Five Things To Know

- Ancer, Niemann and Hossler are all competing at the Memorial Tournament for the first time. Matsuyama makes his fifth start.
- Niemann will be 19 years, 6 months, 27 days on Sunday. With a win this week, would become third-youngest winner in PGA
 TOUR history (Harry Cooper/19 years, 4 days/1923 Galveston Open, Ralph Guldahl/19 years, 2 months, 3 days/1931 Santa
 Monica Open).
- Matsuyama holds first-round lead/co-lead on PGA TOUR for fifth time in his career. This marks first time Ancer and Niemann have held a lead/co-lead after any round on the PGA TOUR.
- Matsuyama's 6-under B-B-B-E stretch on Nos. 13-17 ties second-best this season (Peter Uihlein/7-under/B-B-B-B-B-B/R3/Wells Fargo Championship).
- Three players tied for first-round lead for the fourth time at this event (1984, 2007, 2010, 2018). Record is four players (1997, 1998).

- Born in McAllen, Texas and raised in Reynosa, Mexico, has dual American and Mexican citizenship.
- Played college golf at Odessa College and the University of Oklahoma, graduating in 2013. Won Jack Nicklaus Award as a freshman and came to Muirfield Village to receive award from Jack Nicklaus.

- Making his 40th PGA TOUR start this week.
- Thursday's 65 matched his lowest opening round this season (65/AT&T Byron Nelson). In 19 previous starts this season his highest opening round is 72 (six times).
- Turned professional in 2013 and qualified for the Web.com Tour via Q-School, winning the 2015 Nova Scotia Open. Finished 11th on the money list, earning a PGA TOUR card for the 2015-16 season where he made six cuts in 19 events with a T18 at the FedEx St. Jude Classic his best result.
- Finished third in the 2017 Web.com Tour Regular Season money list to regain TOUR status for 2017-18. This season, he's made the cut in 13 of 19 starts, including two top-10 results T9 at the OHL Classic at Mayakoba and T8 at the Houston Open.
- Cesar Sanudo and Victor Regalado are the only native Mexican golfers to win on the PGA TOUR. Regalado won the 1974
 Pleasant Valley Classic and 1978 Ed McMahon-Jaycees Quad Cities Open (John Deere Classic). Sanudo won the 1970 Azalea
 Open Invitational.

- 0 Starts at the Memorial Tournament
- 5 PGA TOUR starts in 2017-18
- 2 Top-10s in 2017-18 (6th/Valero Texas Open, T8/Fort Worth Invitational)
- Chilean was No. 1 in the World Amateur Golf Ranking before making his professional debut at the 2018 Valero Texas Open, where he finished sixth to earn a spot in the 2018 Wells Fargo Championship (MC).
- Early in 2017, in Panama, he faced his friend, Toto Gana, in a playoff for the Latin America Amateur title and a Masters berth. Gana won and earned his ticket to Augusta National. Niemann traveled to Augusta to watch. In 2018, Niemann won the Latin America Amateur title to earn a spot in this year's field at Augusta National, missing the cut with rounds of 76-77.
- Thursday's 65 was one stroke shy of his career low round on TOUR (64/R4/2017 The Greenbrier Classic).
- Last week, Niemann finished T8 at the Fort Worth Invitational.
- Currently owns 180 non-member FedExCup points and requires 89 additional FedExCup points (solo 7th or better) to match No. 150 from last season (269/Rick Lamb) and become eligible to seek Special Temporary Membership of PGA TOUR.

Wins (5): 2014 The Memorial Tournament presented by Nationwide, 2016 Waste Management Phoenix Open, 2016 World Golf Championships-HSBC Champions, 2017 Waste Management Phoenix Open, 2017 WGC-Bridgestone Invitational.

- Won the Memorial Tournament in his first appearance in 2014 and returned in 2015 to finish T5. Missed the cut in 2016, T45 in 2017.
- First player from Japan to win the Memorial Tournament.
- Fifth first-round lead/co-lead on PGA TOUR, winning one of previous four (2015 THE PLAYERS Championship/T17, 2015 the Memorial Tournament/T5, 2016 Waste Management Phoenix Open/1st, 2016 TOUR Championship/5th).
- Thursday's 65 included seven birdies and an eagle 2 at the par-4 17th hole, when he holed out from 137 yards with a gap wedge.
- Seventh player in tournament history to eagle No. 17 (most recent, Bubba Watson/2009/R2).
- Entering this week, has shot under-par in 10 of 14 rounds at Muirfield Village for a 70.57 scoring average, third-best behind Robert Streb (70.25) and Tiger Woods (70.32) *minimum 10 rounds.

Additional Player Notes

Beau Hossler (T4)

- Opening-round 66 was ninth round of 66 or better this season, one fewer than Austin Cook for the most on TOUR.
- In his 21st start this season, recorded an under-par opening round for the 18th time.
- Hit 10 of 14 fairways, 16 of 18 greens and took 29 putts (holed 146' 4" of putts).

Lucas Glover (T5)

- Best finish in 13 previous starts at the Memorial Tournament is T8 in 2005, his first appearance at Muirfield Village.
- In 39 rounds at Muirfield Village, 5-under 67 is his low round (four times, R1/2005, R2/2016, R1/2017, R1/2018).
- Winner of three PGA TOUR titles, including the 2009 U.S. Open. Most recent win: 2011 Wells Fargo Championship (172 starts ago).
- Lone top-10 finish in 16 starts this season is T7 at CIMB Classic. Made 14 cuts in 16 starts this season.

Jason Day (T9)

- Was 4-under after six holes before shooting 4-under 68. Lone bogey came at par-3 12th hole.
- One of five multiple winners this season with victories at the Farmers Insurance Open and Wells Fargo Championship.
- Has made six cuts in nine starts at the Memorial Tournament with T15 in 2017 his best result.
- 66 (R1/2016) is low round at Muirfield Village Golf Club, where the Columbus resident is a member.

Tiger Woods (T47)

- Five -time winner at Muirfield Village makes 16th appearance at this event, but first since 2015.
- Hit 9 of 14 fairways, 12 of 18 greens in regulation and needed 29 putts (holed 58' 3" of putts).
- Starting at No. 10, played the par-5s 3-over to turn in 39. Four birdies on his inward nine resulted in an even-par 72 to sit T47.
- Woods' par-5 scoring average on the PGA TOUR since 1997 is 4.49. Below is Woods' scoring breakdown on par-5s entering the Memorial Tournament.
