ShotLink Keys to Victory for Jhonattan Vegas

Jhonattan Vegas recorded his third PGA TOUR victory in his 156th career start at the 2017 RBC Canadian Open. Vegas moved from 87th to 28th in the FedExCup standings, moving inside of the top 30 of the standings for the first time last season. Jhonattan Vegas won in a playoff against Charley Hoffman and became the first back-to-back champion of the RBC Canadian Open since Jim Furyk in 2006 & 2007.

Jhonattan Vegas ranked fifth in SG: Approach-the-Green outperforming the RBC Canadian Open field by +1.785 strokes per round.

Jhonattan Vegas' has had similar final round performance in his last two final rounds at the RBC Canadian Open have The biggest difference between the two were his performance on the greens. Vegas made over 70 feet more of putts than his final round at the RBC Canadian Open last season. Jhonattan's 142' 1" of putts made today was his 4th most feet of putts made in his career and the most he has made on TOUR in a round this season.

Last season, Glen Abbey GC had the closest Proximity to the Hole average of any course (31' 7"). The top three players in Proximity to the Hole recorded a top-10 finish at the 2017 RBC Canadian Open and Sean O'Hair averaged 24' 8" in proximity to the hole, 6' 11" closer than the field average.

Last season, the field made 84 total hole outs, marking the fourth most of any course. For the week, two players made three or more total holes outs (Carl Pettersson (4) and Robert Garrigus (3)).

Players made birdie or better 26.95% when inside 125 yards during the 2017 RBC Canadian Open, marking the third best Birdie or Better Percentage (Inside 125 yards) of any course.

Two-time RBC Canadian Open champion Jhonattan Vegas lead the field in this category, making birdie or better 62.5% last season.

Brandt Snedeker

2013 RBC Canadian Open champion Brandt Snedeker has recorded five top-25 finishes in seven previous starts at the RBC Canadian Open. Snedeker currently ranks 90th in the FedExCup standings on the strength of two top 10s and six top-25 finishes.

Since 2009, Brandt Snedeker has outperformed the field at Glen Abbey GC by +18.65 total strokes on the greens (1^{st}) . In this span, Snedeker has made 29 total putts from outside 10 feet (7th) and recorded 111 one-putts (9th), totaling 1,067' 9" of putts made (7th).

Charley Hoffman

Charley Hoffman is set to make his eighth start at the RBC Canadian Open and enters the week with eight consecutive rounds under par and a combined 33-under par in that stretch. Hoffman currently ranks 92nd in the FedExCup standings and is one of only two players (Mickelson) who have advanced to the BMW Championship in all 11 seasons of the FedExCup Playoffs.

Since 2009, Charley Hoffman is a combined 42-under par at Glen Abbey GC, marking the second-best score in relation to par of any player at this course.

This season, Charley Hoffman is a combined 16-under par on approach shots from the 125 to 150-yard range. Hoffman leads the TOUR in Proximity to the Hole from this distance, averaging 18' 3", nearly five feet closer than the TOUR average (23' 1").

Sergio Garcia

Sergio Garcia is set to make his first start at the RBC Canadian Open since 2001 and third overall at this event. Garcia currently ranks 132nd in the FedExCup standings marking the second season Sergio Garcia has ranked outside the top 30 of the standings through week #36 since the start of the wrap-around schedule (2013-14). Last **6.4%** of the players ranked outside the top 125 of the FedExCup standings at this point qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs.

Sergio Garcia has 99 career top-10 finishes accounting for 29.64% of his starts on the PGA TOUR. Garcia likely needs a top 10 finish to move inside the top 125 of the FedExCup standings. With a win this week, Sergio Garcia is likely to move inside the top 50 in the standings putting him in good position to qualify for the TOUR Championship for the seventh time in the FedExCup era.

Two-time RBC Canadian Open champion Jhonattan Vegas is set to make his sixth start at this event. Vegas is seeking to join three other players in winning the same PGA TOUR event in three consecutive weeks since 1999 (Stuart Appleby, Tiger Woods and Steve Stricker).

Brooks Koepka

Brooks Koepka is set to make his second appearance at the RBC Canadian Open (T18 - 2015). Koepka currently ranks 13th in the FedExCup standings on the strength of one win, three top 10s and five top-25 finishes. This season, Brooks Koepka has struggled in getting off to a fast start in the first round on the PGA TOUR.

Bubba Watson
