kyle Stanley (T36)

Sits T36 in his attempt to join Tiger Woods (2009, 2012) and Justin Rose (2010, 2014) as multiple winners of the event

Doug Ghim (T66)

- With rounds of 73-68, makes the cut on the number after beginning the tournament 5-over through his first six holes
- Only other made cut in three prior starts on TOUR was T50 as an amateur at this year's Masters Tournament
- Posted rounds of 78-70 to miss the cut in his professional debut at last week's Travelers Championship
