Six Things To Know

- RBC golf ambassador Dustin Johnson claims his 19th PGA TOUR victory
- Johnson becomes the first player since Tiger Woods (2005-09) with at least three wins in three consecutive seasons
- Mackenzie Hughes finished as the low Canadian to win the Rivermead Cup for the second straight season
- Chris Crisologo wins Gary Cowan award as the low amateur at the RBC Canadian Open
- Keegan Bradley becomes first player on TOUR since 2011 with five eagles in a stroke-play event
- The RBC Canadian Open is the 14th event this season with a suspension of play, 12 of which were weather-related

19 wins; at least one in each season on TOUR (2008-active)

Best 2017-18 results: Won/RBC Canadian Open, Won/FedEx St. Jude Classic, Won/Sentry Tournament of Champions, T2/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, T2/WGC-HSBC Champions

- Entered the final round in a four-way tie for the lead, recording a final-round 6-under 66 for a 3-stroke victory
- Wins for the 19th time in his 235th PGA TOUR start at the age of 34 years, 1 month, 7 days
- Collects 500 points and maintains the top spot in the FedExCup standings, now 527 clear of Justin Thomas
- Fell two shy of the RBC Canadian Open scoring record of 263 (Johnny Palmer/1952, Scott Piercy/2012, Tim Clark/2014)
- First player since Tiger Woods (2005-09) with at least three wins in three consecutive seasons
- 21st player in PGA TOUR history with at least three wins in three consecutive seasons
- 35th player in PGA TOUR history with at least three wins in three different seasons
- 10th win in last 43 starts
- First American winner of the event since Brandt Snedeker in 2013
- 3/6 during the 2017-18 season with a 54-hole lead/co-lead in 72-hole events
- 15th lead/co-lead after 54 holes and is 7/15 in converting into a victory in 72-hole events

- Three career victories when entering the final round of 72-hole events tied for the lead (2010 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, 2018 FedEx St. Jude Classic, 2018 RBC Canadian Open)
- Joins Ben Crenshaw, Ernie Els, Doug Ford, Hubert Green, Tom Kite and Bill Mehlhorn on the TOUR's all-time wins list with 19 victories (T38 all-time)
- TOUR-best ninth top-10 finish of the season, breaking out of a tie with Brian Harman (8) and Justin Rose (8)
- Miscellaneous stats: Greens in Regulation (57 of 72/T1), Driving Distance (318.5 yards/T1), Strokes Gained: Off the Tee (+7.540 cumulative), Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (+14.223 cumulative)

Whee Kim (-20/T2)

- Final-round 3-under 69 to finish T2 after holding the 54-hole lead/co-lead for the first time on the PGA TOUR
- Best career results: P2/2017 Shiners Hospitals for Children Open, T2/2017 FedEx St. Jude Classic, T2/2018 RBC Canadian Open
- Moves from No. 82 to No. 51 in the FedExCup standings
- Recently carded his best PGA TOUR round with a first-round 62 at A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier
- Third top-10 of the season: P2/Shriners Hospitals for Children Open, T2/RBC Canadian Open, 4/THE CJ CUP @ NINE BRIDGES

Byeong Hun An (-20/T2)

- Runner-up finish came in his first start at the RBC Canadian Open
- Moves from No. 58 to No. 36 in the FedExCup standings
- Best career results: P2/2016 Zurich Classic of New Orleans, P2/2018 The Memorial Tournament presented by Nationwide, T2/2018 RBC Canadian Open
- Best 2017-18 results: P2/The Memorial Tournament, T2/RBC Canadian Open, T5/The Honda Classic, T7/RBC Heritage
- Held the 54-hole lead/co-lead for the second time in his career (2017 Waste Management Phoenix Open/6th)

Keegan Bradley (-19/4)

- Birdied his final three holes en route to a bogey-free 8-under 64, moving up nine spots to a fourth-place finish
- Entered the final round six behind the four co-leaders; by comparison, the best come-from-behind win at the RBC Canadian Open is seven strokes (John Rollins, 2002)
- Holed out from 151 yards on the par-4 ninth hole for his fifth eagle of the week (R1/No. 13, R2/Nos. 2, 16, 18, R4/No. 9)
- Becomes first player since Derek Lamely (2011 CareerBuilder Challenge) with five or more eagles in a stroke-play event on TOUR
- Made his third start this week at the RBC Canadian Open (T22/2011, T14/2017, 4/2018)
- Currently No. 44 in the FedExCup standings as he seeks to make the Playoffs for the eighth-consecutive season
- This week marked his 157th start since his last win at the 2012 WGC-Bridgestone Invitational

Mackenzie Hughes (-15/T8)

- Finished T8 to win the Rivermead Cup for the second-consecutive season as the low Canadian in the field
- Marked his first top-10 finish in four starts at the RBC Canadian Open (MC/2012, MC/2013, T32/2017, T8/2018)
- Recorded first top-10 finish since the 2017 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am/T10, 47 starts later
- Tied with Jason Kokrak and Hudson Swafford for most birdies during the week (25)

Additional Player Notes

- Making his second start at the RBC Canadian Open (MC/2016), **Abraham Ancer** finished solo-fifth for his second top-5 finish in his last four starts on the PGA TOUR (T4/Quicken Loans National)
- It was a tale of two nines for **Tommy Fleetwood** (T6) this week, playing the front nine 4-over and the back nine 20-under.
- Danny Lee finished T6 to move from No. 124 to No. 104 in the FedExCup standings
- Andrew Putnam (T8) birdied six of his last seven holes to cap off a 5-under 67, marking his second top-10 finish in his last five PGA TOUR starts (2/FedEx St. Jude Classic)
- 2013 RBC Canadian Open champion **Brandt Snedeker** posted his fifth top-10 finish in eight starts at this event (T7/2007, T5/2009, 1/2013, T5/2016, T8/2018)
- Joel Dahmen's last five starts on TOUR: Quicken Loans National (T23), A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier (T5), John Deere Classic (T2), Barbasol Championship (T15), RBC Canadian Open (T8)
- **Kevin Tway**, one of four players who shared the 54-hole lead, posted a 4-over 76 to finish T17 in his attempt to become the 10th father-son tandem to win on TOUR. His Dad, Bob, posted eight PGA TOUR wins, including the 2003 RBC Canadian Open
- Jhonattan Vegas finished T29 in his attempt to win his third consecutive RBC Canadian Open; the last player to win same event three consecutive years was Steve Stricker at the John Deere Classic (2009-2011)
- With his T45 finish, Chris Crisologo won the Gary Cowan award given to the low amateur at the RBC Canadian Open
